From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Salem & Friends,

There are so many exciting things happening in the upcoming months. I want to start by inviting you to just breathe with me. I like to use Psalm 46:10 for this prayer: "Be still and know that I am God."

Take a deep breath or two and say that line. Then breathe again and drop off a word or two to make a new phrase, like printed above. God's people are a praying people, for this is how we intentionally connect with God and one another in our needs and requests for prayer.

Now to the excitement. We have been blessed by years of musical leadership by Josh Smith and Charles Echols. Now that the time has seemed right for God to lead them elsewhere, we will be discovering what God has in store for us next.



First, the hiring process. The Personnel Committee has reviewed the job descriptions for the Lead Organist, Associate Organist and Sanctuary Choir Director and formed a hiring team: Scott Campbell, Emily Zempel (new member of Personnel) along with myself. We have also invited Lori Potter to join us as an ongoing member of the music staff. The 10:30 Worship Leader will be a position we seek to fill in the summer, after we have an opportunity to experiment in April and May and determine what kind of musical skills we need in that staff person. That hiring team is TBD.

Second, April and May will be a time of transition for music in worship.

- At the 8:30 service, we hope to welcome a new organist team among us.
- At the 10:30 service, we will be experimenting with guest musicians and the praise team to see what kind of feel we might want to shape for next fall. For the summer, we are considering the 10:30 service a New Ideas Worship. If you have any ideas you've seen at other churches or want to try at Salem, please let us know!
 - Local worship musician Allison Orgaard will be here April 7.
 - Rachel Kurtz, a very experienced singer-songwriter and worship leader from the Twin Cities,
 will be with us on April 21, May 5, May 26 and June 2.
 - The other Sundays are yet to be determined, but if you have a local musician you would like to recommend, please send their contact information to one of our worship and music staff, including me.

Third, starting June 9 we will move to a unified worship service for the summer at 9:30am. Soon you will see an invitation to give feedback as to how we might blend our two worship styles together for the summer. Your feedback will be very important for the worship and music ministry at Salem. Please be sure to share your thoughts as soon as possible so that we can plan accordingly our summer musicians' schedule.

Finally, in staffing, we will soon be blessing Deb Anderson on her retirement as our Caring Minister. Deb has been holding off on this retirement through several years of transition, and for that we are thankful! That position description will be reviewed by the Personnel Committee and a new hiring team formed appropriate to that ministry.

Above all, please pray for Salem's wisdom and discernment during these next few months. As we discern and pray that God sends us the right musicians for our worship ministry, we will also be seeking God's wisdom in discerning the Outpost opportunity. See the separate write-up in this newsletter for the latest on the outpost, and stay tuned for more information and the date for a vote by the congregation.

Prayer shapes our community into what God hopes and dreams for us.

Let us pray... "Be still and Know that I am God."

Community Outpost Task Force Update

The Community Outpost Task Force and the Congregational Council have been patiently listening for God's voice, listening to you, and waiting and working with the Greater St. Cloud Public Safety Foundation (PSF).

- The PSF is proposing leasing space from Salem for a Minute Clinic and offices for the mental health team from our police department.
- CentraCare and the College of St. Benedict are considering being a part of it by providing low-level health care for east side community.

The goal for Salem's leadership is to walk together through a time of intentional discernment about these partnership opportunities.



The council dedicated a portion of their retreat in March to brainstorming ideas for discernment, so you may receive an invitation for you or your group to participate in an activity to discern. Previously, you have been encouraged to share your concerns, questions and excitement with one another and with the task force so that they might get solid information on which we might make a decision.

- You have already begun to see answers to the questions submitted at the February 18 Adult Forum in the weekly Friday emails. Keep your eyes open for them!
- In addition the chalkboard continues to be available in the gathering area or Great Hall for public discussion as well.

Please keep in mind that we cannot anticipate every question therefore we cannot provide every answer. We are building a relationship with the PSF, and a key part of this endeavor is a trusting relationship to know that we can problem-solve together.

In the coming weeks you will have additional opportunities to learn more as we pray for God's hopes for us in this opportunity to become clear. This process will culminate in a congregational vote to decide whether or not to partner with the Public Safety Foundation.

The space shared to serve the community would be 3,000 square feet of our education wing, about 10% of our building. The council's goal is to hold that vote on a Sunday in May, but a precise timeline will unfold as we discern together what God has in store for us.
