"Why would I need a Stephen Minister? I have my family and friends to support me during this difficult time."

What can a Stephen Minister offer even though you have a support system? A Stephen Minister can be:

- 1. A listening presence. A Stephen Minister is not as emotionally involved as your spouse or children. You can be open and honest about whatever feelings you are experiencing. People often protect or hide their true feelings from those they love because they don't want to hurt or burden them.
- 2. Encouragement for family members. Knowing that another is also caring and giving to the one who is hurting will give additional support to family members.
- 3. A source of caring. After your initial responses to the crisis are over, a Stephen Minister can be a consistent, dependable listener and friend. You will have a companion in the process of healing.
- 4. A part of our faith community. The presence of a Stephen Minister says, "You are an important member of our parish, and your parish community cares about you."

As I was looking at this Psalm I came across the footnotes of the *Concordia Study Bible* where the author, regarding verses 10 and 11, writes "The Lord's absolute and everlasting rule is committed to His people's complete salvation and unmixed blessedness – the crowning comfort in a world where threatening tides seem to make everything uncertain." I hope you read the first sentence of this quote carefully when the author talks about God's complete commitment to our eternal salvation and the blessings that happen here on earth and those of the kingdom that is to come. God is absolutely committed to our eternal life and blessedness!

Through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus, God showed His absolute and everlasting love for us in committing to death His Son, Jesus. By Jesus' death and glorious resurrection, we have been given *strength*, *blessings*, *and peace*. We walk faithfully in the *strength* of

our Lord every day as we navigate the ever-changing and threatening tides we all encounter. We are led by God's Holy Scriptures and nurtured by the Sacraments. We receive our blessings—our daily bread—as we receive from the Lord all that we need to support this body and life. (Luther's explanation of the 4th Petition of the Lord's Prayer) And, finally, we are given the peace of God that surpasses all human understanding as our hearts and minds are kept steadfast in faith to our Lord Jesus Christ.
