

Mary's Monthly Meal

Sour Cream Chicken Enchilada

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cups cooked, shredded chicken
- 2 T butter
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 2 cups sour cream
- 2 T flour
- 1 cup Monterey Jack cheese
- 1 cup Sharp Cheddar cheese
- 8-10 Flour tortillas
- 1 can (4oz) diced green chilies
- Salt + Pepper



DIRECTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Grease 9x13 dish

Make the sauce:

- melt butter, stir in flour to create a roux, whisking continually until smooth, whisk into chicken broth.
- Remove from heat, stir in sour cream and chilies, season with salt and pepper.

Assemble Enchiladas:

- Place chicken in the center, sprinkle both cheeses. Roll up and place seam side down.
- Top with sauce and remaining cheese, pour over the enchiladas, then both cheeses.
- Bake for 20 minutes until bubbly and golden brown

For many years, our family had the same routine when arriving at CranHill for camping. My wife would go into the office to check in and I would get 3 little bikes off the roof of our old Volvo wagon. We would our boys our site number and they would set out finding new friends, discovering what new animals were in the petting zoo, visiting the playgrounds and maybe catching a frog or two. We typically wouldn't see them for an hour or more, which gave us time to set up our campsite. Eventually they would show up, usually when hungry. Being at CranHill, we never worried about them or their safety as we knew that camp was filled with Christian families that would happily apply a bandage or help them find their way to our campsite.

Galatians 6:10 reminded me of what we experienced so many times at CranHill:

"Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers."

We come to camp to get away and relax in God's beautiful creation, to refresh, spend time with family, make new friends and spend time in a community of believers. 1997	Bev Schipper, Jan Nyhof, and Esther VanderLaan felt God calling them to help people in their community, and began the process of bringing Love INC to Allegan County.
December 1999	Love INC received non-profit status and a formal Board of Directors was established.
April 2000	After 3 years of prayer, consideration, and planning, we opened the doors of Love INC of Northwest Allegan County in an office at M-40 and 136th.
June 2000	What would become our relational ministry (LIFE Skills) began.
2001	Our Sponsor-A-Family Christmas ministry began.
October 2002	Jean Eding was hired as our Director of Relational Ministries.
October 2002	Kirk Vander Molen was hired as our first paid Executive Director.
March 2003	Our Bedding Pantry opened at Overisel Reformed Church.
August 2003	Our Back-to-School backpack ministry began.
February 2004	We expanded our ministry with a satellite office in Allegan, open two days a week. Our Appliance Pantry opened at First Congregational Church in Allegan. Our Baby Needs Pantry opened at First Presbyterian Church. Our Personal Needs Pantry opened at Allegan Bible Church.
March 2005	Our Homes of Hope Program launched to help homeless families in need.

- June 2005 Our LIFE Skills Program expanded into Allegan.
- January 2007 Our Heart to Heart Resale Store opened—our largest fundraiser.
- February 2008 Love INC moved into our current office space, the old Chevy dealership in Hamilton.
- June 2008 We expanded our ministry with a satellite office in Pullman.
- October 2009 Our LIFE Skills Program expanded into Pullman.
- April 2013 Kirk Vander Molen left Love INC Allegan County, taking the role of Executive Director at Love INC National.
- 2013-2016 Brian Stauffer served as Executive Director of Love INC Allegan County.
- May 2016 Barry Lucas was hired as Executive Director.
- 2019 Our Allegan LIFE Skills Program closed as a result of limited staffing. We closed our satellite office and LIFE Skills Program in Pullman, enabling the ministry of People Helping People to flourish.
- March 2023 We launched our 10 Homes for 10 Families Program.
- February 2025 Our Allegan LIFE Skills Program opened back up with an afternoon program.
- May 2025 Our first family to complete the 10 Homes for 10 Families Program took ownership of their home.

This year, I met her again at camp. She came right up to me, asked about my testimony, and shared her own story. When I asked about her journey, she told me, 'I want to become a missionary!'

Praise God—He's clearly at work in her life. Please continue praying for her spiritual growth."

Lives are *changed* at Camp, where Christ is hope!

Dear Friends,

Last summer, I shared about John, a 13-year-old boy carrying deep pain and depression who reluctantly came to Beechpoint for the first time. That week, though he didn't talk or smile much, seeds of faith were planted in his heart as he experienced God's love in a new way.

Two weeks ago, Abby, our camp registrar, reached out to see if John would join us again for Teen Week. He said yes. From the very first day, we could see something different. John was smiling, laughing, and fully engaged. By the end of the week, he ran up to our Camp Director, Dani, and said:

"Miss Dani, when I go home, I'm a new person... I'm done being depressed! I got a Bible! I gave my life to Jesus!"
