A Letter from Pastor Stoltenow

Be Transformed and Renewed in the Heart

As we enter the season of Advent leading to the celebration of the birth of Jesus, I encourage you to consider the awesomeness of what God has accomplished for us in our Lord Jesus Christ. All the promises of God through the Old Testament have come to fruition as we, once again, are reminded of our need for our Savior and make our way to the stable in Bethlehem to see the Babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. Martin Luther writes in his *Christmas Book*:

The virgin birth is a mere trifle for God; that God should become a man is a greater miracle; but most amazing of all is that this maiden should credit the announcement that she, rather than some other virgin had been chosen to be the mother of God. She did indeed inquire of the angel, "How can these things be?" ..and he answered, [Mary, you have asked too high a question for me] but the Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you [and you will not know yourself how it happens]. Had she not believed, she could not have conceived. She held fast to the word of the angel because she had become a new creature.

Even so, we must be transformed and renewed in the heart from day to day. Otherwise, Christ is born in vain. This is the word of the prophet, "Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given." (Isaiah 9:6). This is for us the hardest point, not so much to believe that he is the son of the virgin and God Himself, as to believe that this Son of God is ours. That is where we wilt, but he who does feel it has become another man. Truly it is marvelous in our eyes that God should place a little child in the lap of a virgin and that all our blessedness should lie in Him. And this child belongs to all mankind. God feeds the whole world through a babe nursing at Mary's breast. This must be our daily exercise: to be transformed into Christ, being nourished by this food. Then will the heart be suffused with all joy and will be strong and confident against every assault.

A Way to Pray

There's something about Christmas that seems to bring the whole world together. Even those who aren't Christian will gather with family/friends, bless others with gifts/food, and enjoy the gift of presence. When you're a kid the holidays can be even more magical (it might have something to do with not having to foot the bill or prepare everything)!

Have you heard the song "Jesus Loves the Little Children"? The first verse goes:

Jesus loves the little children
All the children of the world
Red and yellow, black and white
They are precious in His sight
Jesus loves the little children of the world

Matthew 19:14 says, But Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me. Don't stop them, because the kingdom of heaven belongs to people who are like these children." (ICB)

So, for December I thought I'd ask you to grab the markers and crayons and bring out your inner child (or have fun with it as an activity with your kids/grandkids as you gather for the holidays)!

PRAYING IN COLOR

After gathering your supplies (paper, markers, crayons, pens) here are two ways you can PRAY IN COLOR:

- 1. Decide what you'll pray for with each color. For example, blue could be for family, orange for friends, yellow for what you're thankful for, red for forgiveness, etc. Then go about and create whatever artwork you'd like! As you use each color in your drawing, pray for those different people/areas.
- 2. Pray for a specific person/thing as you draw each object. For example, if you drew a garden scene you might pray for your grandma as you drew a butterfly because she loved butterflies. Each flower you draw could represent a specific person or you could even write a person's name on each of the petals and pray for them. The sun could be a thanksgiving for Jesus and a rainbow could be thanks for all the ways God keeps His promises.

We serve a creative God, so enjoy tapping into your creative side while talking with the Lord! The thing I love about PRAYING IN COLOR is later when you display your artwork

you can look at the picture and remember the people/things you prayed for!

And for those who say you're not creative, there are lots of ways to be creative other than through artwork. Maybe as you cook the holiday meal, each time you create a dish you pray for a specific person. Ham—praying for your parents, potatoes—your kids, salad—your neighbors, rolls—friends, dessert—your coworkers, etc. And then when you sit down to eat and see the spread before you, you'll be reminded that God has heard your prayer for each of them. If you're a builder, maybe each nail you hammer in is a prayer for a different person. In whatever way you prefer to create, you can use that time to converse with God!

Praying with an Open Heart

This month, we are **Praying with an Open Heart for...those** who are lonely (especially those who are shut in or who are grieving a loss).

December is a beautiful time of year as we prepare for celebrating the birth of our Savior, Jesus. For those who are lonely, whether grieving a loss of a person or personal freedom (such as those unable to leave their home or room), mustering the courage to celebrate can be difficult – even heartbreaking. Our dear Lord has a heart for the lonely and has supplied us with many verses in Scripture to offer comfort and hope.

Maybe you are lonely and understand personally how this feels when others are celebrating. Maybe you are joyful and excited for this month! Regardless of your circumstances, carrying the lonely to God in prayer is a gift we all can offer. We also have the privilege of opening our hearts to the Holy Spirit's prompts to be Jesus' hands and bring a hug or open a home, offering comfort from Christ to another.

"God sets the lonely in families" (Psalm 68:6a). May we be the family who responds with loving service to relieve loneliness!



Missionary of the Month – December 2025

Rev. Dr. Jonathan and Deaconess Cheryl Naumann-Dominican Republic

The Rev. Dr. Jonathan and Deaconess Cheryl Naumann serve the Lord through the LCMS as missionaries in the Dominican Republic. As the Latin America and Caribbean regional chaplain, Jonathan provides pastoral care to LCMS missionary families in over 10 countries. Stephen Ministry Trains "Angels" on Earth

In the course of two tumultuous years, Kathy Sansom experienced five major stressful life events. After her husband died of cancer in 2002, she married a childhood friend. The marriage soured quickly and was annulled. In the midst of it all, her mother died, and Sansom moved to a new city. "When I moved to the Houston area at the end of 2003, I was totally exhausted—emotionally, physically, every way you could think of," says Sansom. "I was in a new city and didn't know many people. My Pastor suggested that I start seeing a Stephen Minister. It was great! She would call and check on me and pray for me. Basically, I'm a very happy person, but having a Stephen Minister helped me over a very rough time."

Kathy's pastor says that "We're a 3,000-member church, so the ministers can't possibly provide one-on-one care to every single person. But a Stephen Minister can be there for someone who's in the midst of a life challenge so they don't have to walk through the valley alone." "The difference between talking to a good friend and talking to a Stephen Minister is that a good friend still can be judgmental and have a tendency to want to fix things. But that's not really what you need during a difficult time," Sansom says. "You don't need someone to tell you what to do because, in your heart, you know. You just need someone to listen."




