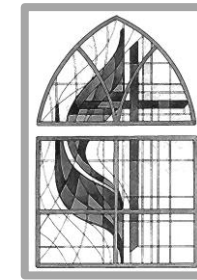

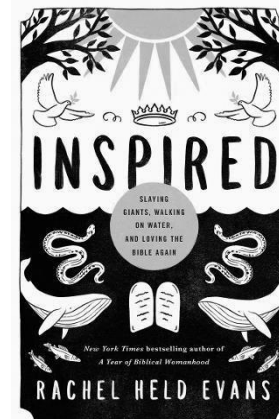

BIBLE STUDY FOR BUSY LIVES

DISCIPLE FAST TRACK: REMEMBERING WHO YOU ARE BIBLE STUDY

This 12-week study immerses readers in the Old Testament Prophets. The study is ideal for busy people who want to fit an in-depth Bible study into their schedule. The study retains the familiar *Disciple* format with its theme word, theme verse, and statement of the human condition, daily and weekly assignments, and prayer. This study examines the connection between memory and identity as the people of God. Participants will find common themes, including calls to remember, calls to repent, calls for renewal, and calls for community. Classes meet for a total of 24 weeks **beginning the second week of September**, studying the Prophets and the letters traditionally attributed to Paul for 12 sessions each.
