What is a synod? Most of us experience synod simply as part of the larger body of the ELCA. There are 65 regional synods in the United States. The smallest synod has 30 congregations and the largest more than 300. Our synod is the Northeastern Minnesota Synod, one of six synods in Minnesota. Our synod is made up of around 130 congregations. Our synod coverage includes the counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cass, Cook, Crow Wing, Itasca, Kanabec, Koochiching, Lake,



Mille Lacs, Morrison, Pine, and St. Louis as well as six federally recognized native lands/reservations.

Our synod is further split up among five conferences. Our Savior's is a member of the Kettle River Conference.

What does synod mean? Well, literally, synod means "Walking Together." This means that the synod helps our congregations and all its members to walk together as church in the world. This is especially important in a world that seems bent on division in nearly every way.

Our synod operates on four principles: • Welcome • Connect • Reform • Support

These principles came from an extensive strategic planning session that took place after Amy Odgren was elected our synod bishop. In addition to our bishop, we have a synod staff. Each staff member has a specialty ministry area yet all staff focus on the four principles to help our pastors, deacons, and congregations thrive.
