OLD TESTAMENT READING Isaiah 52:7-10



EPISTLE READING Hebrews 1:1-12

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days He has spoken to us by His Son, whom He appointed the heir of all things, through whom also He created the world. He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of His nature, and He upholds the universe by the word of His power. After making purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name He has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are My Son, today I have begotten You"? Or again, "I will be to Him a Father and He shall be to Me a son"? And again, when He brings the firstborn into the world, He says, "Let all God's angels worship Him." Of the angels He says, "He makes His angels winds, and His ministers a flame of fire." But of the Son He says, "Your throne, O God, is forever and ever, the scepter of uprightness is the scepter of Your kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness beyond your companions." And, "You, Lord, laid the foundation of the earth in the beginning, and the heavens are the work of Your hands; they will perish, but You remain; they will all wear out like a garment, like a robe You will roll them up, like a garment they will be changed. But You are the same, and Your years will have no end."

THE HOLY GOSPEL John 1:1-18

- L: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him was not any thing made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men.
- C: The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
- L: There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through Him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.
- C: The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.
- L: He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, yet the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him. But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

ALL: And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us!

L: And we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John bore witness about Him, and cried out, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because He was before me.'")

ALL: And from His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace.

L: For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, He has made Him known.

RESPONSE

RESPONSE OF FAITH

Martin Luther's Explanation to the 2nd Article of the Apostles' Creed

ALL: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord. He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead and lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true!

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

1 Timothy 2:1-4



One should examine himself before he eats the bread and drinks the cup; one who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself. 1Corinthians 11:28-29 Since those who take Christ's body and blood without understanding His true presence do so to their harm, and since the sacrament of Holy Communion is a faith statement confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt or hold a confession differing from that of this church and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and desire to receive the sacrament are asked first to speak with Pastor.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION ~ FORGIVENESS OF SINS

1 John 1:8-9; LSB # 360; John 20:19-23

- P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- C: But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination)
- P: Confident of God's forgiveness, let us then confess our sins to God our Father:
- C: I, a poor sinner, plead guilty before You of all my sins, Lord. I have lived as if You did not matter and I mattered most. I have not honored Your name, and my worship and prayers have faltered. I have not let Your love have its way with me, and so my love for others has failed. There are those whom I have hurt, and those whom I have failed to help. My thoughts and desires are soiled with sin. I am sorry for all my sins and plead for Your mercy in Christ Jesus. Graciously forgive me all my sins and help me change my sinful life. Amen.
- P: Should we fear our God's displeasure who, to save us, freely gave us His most precious treasure?
- C: To redeem us, He has given His own Son from the throne of His might in heaven!
- P: God is loving and merciful! May He strengthen your faith. In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♥ Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen!

LSB # 360; Psalm 136; LSB # 379:2-3


- P: All my heart rejoices as I hear, far and near, sweetest angel voices:
