What began as a simple artisan program in an informal settlement area of Nairobi eventually transformed into Grain of Rice Academy, which is located in Nanyuki, Kenya and has over 200 students. Our goal is to provide high quality Christian education that helps students think critically and creatively to become problem solvers in their community. I love coffee, traveling, a good book, crafting, making art, and being in nature (especially Kenya's perfect 75 degree weather!). I live in Kenya with my husband and 3 kids (2 biological and 1 foster). In my free time, I enjoy experiencing Kenya's wildlife. Sometimes we hear hyenas from our house at night!

# A Note From Pastor Ken

## As I Have Loved You

John 13:34 - A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.

February has become known in America as the love month because of Valentine's Day on February 14<sup>th</sup>. And often times we don't think very deeply about what love really means. We think about giving gifts to our spouse and, maybe, going out for a nice dinner and reminiscing about when you first fell in love. And there is nothing wrong with that romantic love, in fact, that is good to do on a regular basis to keep that relationship alive.

But when we look at the verse above it challenges us in a many deeper ways. Yes, there are times when we don't really like the person we are in a relationship with, but we still love them. Sometimes that requires sacrifice (maybe I should say often times it requires sacrifice). But it is a given that you both are in it for the long haul.

But when we look at what Jesus commands (yes, commands) it goes way beyond the romantic love between people. We see that we are to love people as Jesus loved us. And then we begin to see the depths of Jesus' love for us. We see that we are to love people that are not desiring that love and do not return that love to us. We see that we are to love our enemies. And if He commands it, that means there will be times when we are at odds with other people, yet we are to love them. We are to love people that are not as well off as we are, and people that are better off than us. It means we are to love those who disappoint us and frustrate us beyond measure. And it means a whole lot more than that, because that's what Jesus did for us. If you think that Jesus loved you because you were so lovable, man, you have another thing coming! He loved us when we were dead in our trespasses and sins! Not much to love there is there?

Verse 35 says that by loving one another all people will know that you are my disciples. That tells us that in Jesus' day it was different and odd to love one another. This was a new commandment. Something that would be a challenge to believers in Christ. But the commandment still holds today. Love one another even when it is not advantageous to you and even when it hurts so that people will know that we are Jesus' disciples.

Jesus never said it would be easy to be a follower of His. So that is the challenge for us this February. By all means, love your spouse and treat them lovingly this month. But also, take up the challenge to love one another as Christ has loved you. Have a great February and I'll see you on the journey as we love others as Jesus loved us! God Bless You All!


## Hobo Casserole

### INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 med. onion, chopped
- 1 t. garlic powder
- 1 t. onion powder
- 1 t. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$  t. pepper
- 4 medium potatoes, thinly sliced
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup milk
- 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup cheddar cheese
- $\frac{1}{2}$  t. paprika
- 1 t. butter

### INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Grease a medium size dish
- In a large skillet brown ground beef and onion, drain
- Add in garlic powder, onion powder, salt, and pepper
- In a small bowl whisk together soup and milk
- Begin layering the dish by placing a layer of thin potatoes, then half of the beef mixture, and finally half of the soup mixture.
- Repeat entire process again with remaining ingredients. Potatoes, beef, soup
- Sprinkle cheese on top
- Cover with foil and bake 1 hour, then remove foil and bake for another 25 minutes.




## MAKE AN IMPACT FOR MENTAL HEALTH



Dates: June 12-25, 2027. (Arrival day in Israel June 13, Departure on 25<sup>th</sup> or late evening of 24<sup>th</sup>). Each Participant will be responsible to purchase their own flight(s) to meet this itinerary once the trip is confirmed.

Cost: Land Prices are still being negotiated as we finalize the itinerary and hotels; flight prices are too early to predict. We suggest that each participant budget \$5,500 for the entire trip (land, air, lunches, souvenirs, sundries), in anticipation of rising travel and land-based costs.

Partnership: We are partnering with Emmaus Journeys (Steve and Sunya Notley) for all the land details of our journey. Our Tour will be listed on their [website](#) (emmausjourneys.com) soon and will be updated as more details come in.

Study Tour: Our goal is to see and explore as much of the land, walls, valleys and mountains as we can reasonably traverse in our 12-days in Israel. This itinerary requires a bit of walking (hiking for some) and is not suitable for someone with limited mobility or difficulty in walking uneven trails. Our pace is steady, though not hurried, as we move from site to site; some days will feel longer than others. As a study tour, we will spend time reading the bible texts, Josephus and other ancient texts; as well as discussing ideas that challenge our (often) simplistic understanding of biblical passage. Come ready to be challenged physically, intellectually, emotionally and spiritually- you will never be the same after this trip.

After four years of serving with Word of Life Korea, it saddens me to share I have decided that I will not be continuing with Word of Life Korea moving forward. The role I had originally been preparing to step into is no longer available, and with recent leadership and directional changes, there is uncertainty regarding what a future role for me might look like in the coming years. In light of these changes, and after a season of reflection and counsel, I do not feel that continuing with Word of Life Korea is the right fit for me at this time.

I am deeply saddened by these changes, and that God is shutting this door, but I'm also so grateful for my time in Korea and for the relationships and ministry experiences God allowed during those years. I continue to pray for the team and for their ongoing work among the people there.



The enemy is doing all he can to keep this country in bondage to Islam, but he is losing!! 68% of all the mosques in this country have closed in the last 10 years. The youth want nothing to do with Islam, and many people claim to be agnostic or atheist.

This country is ripe for revival!! When revolution raises its head often a strong revival follows. This revolution reminds me of our time in Lithuania right after the fall of the Soviet Union. We got there a few months after Lithuania declared its freedom. There were tank barricades in the streets, soldiers with machine guns, bullet holes everywhere and there was incredible openness to the gospel. If the Lord brings a change of government in Iran now there will be another HUGE opportunity for the gospel and I want to be part of that proclamation of the gospel again!! I will go to Iran and be part of what the Lord will do there!

Two days ago we learned of another death. This time the uncle of one of our close community members. He was the father of two children. He is just one of the many thousands that have now perished.

The full account of suffering is unknown. Reuters, citing unnamed Iranian intelligence sources, reported at least 5,000 killed. London's Sunday Times reported 12,000 to 16,000. It is impossible to comprehend such staggering loss. Each of these people is a human being created in God's image.

Let us continue to pray:

- For the sovereign hand of God to be at work to stop the violence against innocent people.
- For the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit to stay close to the believers in this deep valley, that their faith may be sustained during this time of mourning.
- For the leaders of our Persian team as they seek to minister to the needs of our Persian family, all while concerned for their own families and relatives.
- For Iranians to continue to turn to Christ. He is their only hope.
- For this evil regime to fall and for times of peace to return to this beautiful country.

Pray also for a small team from North America that will visit with Iranian refugees in the month of February. I will be joining this group as we seek God together in prayer. # FIRESIDE CHATS

Lives are **changed** at Camp, where Christ is hope!

Dear Friends,

This weekend at Winter Camp, Cam arrived carrying something in his pocket: his report card.

That small piece of paper tells a much bigger story about why camp exists and why Winter Camp matters.

When Cam first arrived at Camp Beechpoint this past summer, he was carrying deep grief. He had lost his father to violence, and the weight of that loss showed up in how he guarded himself. Camp became a place where something new could begin, a place of care, safety, and honesty. That week, healing took root.

Winter Camp marked Cam's second time back.

As soon as he walked into the lodge, he scanned the room, searching for his cabin. When he spotted his cabin leader from the summer, he ran straight to him and wrapped him in a hug. He reunited with the camper, Malik, who had shared his father loss story months earlier, the two of them jumping up and down with joy.

This time, Cam didn't need to test whether he belonged.

He knew.

Throughout the weekend, Cam naturally stepped into leadership without being asked. During a chapel message, he noticed another camper sitting alone off to the side. Cam quietly got up, walked over, and invited him to come sit with their cabin so he wouldn't miss hearing the message. Cam wasn't fighting to find his place anymore. He was creating space for others.

One of his cabin leaders also had a meaningful conversation with him about repentance, forgiveness, and assurance of salvation. As they talked, something clicked. Cam began to understand that even when he messes up, turning back to Jesus for forgiveness is possible.

And then there was the report card.

Cam pulled his cabin leader aside and said, "I brought something to show you." From the back pocket of his jeans, he carefully unfolded his report card, the same one he had carried with him all weekend. He wanted his cabin leader to see how well he was doing in school.

That moment said everything.

Cam had brought his report card because he knew there were people at camp who would celebrate his progress, encourage him, and remind him that he mattered here.


Throughout the weekend, Cam also experienced what camp uniquely offers: a safe space to be vulnerable. After chapel and during sharing times, he pulled his cabin leader aside just to cry and share what was going on in his heart. He talked about how deeply the teaching on forgiveness had impacted him, especially the truth that God chose to forgive him.

As Winter Camp came to a close, Cam shared how much he hopes to come back to camp again and, one day, to return as a camp leader himself.

Cam's story reminds us why Winter Camp exists.

It's not just a weekend away. It's a continuation of what God is doing, building on relationships, reinforcing truth, and giving campers a place to hear from Him and be changed by Him. Sometimes the impact shows up in tears, leadership, and growth. And sometimes, it shows up in a folded up report card, saved carefully for the people who care.

## Quarterly Update

October-December

In the final quarter of 2025, our volunteers served 2,095 hours, answering 124 requests for help through our Connection Center (including 32 requests from new families), and meeting 1,186 needs in our community.

Our LIFE Skills, 10 Homes for 10 Families, and Homes of Hope volunteers served (collectively) 190 hours.

38 LIFE Skills class sessions and 58 mentor meetings were held.
