Sermon

Luke 18:18-30

¹⁸ And a ruler asked him, “Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” ¹⁹ And Jesus said to him, “Why do you call me good? No one is good except God alone. ²⁰ You know the commandments: ‘Do not commit adultery, Do not murder, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Honor your father and mother.’ ” ²¹ And he said, “All these I have kept from my youth.” ²² When Jesus heard this, he said to him, “One thing you still lack. Sell all that you have and distribute to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me.” ²³ But when he heard these things, he became very sad, for he was extremely rich. ²⁴ Jesus, seeing that he had become sad, said, “How difficult it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God! ²⁵ For it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God.” ²⁶ Those who heard it said, “Then who can be saved?” ²⁷ But he said, “What is impossible with man is possible with God.” ²⁸ And Peter said, “See, we have left our homes and followed you.” ²⁹ And he said to them, “Truly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or wife or brothers or parents or children, for the sake of the kingdom of God, ³⁰ who will not receive many times more in this time, and in the age to come eternal life.”

Statement of Faith


Apostles' Creed

Featured Element of Worship: *All Glory Be to Christ*

Auld Lang Syne is a Scots-language poem written by Robert Burns in 1788. Paired with its now familiar tune, it is traditionally sung at the stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve, bidding farewell to the year that has past. In 2011, Dustin Kensrue borrowed the tune and penned new lyrics that acknowledge God's faithfulness in the past, and point us to the day when all his promises will be fulfilled. This resulting work was the song, *All Glory Be to Christ*.

Alluding to Psalm 127:1 and Proverbs 27:1, this song reminds us that all our best efforts and plans are hopeless apart from the Lord. We can have every confidence though that HE is faithful and true, and that HE will ultimately accomplish HIS purposes. Echoing the Lord's Prayer, therefore, we proclaim that our contentment is found in Christ alone: in his provision, in the doing of his will, and ultimately in the coming of his Kingdom. So this morning, just weeks into a new year, we look forward to the day when Christ will make all things new, singing this song, and committing our lives to the glory of Christ alone.

Meditation for the Week

Satan will come to test us, and we, like Jesus, are to try to resist him. We must question our motives, knowing how easily we are deceived into justifying our own desires and wants. We must ask: "What is it that the Lord desires of me? What does Scripture teach me about what is pleasing to my heavenly Father?" Like Jesus, we must hide God's word in our hearts so that we might be so aware of our motivations and so conscious of God's good will that we see right through the temptations that the devil, the world around us, and our own sinful natures thrust before us.

Yet even though our calling is to resist the devil so that he will flee from us, we must sorrowfully acknowledge that this is not who we are. We repeatedly yield to these temptations that Jesus resisted.

Thank God, we have a representative, a champion who has faced the devil's worst attacks and has won a great victory for us. Despite our failures in the face of temptation, the Father looks at us through his beloved Son, the One who has overcome the accuser for us. Because we are in Jesus, he looks on us in love. Because we are in Jesus, he does not count our faults against us. Because we are in Jesus, he forgives us. Because we are in Jesus, he lifts us up when we fall. Because we are in Jesus, he strengthens us for each day's struggles. Because we are in Jesus, the day is coming when he will give us complete victory over our enemy, and then we will never fail or fall again.


