CONFESSION OF SINS

1 John 3:1; Psalm 51:12

- P: John wrote, "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are." The devil, the world, and our sinful nature lead us to live lives that do not reflect this reality. Let us confess our sins to our heavenly Father: Most merciful God and Father,
- C: we are sinful by our very nature. We confess our lives do not always reveal that we are Your children and You are our Father. We sin against You and others with our thoughts, words, and actions. In Your righteousness, forgive us and cleanse us from all our unrighteousness. Restore the joy of Your salvation to us and sustain us with a willing spirit. Amen.

ABSOLUTION ~ FORGIVENESS OF SINS

1 John 3:2-3; John 20:19-23; Matt. 5:12a

- P: John reminds us, "Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when He appears we shall be like Him, because we shall see Him as He is. And everyone who thus hopes in Him purifies himself as He is pure." In the mercy of our heavenly Father, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for His sake God forgives us and purifies us from all our sins. To those who believe in Jesus Christ, He gives the power to become the children of God and gives them the Holy Spirit. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- P: Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven!
- C: Amen. Alleluia!

SALUTATION AND PRAYER OF THE DAY

- P: The Lord be with you!

- P: We pray: Almighty and everlasting God, You knit together Your faithful people of all times and places into one holy communion, the mystical body of Your Son, Jesus Christ. Grant us so to follow Your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living that, together with them, we may come to the unspeakable joys You have prepared for those who love You; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



All Saints Day: Since the 3rd century A.D., Christians have observed the custom of commemorating all the martyrs of the Church on a single day. Today, we remember all the people of God, living or departed, who are the Body of Christ, the Holy Christian Church. We are saints—even while at the same time sinners—because we are declared righteous and holy through Jesus' death and resurrection!







The observance of All Saints' Day is a source of recurring comfort. It gives us reassurance that our loved ones who have gone before us have not been removed from our fellowship but still share with us the same blessed communion.

Theirs is the glorious prize; ours is the joyous hope. The day will come when we shall join with them before the heavenly throne, praising our Savior, as *Revelation 7* states:

Amen!
Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever.
Amen!

FIRST READING Revelation 7:2-17

[St. John continues describing the revelation he received from God:]

Then I saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, with the seal of the living God, and he called with a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to harm earth and sea, saying, "Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads." And I heard the number of the sealed, 144,000, sealed from every tribe of the sons of Israel:

12,000 from the tribe of Judah were sealed,

12,000 from the tribe of Reuben,

12,000 from the tribe of Gad,

12,000 from the tribe of Asher,

12,000 from the tribe of Naphtali,

12,000 from the tribe of Manasseh,

12,000 from the tribe of Simeon,

12,000 from the tribe of Levi,

12,000 from the tribe of Issachar,

12,000 from the tribe of Zebulun,

12,000 from the tribe of Joseph,

12,000 from the tribe of Benjamin were sealed.

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?" I said to him, "Sir, you know." And he said to me, "These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

"Therefore, they are before the throne of God, and serve Him day and night in His temple; and He who sits on the throne will shelter them with His presence. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat. For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and He will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

He lives my hungry soul to feed; He lives to help in time of need.


He lives to grant me rich supply; He lives to guide me with His eye;

MESSAGE "How Great the Father's Love for Us!" text: 1 John 3:1-3

The Nicene Creed is historically connected with the celebration of the Lord's Supper, because it stresses more fully the Biblical teaching that Jesus Christ is true God, which is intimately connected with Christ's true body and blood being present in Holy Communion. The Council of Nicaea occurred in 325 AD.

STATEMENT OF FAITH ~ THE NICENE CREED

ALL: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered, and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets.

And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life * of the world to come. Amen!

P: In Holy Baptism, all saints were clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all their sin. Paul says in Romans chapter 6: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

ALL: For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His."

- P: And St. John reminds us in Revelation, chapter 14: "Blessed are they that die in the Lord from now on,
- C: for they will rest from their labors, and their deeds will follow them."
- P: We pray: In joyful expectation for the resurrection of the body to life, we remember before You, O Lord, all those who have gone before us in faith, whom we pause now to name in our hearts.





Every year on November 1 or the first Sunday of November, we pause our busy lives to remember the saints. Lutherans teach that saints are sinners baptized into Christ; they are sinner-saints redeemed by the cross of Jesus; and they are saints-with-the-Lord who gave us examples of trusting not in their own heroic feats but in the grace and mercy of God in Jesus.
