Establishing our Core Values for Mission:

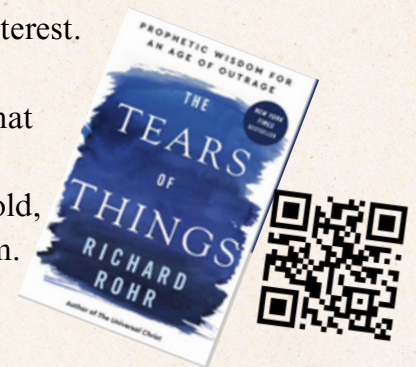

So, take a couple minutes, fill out the on paper – just give us your input. Paper copies are in the narthex.

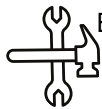

You matter. Let's get together and build something with lasting impact. In fact, let's get together and do some projects as handymen in our congregation with drills and hammers, it's another great way to connect.

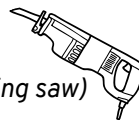

Haiti Update

Ministry in Medical Mission (MMM) is currently preparing another shipment of supplies for Dr. Manno's clinic. The need continues to be great and the situation there has not improved. Despite the challenges, Dr. Manno's team is planning a to provide their annual diabetic training gathering, currently scheduled for September 26th. The MMM team is working to obtain glucometers and glucose strips to support their needs.



Interestingly, this time they have asked that we ship glucose strips  separate from the glucometers. If shipped together, apparently they have concerns that they may get stolen for black market use as they go through customs. But when shipped separately they believe they will get through OK.

Some of our MMM members are working to obtain these diabetic supplies through some of our local pharmacies. But we are encountering more difficulty in locating the supplies on our end as well this time.

Please pray that we can manage to get the needed supplies and that they get through to Dr. Manno's team successfully. Please consider helping financially. GWOH KIT SUPPLY NEEDS

Do you enjoy garage sales or tracking the fall back to school sales? Consider collecting items for the various kits that will be prepared and assembled on September 14th as part of our God's Work Our Hands day. Often useful items can be found at local garage sales. Among the items needed and the kits to be prepared will be:

Lutheran World Relief Personal Care Kits:

- New light weight bath-sized towels (between 20" x 40" and 27" x 52"), dark colors recommended.
- Two or three bath size bars of soap equaling up to 8-9 oz., unscented, in original wrapping.
- One sturdy comb (packaging removed)
- One adult size toothbrush in its original packaging
- One metal nail clipper (attached file optional), (packaging removed)

Lutheran World Relief Baby Care Kits

(sizes 3 to 24 months)(new or VERY GENTLY used.):

- Two lightweight cotton T-shirts (onesies can be cut to make t-shirts)
- Two long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers or pant sets
- Blankets, medium weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt
- Two or three bath size bars of soap- no antibacterial or scented soap- Dove brand is good. In original wrapping.
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins
- Cloth diapers, or new or gently used flannel sheets to make into diapers
- Socks – 2 pair per kit

School Kits:

- 70 sheet notebooks, wide or college ruled, approximately 8" x 10 1/2" (no loose leaf paper please)
- 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.
- Blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink please)
- 2 1/2" eraser
- Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- Pencil sharpener
- Box of 16 or 24 crayons

Backpacks for Lutheran World Relief School Kits:

- Heavy fabric like denim or upholstery fabric will be made into drawstring style cloth bags approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps.
- No standard backpacks please

Ditty Bags:

- Full size bar of soap (in original wrapping)
- Wash cloth
- Tooth brush
- Medium or large toothpaste
- Medium or small sized notebook
- 2 razors
- Sturdy comb
- Travel size shampoo, conditioner and lotion
- Sewing kit (optional)

5. Pastor's Report

- Since we last met, we held our first Community Day Camp in partnership with Zion Lutheran and Voyageurs Lutheran Ministry. It was a great success, and all parties agree that we want to do it again next year with more planning and a date picked out earlier. We served 11 youth over a period of four days. Several of the youth and their families came to the church picnic. Thank you to all our staff and volunteers for making it a great week!
- The Run Pastor Run fundraiser was also successful even though the event itself was cancelled for poor air quality. We raised \$1,864.56 for ELCA World Hunger. Many people don't know this but, the money that goes to ELCA World Hunger helps people around the world, including in the United States. I plan to capture some video of my upcoming solo 5K walk/run to share with the congregation. Thanks to all who contributed.
- I participated in a community training event at the Cloquet Public Library along with other church leaders and various Carlton County leaders from county government, police and the fire department. The Safe and Strong Communities training was hosted by the United Way. We learned how to protect youth in our community by spotting abuse or neglect as well as how to report it. It was also a great way to network within community leaders.
- Connor and I met with members of Good Hope to discuss them renting some of our space this upcoming school year. Connor has more to report on that meeting.
- I am looking forward to Rally Sunday, Confirmation, plus a new opportunity I will be leading in conjunction with Church in Society. We will be reading and discussing the book, *The Tears of Things* by Richard Rohr. More about that is in the August *Messenger*.
- I presided over one funeral and went to two visits this month. I also led the monthly service at Inter-Faith Care Center.

6. Team Leader Reports

- Christian Education: Preparing for Rally Sunday 9-7 and the upcoming school year. Sunday school registration is ready, continuing with the Sparks curriculum, we need teachers and volunteers. Sunday School teachers do not need to teach every Sunday. If you or someone you know is interested contact Jill Elwood or Roxanne Frederick. The Christian Education team will meet soon, new team members are welcome to join us.
- Church Properties: Nothing specific to report.
- Palanca Deacons: Meeting every other week during the summer.
- Welcome: Will provide support with Rally Sunday carnival events. Purchased a new brochure stand for the narthex. Creating a new church brochure and updating new member folders. Planning for a church campfire event, for 10-12 at 3 p.m., with a connection to Indigenous People's Day on 10-13. Coordinating a 3rd annual Trunk or Treat. We are purchasing a few more stand sign holders.
- Fellowship: a. The picnic on July 23rd took place indoors due to rain, but was a great success. About 100 people were served, including counselors and guests from the Community Day Camp. Upcoming events; 9-7 Rally Sunday (coffee and treats in the Fellowship Hall prior to youth activities), 9-14 God's Work Our Hands, 9-28 Silly Sock Potluck (coffee in the Fellowship Hall followed a potluck meal the team will serve and cleanup after) and 10-5 Chili Cook-off & Silent Auction – sign-up sheets for cooks and other volunteers will be posted soon. Ministry Teams are asked to donate a basket for the auction. Local businesses are being approached for a donation.
- NHCP: No report
- Stewardship Team: The annual garage sale is 8-22 and 8-23. The Generous Together Team is to discuss the annual pledge drive planned for the end of October or first weekend in November.
- Worship, Arts & Music: Fall rehearsals will begin soon. The organ has been tuned.

- Good Hope Rental Space: Plan to rent space for their once a week Royal Rangers program. Two Sunday School rooms and the Fellowship Hall will be rented for the school year.
- Update Rental Costs: The rental costs found in the Building Use Handbook have not been updated since 2021. Information from Fidelity Investments recommends raising rental costs 3 – 5% per year. The Council Advisory Team took action to raise the rates 20%.
