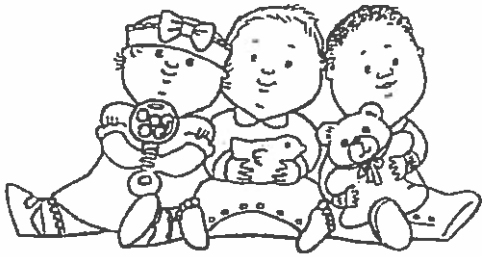

ORC Weather Cancellation Policy

The responsibility for cancelling church activities will rest with a Weather Committee. Decisions regarding cancelling church activities will generally be made no less than 2 ½ hours before the activity begins—7:00 am for morning services, 2:30 pm for evening services and by 2:00 for Wednesday evening. Weather cancellation notices will be sent via email and will be posted on the ORC website, the ORC Facebook page and local TV and radio stations.

In the event that Hamilton Community Schools are closed for afternoon classes due to severe weather, all church activities will be assumed to be cancelled unless the affected church members are notified otherwise.

A tornado watch or warning in effect within one hour of the beginning of a church activity, that activity will be cancelled. Other severe weather advisories will be considered on a case by case basis.

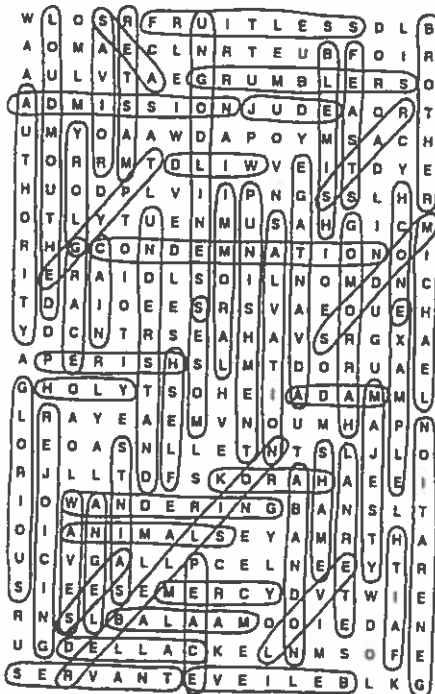

An idea for Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday which is March 6

If you are looking for a special activity for Lent this year, the Worship Committee has a suggestion for you. Find a red letter edition of the Bible and take the Lenten Season to read and ponder the words of Jesus, which are printed in red. They appear in the books of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, the first 4 books of the New Testament. If you can not find one of these Bibles, let the church office know and we will try to find one you can borrow.

Also for Passion Week which begins on April 14, Palm Sunday, we would like to suggest that you take any or all of the Gospels and read through the last week of Christ's life on earth. This can be found in the four Gospels starting in Matthew 21, Mark 11, Luke 19:28, and John 12. Make this Lenten Season a special one getting to know Jesus by his own words.

So... what is the “Gospel Alliance”?

As we’ve talked about the future of the RCA, one significant group playing a part in these discussions is the Gospel Alliance. Several of you have asked about what the Gospel Alliance is and whether or not our church is a member of this alliance. I can answer the second question easily, so let’s start there. We are not members of the Gospel Alliance. In order to become part of it, a church’s consistory needs to officially vote to do so.

As for what the Gospel Alliance actually is, I’ll start with what their website (thegospelalliance.com) says: “The Gospel Alliance is a movement of covenant partners who are engaging leaders and communities with the transforming message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in order to make more and stronger disciples.” They describe the theological “Alliance Essentials” as a Reformed understanding of the Christian faith, including a focus on the importance of the Reformation tenets of Scripture Alone (as the authoritative word of God); Christ Alone (as our Savior and the Lord of our lives); Faith Alone (as the means by which we are joined with Christ); (God’s) Grace Alone (as the means by which we are saved); For the Glory of God Alone (as the purpose for which we live).

So what really makes this group different, what are its distinctive qualities? The Alliance’s website describes its purpose as “To equip one another in relationship toward: Establishing and multiplying churches; Strengthening churches; Diversity in churches; Missional effectiveness locally and globally; Strong leadership development systems; and Mercy and Justice ministries locally and globally.”

In order to get a better understanding of this, the ORC Consistory agreed that I would go to the Gospel Alliance’s regional meeting last July and its annual “Gathering” last October. From these meetings, I would say that it became obvious that the Alliance is fairly conservative in its theology and fairly progressive in its approach to evangelism and ministry in today’s culture.

The focus of the meetings and the topics discussed there were very much in keeping with the qualities from their website. This is a group that is very committed to planting new churches, helping existing churches grow, developing effective church leaders, and developing effective ways to spread the good news of Jesus Christ in today’s world. For example, at the annual Gathering, one of the presenters was a Chicago area congregation talking about just how they had planted or helped revitalize 27 other churches. Another congregation had planted or revitalized 7 other churches. The emphasis was very much on what they are “for” and not on what they are “against”. The theme for the 2019 annual Gathering in October is “Becoming a Word and Spirit Church.”

Although it was not a main focus of the meetings, theologically, one obvious distinctive of the Gospel Alliance is that it holds to a traditional biblical view of sexuality and “that sexuality is to be expressed in monogamous, heterosexual, life-long covenant in which two persons joining body, mind, and soul.” Another relevant position is that they are committed to allowing churches to decide for themselves whether or not they will allow women to serve as elders, deacons, or ministers. They hold to a high view of scripture as the inspired word of God and believe that salvation to eternal life is only possible through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ to pay for our sins. In keeping with the early Reformers, there is also an emphasis on the importance of the Holy Spirit in believers’ lives, but I wouldn’t describe them as “Pentecostal” or “Charismatic.”

Here are their Expectations of Partnership (current partners: 524 individual church leaders, 101 churches, 5 Classes, 1 Regional Synod, one seminary): To pray for and with each other and listen to the Holy Spirit as we contend for the faith; To participate in a relationship-driven network of friends within the Gospel Alliance for support and accountability; To attend annual Gospel Alliance conferences and other regional gatherings; and To provide meaningful support, care, and accountability for partner churches and leaders in times of need and transition. There isn’t any required cost to being a member of this group, but there are some costs in maintaining this organization so many of the member churches do take an occasional offering to help support it.

I expect that the Gospel Alliance will continue to play a key role in the RCA’s discussions since there are many more churches who are only officially represented by their “individual church leaders”, but whose congregations are supportive of the Alliance. There is also a comparable group within the CRC that is in close communication with the Alliance. Please keep our consistory in your prayers as they continue to discuss and pray about our church’s future and the future of the RCA too.

Usually it happens in the middle of the night sometime and I lie awake and think about either things that are bothering me or things that people I know are dealing with. And I’ve noticed that problems seem bigger and nastier in the middle of the night than they do during the day. Now, I don’t think that I’m alone in this. I think this is true for most of us. The general assumption is that night time is associated with bad things. Like our parents used to say when you were dating – “Be home by midnight because nothing good happens after midnight”. (Now I just wish I could stay awake past 9:30 or 10:00.)

But I am also learning that if I turn my thoughts about the things troubling me from fear to prayer, the Lord will again bring rest and sleep back to me. It’s not a bad thing to be awakened and think about things that concern us, but it’s best to turn them over to the Lord through prayer and let Him give you assurance that He is in control and will be with you through whatever lies ahead. And I don’t mean that to sound flippant. I know there are many serious things that the people of this congregation and beyond are dealing with. But the advice remains the same. God is in charge. He made you. He loves you. He cares for you and nothing you are experiencing can change that.

That’s why the verse above is so exciting. The time is coming when night will be no more. All those bad things that we experience will be gone. No longer will there be anything accursed. The sufferings of this life are temporary, to be followed by an eternity of light and day for the believer. Hallelujah!

So as we go into March we can be reminded of that, as the winter months of dormant life begins to give way to the new life of spring. Remember, talk to the Lord about the things that weigh you down and wake you up at night and let Him bring you peace and assurance just as the sun brings a stronger warmth after a cold stretch of winter.
