

## Featured Element of Worship: Joy to the World

Joy to the World is most commonly thought of as a Christmas carol, and it is indeed a perfectly fine hymn to sing at Christmas! What is the celebration of Christmas but a joyful exclamation that the Lord has indeed come to be with his people, and a reminder to prepare room in our hearts for him! But when the great hymnist Isaac Watts wrote Joy to the World in 1719, he did not intend it to be a hymn specifically for Christmas.

Watts was inspired by verses four through nine of the 98<sup>th</sup> Psalm, and in writing this hymn, he intended to speak not of the Lord's Advent at Christmas, but of Christ's Second Advent, which we still eagerly await. This morning as we sing this song, let us likewise not just think of a baby in a manger, surrounded by parents and shepherds, with angels singing overhead. Let us think about why it is that Christ came 2000 years ago, and let that point us to why he is coming again. Let us think of (and long for) that day when he will return to *no more let sin and sorrow grow, nor thorns infest the ground;* that day when he will *make his blessings flow, far as the curse is found!*


#### **Meditation for the Week**
