PRELUDE

INVOCATION

Pastor (P): We call on the name of the Triune God—the name into which we have been baptized: In the name of the Father, and of the ✖ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Congregation (C): Amen!

CONFESION OF SINS

P: Our help is in the name of the Lord,

Psalm 124:8; 130:3-4; Luke 18:13

C: who made heaven and earth.

P: If You, O Lord, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand?

C: But with You there is forgiveness; therefore You are feared.

P: Since we are gathered to hear God's Word and call upon Him in prayer and praise, let us first consider our unworthiness and confess before God and one another that we have sinned in thought, word, and deed, and that we cannot free ourselves from our sinful condition. Stewardship Thought: One aspect of stewardship is using God's gift of time in wise ways. Here's an idea for a new year's resolution: I will use the gift of time God has given me to make worship and study in His House a priority, just as Jesus did even when He was young. As I do, I ask God to give me wisdom and discernment, just as Solomon did when he became king. St. Paul reminds me that God has adopted me as His child, and I want to live graciously in that gift of His love!

PSALM OF THE DAY

God gave Solomon the gift of wisdom and understanding, more than all his teachers. Do you think this psalm of his father, David, meant something special to him?

As you read this portion of Psalm 119, read it also with the image of Jesus—The Word—as a 12-year-old, reciting this psalm for His parents as He speaks to His heavenly Father:

Psalm 119:97-104

Oh how I love Your law!
It is my meditation
all the day.
Your commandment
makes me wiser
than my enemies,
for it is ever with me.
I have more
understanding than
all my teachers,
for Your testimonies
are my meditation.
I understand more
than the aged, for
I keep Your precepts.
I hold back my feet
from every evil way,
in order to
keep Your word.
I do not turn aside
from Your rules, for
You have taught me.
How sweet are
Your words to my taste,
sweeter than honey
to my mouth!
Through Your precepts
I get understanding;
therefore I hate
every false way.

God's Word is both His Law and His Gospel. Is Jesus, The Word, sweeter to you than the sweetest of foods (Psalm 119:103)?

The LORD said to Ezekiel, "Son of man, feed your belly with this scroll that I give you and fill your stomach with it." Then I ate it, and it was in my mouth as sweet as honey.

OLD TESTAMENT READING 1 Kings 3:4-15

And [King Solomon] went to Gibeon to sacrifice there, for that was the great high place. Solomon used to offer a thousand burnt offerings on that altar. At Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night, and God said, "Ask what I shall give you." And Solomon said, "You have shown great and steadfast love to Your servant David my father, because he walked before You in faithfulness, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart toward you. And You have kept for him this great and steadfast love and have given him a son to sit on his throne this day. And now, O LORD my God, You have made Your servant king in place of David my father, although I am but a little child. I do not know how to go out or come in. And Your servant is in the midst of Your people whom You have chosen, a great people, too many to be numbered or counted for multitude. Give Your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern Your people, that I may discern between good and evil, for who is able to govern this Your great people?"

It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this. And God said to him, "Because you have asked this, and have not asked for yourself long life or riches or the life of your enemies, but have asked for yourself understanding to discern what is right, behold, I now do according to your word. Behold, I give you a wise and discerning mind, so that none like you has been before you and none like you shall arise after you. I give you also what you have not asked, both riches and honor, so that no other king shall compare with you, all your days. And if you will walk in My ways, keeping My statutes and My commandments, as your father David walked, then I will lengthen your days."

And Solomon awoke, and behold, it was a dream. Then he came to Jerusalem and stood before the ark of the covenant of the Lord, and offered up burnt offerings and peace offerings, and made a feast for all his servants.

EPISTLE READING Ephesians 1:3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him. In love He predestined us for adoption as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will, to the praise of His glorious grace, with which He has blessed us in the Beloved. In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace, which He lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight making known to us the mystery of His will, according to His purpose, which He set forth in Christ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in Him, things in heaven and things on earth.

In Him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of Him who works all things according to the counsel of His will, so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of His glory. In Him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in Him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of His glory.

THE HOLY GOSPEL Luke 2:40-52

And the child [Jesus] grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And the favor of God was upon Him.

Now His parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. And when He was twelve years old, they went up according to custom. And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, but supposing Him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but then they began to search for Him among their relatives and acquaintances, and when they did not find Him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for Him. After three days they found Him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard Him were amazed at His understanding and His answers. And when His parents saw Him, they were astonished. And His mother said to Him, "Son, why have You treated us so? Behold, Your father and I have been searching for You in great distress." And He said to them, "Why were you looking for Me? Did you not know that I must be in My Father's house?" And they did not understand the saying that He spoke to them. And He went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And His mother treasured up all these things in her heart.

And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man.

And faithful pond'ring hearts await the full epiphany.


Lord, visit Thou our souls and teach us by Thy grace

MESSAGE "Anxious Parents? You Think?" text: Luke 2:4-52



What were you looking for a few days ago when we gathered for the annual celebration of Christmas? If you knew what you were looking for, did you find it? Did you find answers to all your troubles when you sang the Christmas songs? Or are you still searching? That's okay, because for two more days, it's still Christmas. It's not too late. :-)

In Joseph and Mary's anxiety over their three-day search for Jesus, they couldn't find Him in the crowds or among their relatives and friends. It was only as they returned to the temple, the place of God the Father's promised earthly presence, that they found who they were looking for.

You have come to the right place, the place of God's promised presence for you—here, in God's House, where His Word is preached, His Sacraments are administered, and His grace, love, and forgiveness are given and applied to you. You will find Jesus here!

So do not be anxious about your life. You are seeking the answers in the right place, in the kingdom of God and in His righteousness given to you this day in His mighty, saving Word!

A Creed is a statement of faith or belief. We recite the creeds as a way to review the doctrines of Scripture. We recite the creeds together to support the faith of each other. The creed can also be a great outline for sharing **History** with others!
