CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION OF SINS

Gospel Reading: The Slaughter of the Innocents is a sobering event in the early years of Jesus' life. It highlights the lengths to which earthly forces may go to oppose God's Anointed One.

This story is rooted in **Old Testament** prophecy as well as consistent with historical accounts of Herod's atrocities: see Hosea 11:1: Jeremiah 31:15. Herod's rage is an example of a greater reality: worldly powers can-and often dooppose the work of God. This hostility foreshadows the opposition Jesus faced throughout most of His ministry, culminating in His crucifixion.

Through these tragic circumstances, Scripture underscores God's grand plan of redemption, weaving every detail into the fulfillment of the Messiah's mission. Jesus is the Messiah, Immanuel, God-With-Us!

THE HOLY GOSPEL Matthew 2:13-23

Now when [the wise men] had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and His mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy Him." And he rose and took the child and His mother by night and departed to Egypt and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt I called My Son."

Then Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, became furious, and he sent and killed all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had ascertained from the wise men. Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah: "A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be comforted, because they are no more."

But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, saying, "Rise, take the child and His mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." And he rose and took the child and His mother and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. And he went and lived in a city called Nazareth, that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled: "He shall be called a Nazarene."

STATEMENT OF FAITH ~ THE NICENE CREED

The Nicene Creed is historically connected with the celebration of the Lord's Supper, because it stresses more fully the Biblical teaching that Jesus Christ is true God, which is intimately connected with Christ's true body and blood being present in Holy Communion. It dates back to the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD.



Agnus Dei means "Lamb of God." Christ is our Good Shepherd, the Lamb of God, and the Priest who offers the sacrifice for the forgiveness of sins. Truly, Jesus is Our All In All!

Benedicamus: Latin for "let us bless" or "let us say a good word." One of the Hebrew ideas of blessing is "to praise a person's ability for success as from a lesser person to a greater." God blesses us with His gifts of forgiveness and new life through the saving work of Christ on the cross. We, in turn, praise Him for His goodness to us!
