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The Path of the Wise Follows Advice

Walking in Wisdom Series

Advice is a crazy thing, by following it, you might change the trajectory in your life, and you might help more people than you would without it. Advice can be easy to give and hard to give. Advice can also be easy to follow or extremely difficult to follow.

Throughout history; seeking, listening to, and following advice, has proven to be very profitable and helpful. And it also happens to be very Biblical.

Three Biblical Truths about Advice:

1. God has put people in your life that can give Wise Advice

- Interesting Divisions for the first several chapters of the book of Proverbs: “My Son”
 - God has put people in your life who have been where you are
- Proverbs 1:8-9 – Advice compared to Accessories
- Proverbs 3:21-22 – Don’t let the Advice slip away
- Proverbs 4:10-13 – Advice can add Years!

2. The Wise Advice we Ignore might Mock us one day (Proverbs 1:20-29)

- It is not your mentors mocking you, it is “Lady Wisdom” who mocks you
- Proverbs 19:20 – What an awesome feeling to look back and think “I Accepted that Advice!”

3. Beware of Seeking the Advice you Want to Hear

- Proverbs 12:15 – The way of the fool is right in his own eyes
- The Heir of Solomon, Rehoboam (1 Kings 12)
 - Advised to be a servant to gain lifelong loyalty (Wonderful advice)
 - Also advised to show strength (which he chose and lost the nation)

Study, Action

Dar consejos es algo curioso; al seguirlos, podrías cambiar el rumbo de tu vida y ayudar a más personas de las que podrías hacerlo sin ellos. Dar consejos puede ser fácil o difícil. Seguirlos también puede ser fácil o extremadamente difícil.

A lo largo de la historia, buscar, escuchar y seguir consejos ha demostrado ser muy provechoso y útil. Y, además, resulta ser algo muy bíblico.

Tres verdades bíblicas sobre el consejo:

1. Dios ha puesto en tu vida personas que pueden darte sabios consejos.

- Divisiones interesantes en los primeros capítulos del libro de Proverbios: “Mi hijo”
 - Dios ha puesto en tu vida personas que han estado donde tú estás.
- Proverbios 1:8-9 – Consejos comparados con accesorios
- Proverbios 3:21-22 – No dejes escapar el consejo
- Proverbios 4:10-13 – ¡Los consejos pueden añadir años!

2. Los sabios consejos que ignoramos podrían burlarse de nosotros algún día (Prov. 1:20-29)

- No son tus mentores quienes se burlan de ti, es la “Sabiduría Divina” quien se burla de ti.
- Proverbios 19:20 – ¡Qué sensación tan maravillosa mirar atrás y pensar “¡Acepté ese consejo!”

3. Cuidado con buscar el consejo que quieres oír.

- Proverbios 12:15 – El camino del necio le parece recto a sus propios ojos.
- El heredero de Salomón, Roboam (1 Reyes 12)
 - Se aconseja ser un sirviente para obtener lealtad de por vida (¡Excelente consejo!)
 - También le aconsejaron que mostrara fortaleza (opción que eligió y por la que perdió la nación).

estudio y acción.

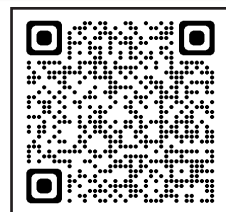
