**Featured Element of Worship: *All People That on Earth Do Dwell***

Our opening hymn this morning is taken from the Psalter and has a familiar tune: that of the *Doxology* we often sing at Calvary. The tune was originally written by Louis Bourgeois in 1551 to accompany Psalm 134 in the *Genevan Psalter*. Through its use in the *Scottish Psalter* though, it quickly became associated with William Kethe's translation of the 100<sup>th</sup> Psalm. It hence became known as *Old Hundredth*. As we sing this setting of it today, consider how we are joining our voices with the chorus of Christians who have thus sung it for over 450 years, as well as with the people of God who have worshiped him through the singing of the 100<sup>th</sup> Psalm for millennia!
