

From Your Pastor

Dear Kirk,

We have just concluded a two-month sermon series about the things we say to children that adults should remember and also take seriously. It was during this time that we began planning our Stewardship Campaign for 2026. In so much of this moment, we find ourselves in challenging and complex circumstances. As a parent, working with the youth group and talking with parents of little ones – I know and I hear that there is a significant divide between the simplicity of family life and the perilous state of our collective existence. I think the reason I stayed so long in the "Back to School for Adults" series is out of a desire for grounding. No matter the political circumstances, we must first know who we are and who God is and respond from this wisdom and knowledge. It is both difficult and beautiful to really take seriously the same values we hope to instill in our children; to truly ask that they do what we do more than what we say. At the same time, our children have their own wisdom to teach us, especially about generosity and joy.

And so, our 2026 Stewardship Campaign invites us to **Give Like a Child.** We will consider the instincts that God gave all of us to delight in opportunities to give and to share. This month, you will receive materials about the impact the Kirk is making in our lives and in our community. Later in the month, you will hear stories from some of our young folks of the opportunities they have had to give and how it made them feel. This Campaign will be a time for us all to delight in our opportunities to share who we are and what we have, and to rejoice in the ways God uses these gifts beyond our imaginations. 


Worship at the Kirk in October

We will gather our pledges on this Sunday as we hear the story of the boy Jesus in the temple. As a child, he was already giving his life. How are we called to follow?





- December 7 and 21


Coffee and Community

Faith as Holy Resistance: October 22, 2025 Reclaiming Queerness, Reimagining Christianity A Conversation with Author Rev. Brandan Robertson

The Kirk has been invited to an event hosted by Highlands Church, located at 1700 S. Grant St., Denver, CO 80210, on October 22, from 6:00-7:15 p.m. In a time when faith is too often weaponized against the marginalized, this gathering invites us to reclaim it as a force for liberation and belonging. Rev. Brandan Robertson will lead an evening of deep reflection, spirited dialogue, and radical hope—exploring how queerness can be a sacred lens through which to reimagine Christianity itself. The evening will begin with a 30-minute fireside conversation between Brandan and a local conversation partner, followed by a 45-minute open discussion with the broader community. Together, we'll reflect on how faith communities can become more courageous in their allyship, and how queer people of faith can help cultivate deeper connection, dismantle division, and embody a love that builds bridges



rather than walls. This is a space for both celebration and challenge—for allies ready to do more than just affirm, and for queer folks who carry the prophetic vision of a church made new. Doors open at 5:30 p.m. with free beverages & light refreshments. The program starts at 6:00 p.m. and runs until 7:15 p.m. Free childcare is available.
