A True Story

I once was asked by a preacher friend to go with him to visit a man who had become unfaithful to the Lord. We arrived at his little run-down shack, where he was staying, and he invited us in. As we opened the door, cigarette smoke literally billowed out the door. As we entered the tiny shack, the smoke was so heavy in the air that it was difficult to breathe. The man was sitting in a chair, holding a beer, and the woman he was living with, outside of marriage, was lying on a make-shift cot in the same room.

The entire time we tried to talk to him about his soul, he listened quietly while continuing to drink his beer. What I didn't tell you is that the man we went to visit that day used to be a faithful gospel preacher. He came from a Christian family, graduated from a Christian University, preached for several congregations, but was most known for the books and biblical tracts he had written.

But things went tragically wrong in this man's life. He began a life of drinking and womanizing destroyed his marriage, his usefulness in the church, and his relationship with God.

After turning his heart away from God for a season, he sat in a small, dark, smoke-filled room, drinking his beer, his life in shambles. In the corner of that small room were boxes that reached to the ceiling, containing the books and tracts that he had written. They stood almost as a monument of his prior usefulness, and a final vestige of the man he used to be.

The last time I saw this man, we were sitting on the front pew of the church building where I preached. He was drunk, thick-tongued, and his speech was slurred. As we sat there, he openly wept aloud over his wasted life and expressed hope that God would understand. Not too long after this meeting, he died from complications of his drinking.

I share this story with you as a warning. Don't deceive yourself into thinking these things couldn't happen to you. A wasted life is always just one decision away. Yes, we can always return to God in repentance, and He will receive us back. But returning to God does not undo the damage to our bodies, our health, our families, our reputations, and the church.

His life was a tragic waste, but he will ever serve to remind me of what can happen to anyone, even faithful gospel preachers, who choose to walk in the paths of sinners. May we so choose to live so that when we reach the end of our lives, we do not have to lament in sorrow and regret.
