From Your Pastor

Dear Kirk,

If you saw me running out of church on January 18, that was because I was rushing to the airport. The Kirk was selected to be a part of the Austin Story Project: a grant-funded engagement through Austin Theological Seminary that gathered leaders, connectors and storytellers from across the country to wonder together what might change in our lives and in our communities if we made space to tell our stories and listen to the stories of others. And then one step deeper, to allow our stories to encounter Jesus' stories. Rev. Corbin Tobey-Davis and I went to represent the Kirk, and we have now been charged with bringing this storytelling experience to the Kirk to engage and experiment, to see what can be learned when people commit to telling and hearing stories as a way to deepen relationships with God and each other.

It is truly the Spirit's work, as our theme for Lent is "Tell Me Something Good!" So what will we do during Lent? We will tell our stories, hear the stories of each other, and hear the stories of Jesus!

On Wednesday nights during Lent, all are welcome to gather in the lower level, where we will be assigned to small groups. Each person will be invited to share a simple story from their life in response to the prompts, "Can you tell us a story of a time you experienced compassion?" "Can you tell us a story about a time you were surprised?" Each person will have up to 5 minutes to share their story, and then the next person will share. Instead of having a conversation, we will let each story stand without comment. After we have heard one another, we will reflect on common themes between our stories and the story of Jesus. There is no prep work to be done. The hope is that those who participate will do their best to attend all 6 weeks so we can provide thorough feedback on this experience to the Austin Story Project. We hope to have at least 6 participants, but we can facilitate as many as are interested. If you are still unsure, come on the first night, February 25 and see how it feels. After our first meeting, you can decide whether to continue. Also, if this is of interest to you but Wednesday evenings do not work, please reach out to me; we might be able to offer an alternative time.

These groups are called Story Circles, and although it is a project from somewhere else, it is helping us deepen our connections with each other and with Jesus, who in every situation we face, is seeking to "Tell Us Something Good!"

If you have questions about the Story Circles, please don't hesitate to reach out to Corbin or me. This is one more opportunity for the Kirk's vitality to serve a larger purpose, and we benefit from it as well. I hope you will join in the Story Circles, for we all have stories to share!




Valentines for Children's Hospital

(This is the first year that Explorer has included 3rd grade, as previously, 2nd and 3rd graders could only attend the now-discontinued Pioneer Camp.) Supported by trained counselors and staff, campers will engage with nature, form friendships, and explore their personal beliefs, all with an emphasis on fun! The week will include activities like campfires, swimming, arts and crafts, outdoor games, free time, a ropes course, and worship.



VOYAGER FAITH & SCIENCE CAMP, July 12-18, for those entering grades 6-8:



Spirituality and science have, for too long, been seen as opposite ends of a spectrum, when, in reality, they are more like two lenses through which we can view the mystery and majesty of the universe. Albert Einstein said that the more he studied the universe, the more he believed in a higher power. When you really get into the coolest and most cutting-edge science, you can't help but stand back in awe of God and the magic of it all! But don't worry, all the fun and exploration built through generations of camp will still be there! Trained counselors and staff will set the stage and hold space for a memorable week filled with laughter, music, reflection, self-exploration, and don't forget the ropes course! Youth will form memories and friendships they'll hold dear for the rest of their lives.

MADD (MUSIC ARTS DANCE DRAMA) CAMP, July 12-18, for those entering grades 9-12:

This Camp is an amazing week of intentional community and creativity. We believe that the arts and creative expression are incredible tools for experiencing and growing in our spirituality. ALL artistic skill levels (really!) are present and welcome at MADD Camp. Along with engaging youth in intellectual faith conversations, we attempt to get youth "out of their heads" and into experiencing God through creativity, nature, friendships, self-discovery, games, activities, and LOTS of fun. We find these moments to be the most powerful in helping young people develop a lifelong faith. Like all of our youth camps and retreats, MADD is an inclusive, open environment. Trained staff help guide youth in engaging with their spirituality on their terms. The Refuge camps and retreats create a safe, brave space where youth can ask questions, explore their faith, and connect more deeply to themselves, each other, the earth, and the Holy - whatever that means to them.



The House the Kirk Will Build!

Thanks to generous holiday givers, the Kirk raised \$2,880 during our Alternative Giving campaign!

Donations received will be used to purchase building materials for the house that will be built by the youth and adults participating in the El Salvador service-learning trip this summer. An amount of \$45 remains in escrow from last year's alternative giving project and will be added to this year's collections, bringing the total to \$2,925. These funds will be used to purchase lumber, nails and screws, bags of cement, and sheets of metal siding. Thanks to generous hearts and hard-working hands, a family in El Salvador will be blessed with the sturdy and secure home they have long dreamed of!



Beans and Rice Service Project, March 1




One of the ways we support Metro Caring's work each year is by bagging beans and rice for distribution to food-insecure families. A group of Kirk members volunteered at Metro Caring's food bank last November and noticed that bags like those we pack went quickly as families shopped for needed groceries. On Sunday, March 1, after worship we hope to bag 1000 pounds of beans and rice. We purchase them at cost from Metro Caring's supplier in large bags, then donate our time to divide them into 4-cup bags for distribution.




Coffee & Community
