Dear Kirk,

May we all grow as we go "back to school" and remember that, no matter how mature we think ourselves to be, we are ultimately all "Children of God."

August 31: "Don't Be Afraid of the Dark," Psalm 23

Adults are quick to tell children that when it is dark there is nothing to be afraid of, but when the metaphorical shadows fall around us and we can't see our way out, we too are overcome with fear. What might change if we reminded ourselves of this wisdom?




"I loved seeing friends and the social aspect" - Eddie


"God is always there, even if you can't feel it, and God has a plan for everyone." - Willow

Moderator's Report, by Donna Furman

Our July Council meeting focused primarily on the development of our new Children's Ministry following Jackie Augustyn's retirement. We're transitioning to a volunteer-led program. Selena updated the Council on the status of the ministry and presented a job description for a coordinator who will assist our team with scheduling, program development and administration. It's a temporary, part-time position that will run from September through



the end of the year. (If you'd like to know more about this position or you know someone who might be interested, please contact Selena.)

In other developments, Ellen updated us on YTD financials – good news there, since income is running somewhat ahead of projections and expenses are a little lower. One exception is building repairs and maintenance. We've experienced several large unanticipated repairs (plumbing and irrigation), which will require drawing down our reserve fund.

Speaking of the building, I would like to provide a brief update on the capital campaign projects. As of this writing, the installation of the new security alarm system is almost complete. Watch for announcements about changes to the way we access the building after hours.

And in big news, the sanctuary AC installation is scheduled to begin August 18! Hooray! Stay cool, Kirk. It's been a hot, hot summer, but relief is on the way.

% GENERAL % SYNOD

As published in the July newsletter, the 35th UCC General Synod took place in July with participation by Kirk members Ellie Smith, who participated as a youth representative for the Rocky Mountain Conference, and Mark Dutell, who attended as a member of the National UCC Board of Directors.

Both Ellie and Mark were active participants in the five-day meeting, which included votes from delegates on resolutions that helped define the UCC's position and principles on current events. Those resolutions include statements on immigration, mental health, the humanitarian crisis in Gaza, and support for small-town and rural churches. The 675 Delegates also voted on business issues, including filling open leadership positions at the national level and voting on proposed organizational changes. The Synod also featured multiple speakers who presented and commented on the mission and vision of the UCC, as well as three inspirational worship services.
