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Sermon Text...Matthew 21:1-11

¹ Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. ³ If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." ⁴ This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

"Say to the daughter of Zion,
 'Behold, your king is coming to you,
 humble, and mounted on a donkey,

on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.' "

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them.

⁷ They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. ⁸ Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" ¹⁰ And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" ¹¹ And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee."

Meditation for the Week

A reminder to the Church in turbulent times:

We are citizens of Heaven...This world/age is not our home. We are on the journey to the city with foundations.

We are the Body of Christ...We have been incorporated into him, and our identity is in him, not in our own selves or the nations of our earthly sojourn.

We are ambassadors of God's Kingdom...We are here, not to control the political processes of earthly nations, but to proclaim the Reality of God's Kingdom.

We are a Holy Nation...As the nations rage and the Great Powers vie for supremacy, we stand rooted in the reality of God's Holy Rule.

We are not here to Make America Great Again...America does not belong to us. It is an earthly kingdom that defines greatness in contrast to the way Christ defines greatness.

We are not here to ensure the self-defining rights of individualist leftism... We are called to reject lordship over ourselves, the project of self-identification, as we lay down our lives for others.

We do not trust in kings or princes or presidents...We trust in Christ, the Lamb who was slain, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

The Church is struggling in our political witness because we have been captured by the conforming power of earthly politics, which has demanded our allegiance and formed our desires according to its (left to right) political vision.

As those conformed to the political imagination of an earthly kingdom, we have been formed to believe that governing earthly kingdoms is the goal of our witness.

It isn't.

Instead, as those who belong to God's Holy Nation, we are called to be witnesses *to* earthly politics *about* a Kingdom that is not of this world. In doing this, we resist the conforming power of the state, and so are free to live our joyful calling as ambassadors of another rule.

Featured Element of Worship: Palms

On Palm Sunday we remember the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on the Sunday before he would ultimately be crucified. In John 12:13 we read that on that occasion, the crowd "took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!"

In Jesus' time, palm branches were a Jewish national symbol, and "Hosanna" is a nationalistic expression in Hebrew meaning, "Save, we pray!" On that original Palm Sunday, the crowd was seeking a military ruler to deliver them from Roman occupation. What they missed—and we know!—is that Jesus comes not to save us from mere earthly enemies, but from the even greater enemies of Satan, sin, and death. For this reason, just as people in those ancient times proclaimed "Hosanna!" with palms waving in the air, so too this morning we lift our voices in praise of King Jesus, who came to give his life as a ransom for many!
