⁵ But the army of the Chaldeans pursued the king and overtook him in the plains of Jericho, and all his army was scattered from him. 6 Then they captured the king and brought him up to the king of Babylon at Riblah, and they passed sentence on him. ⁷ They slaughtered the sons of Zedekiah before his eyes, and put out the eyes of Zedekiah and bound him in chains and took him to Babylon.



Meditation for the Week: Westminster Shorter Catechism (Questions 70-75)

- Q. 70. Which is the seventh commandment?
- A. The seventh commandment is, *Thou shalt not commit adultery.*¹
 - ¹ Exodus 20:14; Deuteronomy 5:18.
- Q. 71. What is required in the seventh commandment?
- A. The seventh commandment requireth the preservation of our own and our neighbor's chastity, in heart, speech, and behavior.²
 - ²1 Corinthians 7:2-3, 5; 1 Thessalonians 4:3-5.
- Q. 72. What is forbidden in the seventh commandment?
- A. The seventh commandment forbiddeth all unchaste thoughts, words, and actions.³
 - ³ Matthew 5:28; Ephesians 5:3-4.
- Q. 73. Which is the eighth commandment?
- A. The eighth commandment is, *Thou shalt not steal.*⁴
 - ⁴Exodus 20:15; Deuteronomy 5:19.
- Q. 74. What is required in the eighth commandment?
- A. The eighth commandment requireth the lawful procuring and furthering the wealth and outward estate of ourselves and others.⁵
 - ⁵Leviticus 25:35; Ephesians 4:28b; Philippians 2:4.
- Q. 75. What is forbidden in the eighth commandment?
- A. The eighth commandment forbiddeth whatsoever doth, or may, unjustly hinder our own, or our neighbor's wealth or outward estate.⁶
 - ⁶ Proverbs 28:19 ff.; Ephesians 4:28a; 2 Thessalonians 3:10; 1 Timothy 5:8.

Communion at Calvary

If you are our guest in worship today, we welcome you both to Calvary and to the Lord's Table. Our celebration of the Lord's Supper is <u>open to all</u> who have trusted in Christ as Savior and follow Him as Lord, that in partaking they might experience spiritual nourishment and growth in grace.

Mindful not only of Scripture's promises, but also of its cautions regarding the Lord's Supper, we generally discourage children from partaking of the sacrament. Regardless of age, it should be shared only by those people who understand and give ascent to the historical and personal significance of the cross of Jesus Christ.

When the bread is passed to us by the Elders, each person wishing to participate is asked to remove a piece from the tray and hold it while others are being served. Then, as a symbol of our common union with Christ as one body, we shall all partake together.


When the cups are distributed, each person wishing to participate is asked to remove a cup from the tray and, as a symbol of our individual trust in Christ, to drink on our own.

We encourage worshippers to use the time during which others are being served for the thoughtful reading of Scriptures or quiet meditation and prayer.

May God nourish our spirits as we worship Him through partaking of these elements in faith, as a sign and a seal of the covenant of grace.
