SENIOR PASTOR WRITES...

SANCTUARY RENOVATION PROPOSED

After Easter, the pipe organ in the Sanctuary was removed by technicians for the scheduled repairs required after fifty years of service. The organ project was fully funded and paid for in less than a year! The refurbished organ console and re-tooled pipes are scheduled to be returned to their rightful place by Christmas. Some discussions have led us to consider what other improvements should be made to the choir loft and chancel area during this interval while the organ is gone. Preliminary drawings have been produced by a Denham and Blythe architect on the basis of suggestions that have been made by church leaders and staff. More than 100 church leaders (including the Trustees and Finance Committee) have been involved in reviewing and formulating these plans, and now it is time to extend the conversation to the entire congregation. This is an opportunity to consider the following work:

- The choir is in need of a change in the seating accommodations. The men who are on the back row are squeezed into a very narrow aisle. When all 37 choir members are present, there is not enough room in the loft. Overall the seating needs to be expanded, with wider risers giving more room for all choir members, and increasing the seating capacity to 45. Safety rails would be added. Bell tables would be permanently located behind the choir.
- There is very poor air circulation in the choir loft, and the choir members often deal with uncomfortable temperatures since the air vents are inadequate. Particularly with the organ out of the room, it would be an ideal time to work on the duct work, and perhaps fans to help move the air.
- If the choir risers are pushed forward, then changes in the chancel area should be considered, including a new moveable pulpit, lectern, and altar. Some seating would be removed at the sides and in front of the chancel area. New projection screens and sound components would be purchased. The entire platform would be raised 18 inches. Altar railings should also be made to be removable, so that the entire platform area can be cleared away for musical presentations, drama, and other events.

The Sanctuary Renovation would be a companion project to the long-awaited organ project. We are blessed with a remarkable music program at Southern Hills. Not only do we have a fine organ, but we also have a surging musical program with children, youth, men's and women's ensembles, bells (children, youth and adult) and chancel choir. There is no better time in our current history at Southern Hills to accomplish this work in the sanctuary than these present days. The proposed work would accommodate a growing program, improve sightlines (the choir is currently blocked from view by both the large pulpit and organ), provide seating comfort, and adjust air circulation. Improving our facilities can assist in participation and attendance, as the quality of worship is improved. The projected cost: \$150,000. Church funds are available to begin the work immediately, and then further fundraising would take place, as we have done in the past for a major initiative.

We would like to invite all members of the congregation to not only become informed about this proposal, but to come to church and ask questions, see the design displays, and help us visualize a new worship environment. On April 22 a presentation was made in Sunday morning worship, but the task of explanation and interpretation will continue. Story boards can now be seen in the narthex and in Herren Hall. Many persons have already enthusiastically received the proposed design plans. The Administrative Team will meet on April 29 to formally consider the proposal and then vote on whether to proceed with the renovation project. Pending approval, the project would begin in May. Pray about these possibilities and join the conversation!
