




GAMES

•Reverse Charades (15 Min)

Materials Needed: About 15 animal photos uploaded onto ProPresenter

- Create 2-4 teams.
- Have one kid from each team come to the stage and face the crowd with the TV/screen behind him/her.
- Display a picture of an animal on the TV/screen.
- Everyone in the crowd (i.e., the team) acts out the animal. (If anyone shouts out the name of the animal, their team is disqualified from the round.)
- When the guesser knows the animal, he/she quickly sits for a chance to guess.
- If correct, that team wins a point and another round begins.
- Continue until all the photos have been guessed or time runs out.

•Poop Deck (5-10 Min)

No Materials Needed

- Divide the play area into three sections: poop deck, quarter deck, and main deck.
- Students line up with their toes behind the sideline.
- The leader stands at the end line and shouts either, "Poop Deck!" "Quarter Deck!" or "Main Deck!"
- All kids must then run to the designated area.
- The last 3 kids to cross over the line into the new area are out until the next round.
- When only a few kids are left, begin a new round.



•Building Contest (15 Min)

Materials Needed: Building toys (Legos, blocks, etc.)

- Create 2-4 teams.
- The teams have 10 minutes to build an ark.
- The best-designed ark wins the game!

CLASS ACTIVITY

- **Animal 'Hot Potato' (10-15 Min)**

Materials Needed: Object to be the hot potato

- Play 'Hot Potato' and when the music stops, that child has to tell the first part of the story.

- **Human Slide Show (10-15 Min)**

Materials Needed: Bed sheet for curtain

- Use the bed sheet as a curtain.
- Pick two children will hold it up and then drop it when you tell them.
- Pick several children to be the characters in the story.
- For each story segment, while the curtain is up, have the children get into position as though they were a picture or painting of that part of the story. They are to remain perfectly still and then have the cloth dropped so the rest of the group can see their picture of the story.
- Continue in showing each scene from the Bible lesson. Please correct anything shown that is not Biblically accurate.

- **A Boat and A Cross (4th-5th Grade) (10-15 Min)**

Materials Needed: Worksheet, pencils, Bibles, and the answer key

***Decide whether to do as a whole class, pairs, or individually.*

- Have the kids work as a group to find the answers to the verses. Consider having the girls do one side of the page and the boys do the other.
- See the answer key with the activity page
- Go over this worksheet as a whole class.

K-1ST GRADE CRAFT

- **CRAFT | God's Promise (5-10 Min)**

Materials Needed: Cloud template pre-cut, party streamers of each color of the rainbow, glue sticks, and crayons

- Follow the craft instructions.
- Give kids the freedom to color their cloud and put the streamers on.

SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

LEARNING:

1. Why did God send a flood?
2. Who followed God?
3. What was the rainbow a sign of?

DISCUSSION:

1. Have you ever done something bad because everyone else was doing it?

SALVATION MESSAGE

WHAT TO SAY

“For God so LOVED the world that He GAVE His one and only Son. Anyone who BELIEVES in Him will not die but will have eternal life” (John 3:16, NIV)

1. GOD LOVED

- God has loved you since time began. Even before you were born! God loves you so much that He gives you a choice to love Him back.
- Sin Separates: There’s a problem though! We can’t be with God because of the sin in our life. Sin is the wrong things we do or think. The Bible says we’ve all sinned and sin separates us from God.
- God’s Help: On our own, we can’t do anything to get rid of our sin. We need God’s help. God loved us so much that He made a way to erase all our sins.

2. GOD GAVE

- God gave us His one and only Son: Jesus.
- Jesus Paid: The Bible says that the cost of sinning is death. Since we can’t fix or erase our sin, someone would have to take our place. Jesus took our place and willingly died on the cross for us.
- Paid In Full: Jesus was sinless, fully man and fully God, and His sacrifice paid for all of our past, present, and future sins. He died on the cross and rose three days later. He defeated death so we wouldn’t have to die!

3. WHOEVER BELIEVES IN JESUS

- When you receive a gift what do you do? You open it. God said you could open His gift by believing.
- Believe in Jesus: Believing simply means to trust. It’s a lot like sitting in a chair. When you sit in a chair, you put all your weight on it. You trust that it will hold you up. That’s what it’s like to believe in or to trust in this gift.
- Trust in Jesus: To open the gift that God gave you, trust Jesus with your whole life and rest on the fact that He died and rose again for you.

“If you declare with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,” and if you believe in your heart that God raised Jesus from death, then you will be saved.” (Romans 10:9, ICB)

WHAT NOT TO SAY

1. “INVITE JESUS IN YOUR HEART...”

For kids, the phrase “inviting Jesus into my heart” can be confusing. They’re such concrete thinkers that it can worry them to think that someone is living inside their actual heart.

2. “YOU HAVE TO PRAY LIKE THIS...”

Kids are going to express their faith with how they understand it at their age. Don’t get hung up on the “right words” but rather the heart with which they pray.

3. MAKE UP ANSWERS

Don’t make up answers to questions you don’t know yourself. “I don’t know” is a legitimate answer to questions a kid has about faith. There’s so much that we don’t understand about how God works and how the Holy Spirit enters our life... and that’s okay.
