

Exploring God's World with Ross Golden

BEAVERS

Beavers were at one time extirpated in Pa, meaning extinct in a region. In 1917 the PA Game Commission reintroduced the beaver back into the wild. For many years they were protected but now beaver populations are large enough they can be trapped to help maintain healthy populations.

Beavers are generally known for the building of dams and lodges, but many simply live in a burrow in the bank of a stream or river. If the water is sufficiently deep and large enough in area there is no need for a dam. The dam is built for safety and floating food, in the form of trees. They eat the buds and inner bark of trees they cut down. As good an engineer as they are at building, they are not gifted loggers, many trees hang up in other trees or fall in a direction that makes transport difficult.

Beavers eat cattail roots, grasses, reeds but the preferred food is the buds and inner bark of the maple, aspen, willow and even cherry. They store tree limbs underwater for winter when the surface freezes.

Beavers are the largest rodent in North America and second largest in the world. They weigh in at about 60 pounds. They live in small family groups of the male, female, and new born kits, and any yearlings that are still in the den.

One last point of safety: do not and let me repeat DO NOT drink the water where beavers live. Giardia is a normal flora in the intestines of beavers and can cause giardiasis sometimes called beaver fever. This can cause abdominal pain and far worse which we will not discuss here.

Sign up to go on the sheet in the narthex. We will each pay our own way for lunch and the movie. Movie admission is \$12.50 per person.


If you are interested in carpooling, make sure to check that box on the sign up sheet. If you want to skip lunch and meet us at the theater, check that box.

Here is a list for what to purchase and can be bought at the DollarTree Store. Thank you for your participation.

One Hand towel (15 X 25 or 17 X 27 inches. No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels.

One Wash cloth. No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels

One Comb Must be sturdy with at least 4-7 inches of teeth. <u>I</u> talked with Katie from Mission Barn and she states that the combs from Dollar Tree are too thin. She suggests looking elsewhere for the combs.

One set of fingernail clipper. No emery boards or metal nail files.

Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger) in boxes. No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging.

One adult toothbrush. Do not remove from packaging. Personal advertising not acceptable.

10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches) Common household band ages acceptable.

One 1-gallon size resealable bag.

Do not add toothpaste when assembling the kit.

All items must be new.

Just in time for Christmas the installation was complete! Installation was done by Eric Louttit, Michael Kuenzel, Bob Large, Cliff Diethorn and Wyatt Diethorn. The speakers for the carillon are secured to the chimney of the church using a bracket constructed by Mike that Wyatt called a "metallurgic work of art." Be sure to look up at the chimney to admire this handiwork. Out of respect for the community the sound level thus far has been kept to a modest level. The carillon has a collection of thousands of songs and can broadcast in sync with our church keyboard, organ and sound system. If you happen to hear the carillon playing and are away from the church, please let us know the location! Countless hours of volunteer time have gone into this project.
