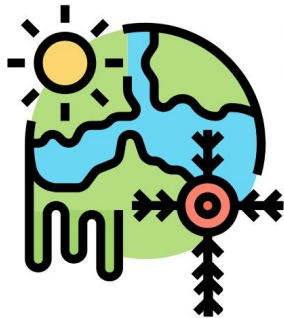

A Year of Remarkable Stewardship

What an incredible year of progress and dedicated stewardship it has been for our church property, thanks to the tireless efforts of our Board of Trustees! In 2025, these devoted individuals worked diligently behind the scenes to enhance our facilities, ensure safety, and plan for a sustainable future.

We are thrilled to share some of their key accomplishments from the past year:

- **Enhanced Welcome & Visibility:** You may have already noticed the brand-new **digital sign installed on our front lawn**, offering a dynamic way to share news and events. Additionally, **updated signage at key locations** across the church property helps visitors and members navigate with ease.
- **Facility Upgrades & Refresh:** Several vital spaces received a fresh look with **repainting in Craven Hall, the Cokesbury Room, Heather's office, and the Food Pantry office**, creating more welcoming environments for all.
- **Safety & Accessibility Improvements:** Prioritizing the well-being of our congregation, the Trustees **replaced the AED in Craven Hall** and made important upgrades to the ladies' room outside the Finance Office, including **replacing toilets and installing grab bars** for improved accessibility and safety.
- **Major Infrastructure & Sustainability:** A significant undertaking this year was the complete **replacement of the Sanctuary roof**, a crucial project for the long-term integrity of our main worship space. In an exciting step towards environmental stewardship, the Trustees also **worked hand-in-hand with the Solar Panel Committee** (Margaret Mitchell, Jennifer Kerrigan, Kim Richmond, and Kelly Greene) **to get solar panels successfully installed on the new Sanctuary roof!**
- **Operational Excellence:** Ensuring the smooth operation of our facilities, the Trustees skillfully **negotiated a contract with a new HVAC vendor**, promising more efficient and reliable climate control for our buildings.



These accomplishments represent countless hours of planning, oversight, and hard work. As a reminder of their vital role, the board of trustees, subject to the direction of the charge conference, are responsible for the supervision, oversight, and care of all real property owned by the local church and of all property and equipment acquired directly by the local church or by any society, board, class, commission, or similar organization connected therewith. We extend our deepest gratitude to all the dedicated Trustees who generously volunteered their time, expertise, and energy in 2025. Their commitment ensures our church remains a safe, welcoming, and vibrant place for worship, fellowship, and ministry for years to come.

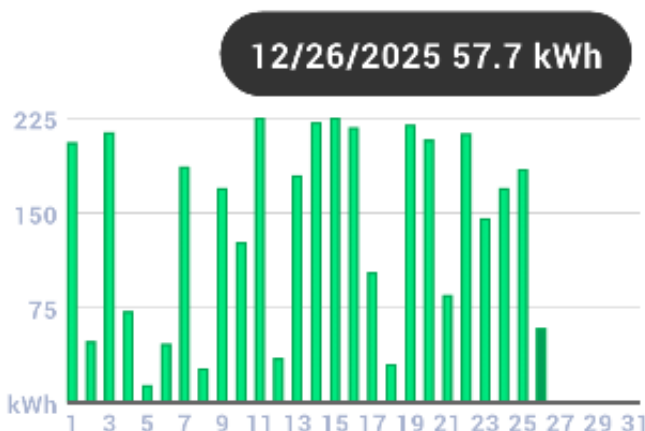

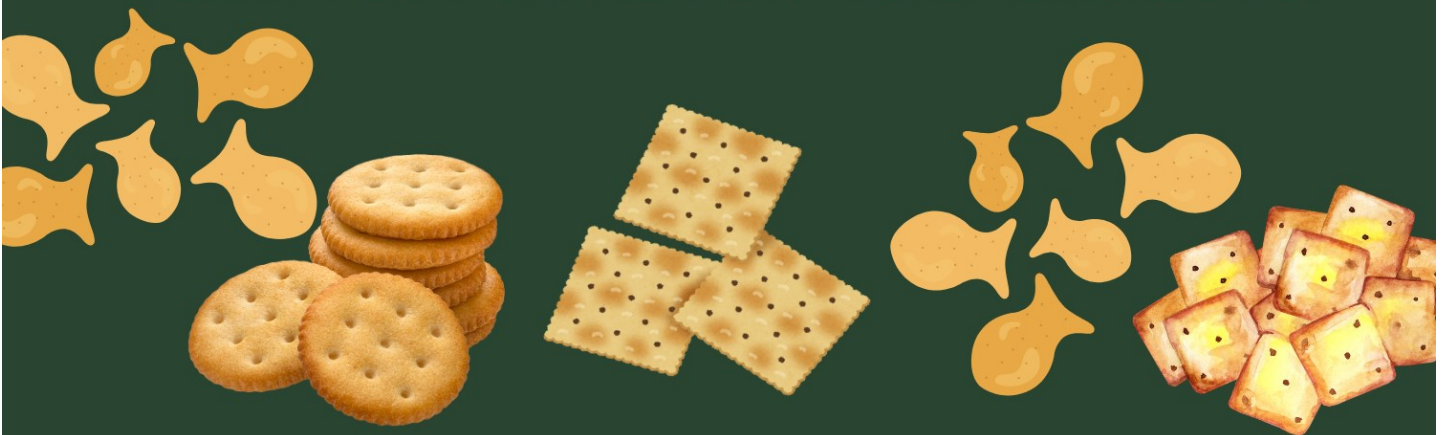

The 2026 dates for the mission trip to Henderson Settlement have been set. We will travel to eastern Kentucky on Sunday, September 27 and return on Friday, October 2. As with all of our previous trips, the Maple Springs team will join other teams of Methodists as we work to make lives better in a very economically depressed rural area. We will offer materials and labor to build, renovate, or clean the homes, decks, ramps, and porches of community members that are unable to do the work themselves because of age, disability, economic challenges, or other hardships.

Members of our team also volunteer to assist in the Settlement's social programs offered to the community, such as the Food Pantry, Thrift Store, and Adult Day Care. All the while we offer hope, friendship, fellowship, and faith to the residents of the area. If those are not enough reasons to go, the team shares two houses with each other for the week and grows to know each other in a way that can't be accomplished in an hour together on Sundays at worship services.

Soon the projects for 2026 will be selected and our team will begin to assemble. Our team is open to everyone.....no special qualification is required except a desire to help others. There is no doubt that the team of 2026 will have many alumni of previous missions because once you go and experience the people, the community, the work, the fellowship, and the gratitude of residents....you are touched....you are humbled....you want to return.



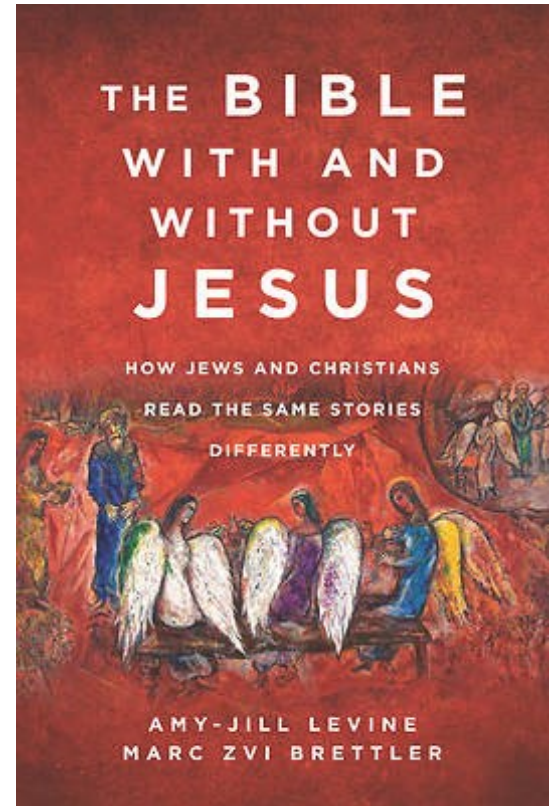


The Tuesday Morning Women's Bible study group has begun Amy-Jill Levine's study, *The Bible With and Without Jesus*.

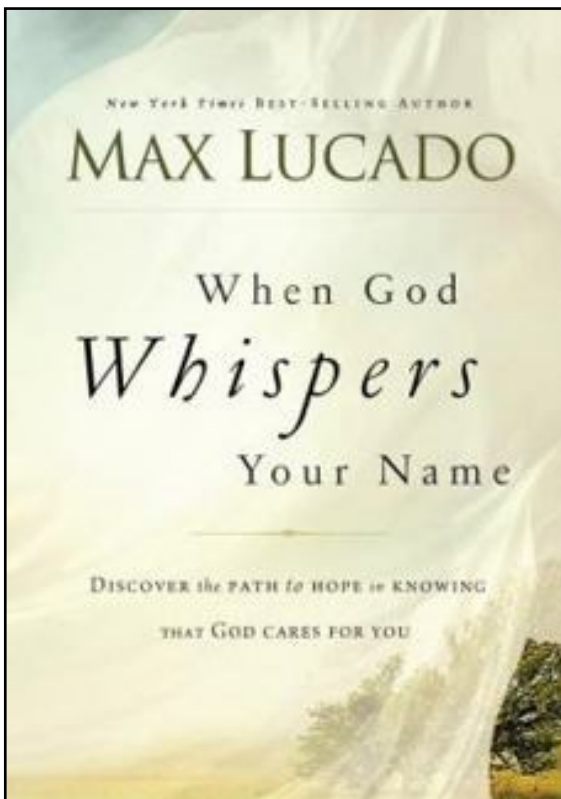
In this video series, Amy-Jill explains how Jews and Christians read the same stories differently.

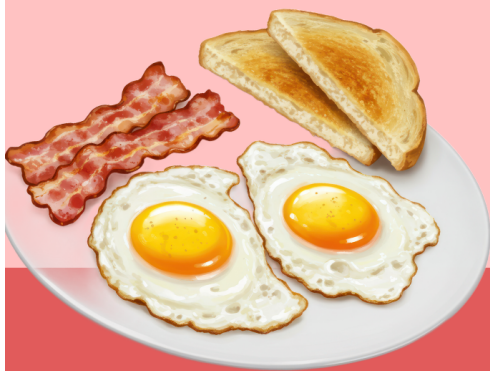

*The calendar gives us a New Year to begin anew.
God, however, gives us grace to begin again —
“morning by morning” — even minute by minute.
With that gift of grace, we renew our resolve to care for Earth and justice.*

John Wesley began a New Year tradition of leading people in renewing their covenant* with God. At the very beginning, God gave us a garden to tend and till. Now is the time to renew your commitment to be good stewards of Earth. **Choose one new thing** you can do throughout the year to care for creation.

Why not eat beef? Wanting this food increases the demand for grazing land and corn cultivation, which increases deforestation (even in the Amazon Rain Forest) and emissions as grain travels to cattle, cattle to slaughter, meat to groceries and restaurants. Reduce those pressures. **Eat less or no beef.**

Stop wearing plastic. Are you surprised? Synthetic fibers from clothing are a significant contribution to microplastic pollution. Go back to nature—wool, cotton, silk, and even bamboo and hemp. Plastic doesn't go away.

Plastic bottles or aluminum cans? Technically, both are recyclable. However, due to multiple factors beyond putting it in the recycling bin, plastic is less likely to be recycled into new products. On the other hand, the systems for recycling aluminum are effective. **Choose aluminum.**



To God's prophet Jeremiah, it seemed nobody was listening as he warned of impending doom from the Babylonians. In the face of climate change, we too may feel ineffective as we speak out for justice. Jeremiah continued: He was faithful to his call from God to speak up, and he bought land as a sign of hope, trusting God that the people would return. **Stay faithful to your call.**

Drilling for gas and oil on previously protected lands is disrupting the habitats and reproductive patterns of the native species. So, in addition to spending valuable resources to provide deadly greenhouse emissions, the policy is also killing wildlife. **Speak up for funding alternative energy sources** and for protecting God's creation.

If you live in an apartment complex, condo, or retirement community, do they have a recycling service? Are they planting trees? Or switching to LED lights? If not, advocate for God's creation. **Gather a Green Team** of residents who care. Educate the other residents, and lobby for change.

Invest in the future, not the past. Your bank account, insurance, or stock portfolio may be supporting the fossil fuel industry. If their practices do not align with your values, change banks, insurance companies, or stockbrokers and tell them why. Reinvest in clean energy and sustainable practices.

Keep in mind these three big threes: 1) Carbon dioxide, methane, and nitrous oxide make up greenhouse gas emissions; 2) emissions, deforestation, and food waste are top contributors to climate change; 3) viewing life through the lens of climate justice (how global warming is affecting people near and far), making changes both large and small, and speaking up to others are keys to addressing the problems.

The cost of solar has dropped dramatically. The environmental and justice costs of fossil fuels have climbed relentlessly. Make this year a renew year to **investigate and install clean energy** at home, church, business, or community buildings.
