### **Worship in September**

As we continue our Sermon Series, we will look at important lessons we teach our children about life and faith, reminding ourselves of these values, and what they mean at every phase of our lives.

**September 7**: "No use crying over spilled milk" - Matthew 6:25-34, Philippians 4:4-9. Emotions are tricky



things, no matter how old we are. Each generation has a different way of approaching the emotions of children, and while emotions are deeply personal, still there is ancient biblical wisdom as well as communal wisdom that we offer to help children navigate the rollercoaster of emotions. As adults, how do we measure what is and what isn't worth crying or stressing or rejoicing over?

**September 14:** "Ask for Help" – Matthew 7:7-11. There is a beautiful independence to children of a certain age when they love to say, "I'll do it myself!" But they often need to be reminded that it is okay to ask for help, if they are trying to reach something too high or a ball goes into the street. We want them to be independent, but it is also a part of maturing to know when you need help and to be strong enough to ask for it. While this is always true, when is the last time you felt strong asking for help?

**September 21:** "Go Play!" - Isaiah 55:8-12. Parents often send their kids out to play. Sure, it might be so the parents can have some time to themselves, but mostly it is because children need to play, to delight, to wonder and wander in order to discover who they are and the world around them.

**September 28:** "Practice Makes Progress" - I Timothy 4:11-16. On this Sunday, our Iliff Intern, Riss Kostelnick, will be bringing us our message!



This gathering will be held on September 21, 2025, from 2-5 p.m. at Applewood Valley United Methodist Church (2035 Ellis St., Golden, CO 80401). At this gathering, youth will hear from local elected officials, community organizers and leaders, clergy and lay folks about the ways students can amplify their voices, get involved with their communities, and make their portions of the world a better place for all people. ### **Youth Group Meals**



This year, we are looking for volunteers to provide dinner for our weekly youth group! We usually feed 20 people and need an option for three vegetarians, two who don't eat red meat, and one who is dairy-free. (All meals don't need to meet these dietary requirements; we just need an option for these.) The kids so appreciate the food, and it will give you a chance to get to know our youth and see what happens on Sunday nights. We ask those providing the meal to stay, eat with us, and after the kids bus their own plates, to help clean up so the kids can engage in their meeting. We eat promptly at 6:00 p.m. and cleanup is at 6:30 p.m. To volunteer for a meal, please sign up HERE.

### **Children's Ministry Update**

First, we invite all of the Kirk to be in prayer for our volunteers and children as we step into our new Volunteer Model this month for the StoryRoom.

In the Spring, we formed a Faith Formation Team made up of those who will lead, those who will support in the StoryRoom during Worship, as well as others who want to support this ministry. We are continuing the model of Godly Play, using the boxes made by the Gebel family, and allowing our children during



the second half of worship to hear a story, ask "I Wonder" questions, and then engage with the story on their own terms through play, art, and imagination. As has been our practice, children ages 3-10 will be escorted downstairs after the children's moment and will remain there until parents come to pick them up immediately after worship. Our volunteers will rotate on a 3-week schedule as much as possible so the children will have consistency week to week. We are so grateful for our volunteers: Ellen Campos, Wyndol Furman, Eva Gebel, Patty Hummert, Jan Sumner, Lisa Kipp, James Snow, Laura Tobey-Davis! 

### Kirk Donations Change Lives in El Salvador! by Ann Karlberg

During our trip to El Salvador this year, Beth Sherry and I were able to be the ambassadors of the Kirk's love and compassion. You sent us to the small village of El Bebedero with a generous emergency fund of \$1,250 to be spent on urgent community needs. Intense poverty is a daily reality for people of this village, and your donations were "heaven sent."

While we were there, the emergency fund addressed medical needs and food insecurity. Aida has a liver disease and needed funds to attend medical appointments and buy medication. Juan had untreated diabetes and required emergency eye



surgery. Upon his return home, he was provided with a food basket. In addition, 7 other individuals or families received food baskets, each containing rice, eggs, soup, pasta, sauce, coffee, sugar and toilet paper. Further, community leaders decided to spend about \$40 of the fund to have insecticide sprayed throughout the village to prevent mosquito-borne Dengue fever. When we left El Bebedero to return home, the emergency fund still had a balance of about \$550. Our ESNA partners and guides, Alvaro and Guillermo, will continue to disburse funds for future requests and keep us updated.

Beth and I also served as ambassadors of your love through our work to build two houses, one for Marlena and her children and another to shelter Juan and Nuria and their children. The sun was hot on our backs, and the cement was heavy on our shovels, but we persevered and ended the two weeks with housewarming ceremonies for both families. Together, we celebrated with laughter and tears of joy! Although our capital campaign was wonderfully successful, we don't have the cash on hand to completely pay for the sanctuary air conditioning. Council approved making a loan to ourselves of approximately \$15,000 from the Abernethy bequest to cover the shortfall, with a pledge to pay it back as money comes in – a reminder to all of us to arrange for our pledges to be paid as scheduled.
