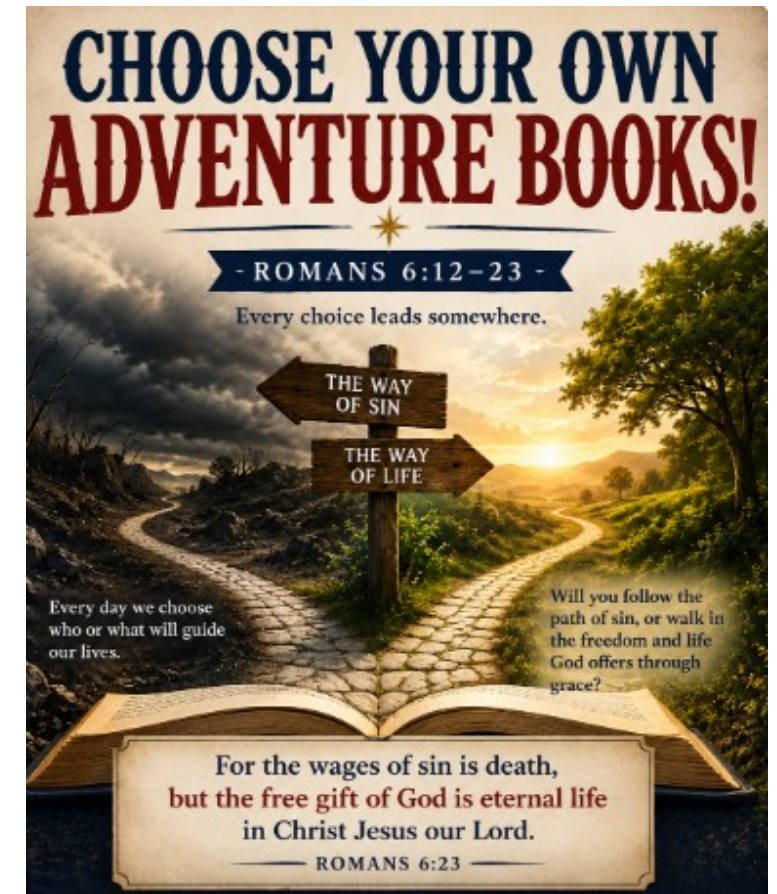

Music Notes

E'en So, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come is a 1953 motet composed by Paul Manz, with lyrics adapted by Ruth Manz from the Book of Revelation. Considered Manz's best-known work, it has been widely performed by many ensembles and choral groups.

Paul and Ruth Manz wrote "E'en So, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come" in 1953 while their three-year-old son was critically ill. Ruth later recalled, "I think we'd reached the point where we felt that time was certainly running out, so we committed it to the Lord and said, 'Lord Jesus, quickly come.'" During that period, she prepared text for Paul based on the Book of Revelation. At his son's bedside, Paul began drafting the composition that would become the piece known today. Their son recovered, which the couple attributed to the power of prayer. The prelude, **Reprise**, reflects motives from the original piece and is written for Ruth.

Saint Columba (521–597) was an Irish Christian saint who evangelized Scotland. The harmonization of the tune is by Ralph Vaughan Williams. This tune is commonly sung to the words of Henry Williams Baker, 'The King of love my shepherd is'. You will hear the tune in the reeds on the swell manual.
