

## Daily Prayer for the Lenten Season Morning Session

### Instructions:

Choose a leader who will read the regular print. Also, choose a Scripture reader. Everyone will read the bold print. At the beginning of your gathering, you might discuss and list the prayer concerns that you might have. But be disciplined about how much time you use. You want to pray more than talk about praying. Then take one minute of silence for centering before the Leader begins. Where it says, "*prayers are offered by the people*" everyone is encouraged to enter in and pray what God is prompting you to pray. It doesn't have to be fancy. Your heartfelt prayers are an encouragement to everyone else. When it seems the time is right, close your prayer time with the Lord's Prayer and the prayer that follows.

Leader: Lord, open our lips.

People: **And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.**

**Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.**

The Lord is full of compassion and mercy: Come let us adore him.

Come, let us sing to the Lord;  
let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.  
Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving  
and raise a loud shout to him with psalms.

**For the Lord is a great God,  
and a great King above all gods.  
In his hand are the caverns of the earth,  
and the heights of the hills are his also.  
The sea is his, for he made it,  
and his hands have molded the dry land.**

Come, let us bow down, and bend the knee,  
and kneel before the Lord our Maker.  
**For he is our God,  
and we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand.  
Oh, that today we would hearken to his voice!**

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

*Silence is kept.*

Psalm Reading for the Day: Psalm 119:49-56

Reader: The word of the Lord.

**All: Thanks be to God.**

Seek the Lord while he may be found;  
Call on him while he is near.

Theme verse for the day: Psalm 82:1-4

***\*Prayers are offered by the people.***

Prayer theme for the day: *Pray for the physical and spiritual needs of our community.*

**Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your Name,  
your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
Forgive us our sins  
as we also forgive everyone  
who sins against us.  
And lead us not into temptation
