#### Renewal in a Strange Season - a Devotion

#### **Isaiah 40:31**

but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

#### Greetings to all!

I have chosen this text because I know it is well known to many of you. It has been turned into cards, gifts, and carries hope. A good word in a difficult time.

Isaiah 40, which this text is a small verse of, carries other words including "Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term and her penalty is paid..."

Another, "A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God...'"

Perhaps another way to speak is to imply that key verses we love are often found in the middle of a biblical story. In this case the early verses imply the coming of our God back to the people of God. The penalty has been paid.

The difficult times will give way to a vision of God which is unique, holy, and beautiful. Something I am hopeful for as this season continues.

#### Visioning the LWR School Kit project for such times as these:

Lutheran World Relief needs all things more than ever now. (They even have a new 75,000-face mask challenge.) We are excited to be able to continue the School Kit project. We are visioning this anew to accommodate the safeguards many people have wisely adopted, such as limited and less frequent shopping. One way we are doing this is to order at the very lowest



cost found, many of the supplies in bulk. For those not wanting to shop and still wishing to participate, a monetary donation is very welcome and will be put toward the careful bulk purchasing. If you would like your donation to be used in this way, please clearly designate it for LWR School Kits.

For those of you who still shop and are comfortable doing it, we have set up a table inside near Door A at Salem for items to be dropped off. This will mean less people in the office area and more space for handling supplies. They will be picked up from there about once a week and held for a few days in limbo before being further handled. We will update the graph at Salem every week or two until we have enough of all items for 500 kits.

So far, we have been able to get 500 rulers and enough good-quality pens for 460 kits at very low prices, as well as over 500 scissors. We are also able to buy good erasers and adequate-quality sharpeners very reasonably online. Even the 70-page/ $25\phi$  notebooks have reached the 2000 count needed for 500 school kits thanks to bulk shopping and donations! Amazing.

We will need more backpacks, either sewn or purchased from LWR-suggested online vendors. The LWR website (<a href="www.lwr.org">www.lwr.org</a>) has a list of some vendors that have provided acceptable backpacks. If anyone wants to sew backpacks, please do that by following the LWR pattern on their website or picking up the pattern from the donation table by Door A. If you would rather not put the cords in, we will happily add cords to the bags as they come in.

We, also, need people willing to deliver to the LWR Warehouse in South St. Paul. Boxes of completed kits will be left at Salem possibly in the nursery or near the donation table so they can be easily picked up for those going to the Cities and familiar with the warehouse location. Warehouse procedure for Covid-19 requires that you off-load the boxes onto a trolley yourself without help from employees there. It is always suggested to call the warehouse at 651 457-9009 beforehand to make sure it's open.

We are very grateful for all of you who so faithfully support this project year after year, and for the Salem Foundation that is so generous in its support of the School Kit project and many other efforts! You are truly making it happen. Love and well-being circle the world as we all share with one another. Thank you!

#### Salem Community Meal Funds Redirected to Meet Needs of People Experiencing Homelessness

Right now, many people in our Central Minnesota Community are experiencing homelessness. They may be living in cars, parking ramps, garages, in the woods, under bridges or in the best scenarios sleeping in a hotel-based shelter or on a friend's couch.

Most indoor community meals options have been suspended during Covid19, indoor spaces such as the St Cloud Public Library are closed, public drinking fountains at Lake George were turned off until recently, and health restrictions limit access to the *Shower the People* mobile shower truck.

The Salem Community Meal team is thinking creatively about how to "be church" during this time of unprecedented need.

Since mid-June Salem has partnered with *Homeless Helping Homeless* and *Neighbors to Friends* non-profits and other volunteer organizations to support the <u>frontline</u> needs of people experiencing homelessness.

Seven days a week at 2-3 pm, a take-away meal is distributed near the Lake George Boathouse (meal items are prepackaged and offered from the trunks of volunteers).

Salem has committed to provide the **Saturday** sandwich meal with Community Meal funds (Thank you Pastor Tim for your full support!).

In the past few weeks, Salem volunteers have also provided essential donations such as clean clothing for men, women, and children, toiletries, sleeping bags, backpacks, bug spray, new socks & underwear, etc.

Wendy Shaler has spent hundreds of hours making sleeping mats from plastic grocery bags (fun fact: Wendy just completed her 50<sup>th</sup> mat!). It's incredible the difference sleeping on a soft mat (vs. concrete) can make to a person's ability to function the next day.

As with all things in this strange new time things may (and even most likely) need to change as we progress. I ask for your prayers of support as we meet the challenges of this year. I am looking forward to the day when the musicians and congregation of Salem join together in expressing God's infinite love through music. I pray for strength of spirit and peace of mind as well as for our safety until we gather freely again.

The Salem Foundation consists of the following members: Karen Fuglie, Kevin Johnson, Walt Erickson, Janet Tilstra, Anthony Farag, James Ringwald, April Leeb and Steve Behrenbrinker. The Foundation has investments at Bremer Bank and also has a number of Savings Bonds that become due over time. The Foundation has funded 41 benevolences globally, locally and within Salem in the amount of \$63,700 in 2020. The Foundation has presented scholarships to Salem Youth again this year and published a brochure describing the purpose of the Foundation. This year the Foundation also created an Emergency Grant process for those in need due to the current health crisis. Applications are on the Salem website.

#### **Orongo Widows and Orphans (OWIDOP)**

Through the efforts of Pamm Minden and Audrey Taatjes, the Salem congregation and the Salem Foundation have helped support the Orongo Widows and Orphans (OWIDOP) project in Kenya for about 5 years.

OWIDOP has had a particularly challenging time in the past few months. There were torrential rains in March. Typically the area small rivers and streams flow into Lake Victoria. The rains were so intense that the rivers and streams flooded backwards as Lake Victoria overflowed. Many people in this area live in homes made of packed and dried mud. These homes crumbled and disintegrated in the floods. Orongo Widows and Orphans took in many displaced families. They used our donations to help purchase net that was sewn into bags



which were then planted with vegetables as the gardens were flooded.

OWIDOP is now under a Covid shutdown. Children are not in school until January. They have shelter, but there are no jobs or day labor opportunities. Food is difficult to obtain. The OWIDOP youth (young people no longer attending school) are trying to establish a tiny grocery store with low cost basic foods for their neighbors. Donations are needed to help with the start-up of this small business. If you are interested in making a small donation to help the flooded families or to help with the start-up grocery, please make your donation to Salem Lutheran. Be certain to note on your check that these are funds for ORONGO flood or ORONGO youth. Thank you for your consideration.

#### **Update from Sveholms in Bratislava, Slovakia:**

It's the beginning of August, and we're waiting to hear whether the lyceum where we work will be opened for in-person teaching in September, or whether we will continue teaching online.

We are also waiting for the final word on whether it will be possible for any new U.S. teachers to come to Slovakia through the ELCA's Central Europe Teachers program this year, although it looks increasingly unlikely.

Despite this uncertainty, the situation in Slovakia is good at the moment.

The lockdown here had substantially reduced the daily number of new cases of COVID-19 by the end of April. That statistic remained very low throughout May and June.

European borders started to reopen at the beginning of July. Daily new cases increased then, but have remained relatively steady since, usually around 15-30 (in a country of 5.5 million).

Teaching online was a big adjustment. Starting in March everyone, from the Ministry of Education down to the teachers, had to improvise and adjust to the new situation. Nobody knew what to do or what to expect.

I teach the preparation course for seniors' school-leaving exams, and we had to continue teaching them without knowing what form the exams would take, or if they would happen at all.

In the end the exams were cancelled, but it was a stressful situation for everyone.

This summer has allowed both the government and our school administration more time to make contingency plans, so - whether we are teaching online again in September, or back in the classroom - things will go more smoothly.

We are praying for everyone back in the U.S., and for a speedy resolution to the pandemic.

We are grateful for your prayers and support as well. Thank you!

#### 2020 Mid-year Treasurer's Report

Overall, at mid-year 2020 Salem is doing well considering the current health crisis. Our total income is only down 2.5% from 2019 and our expenses are lower due to not being staffed.

This Spring we transitioned the Finance Clerk from Tammy Sturm to Kris Shovan from Robert Haff and Associates and she has learned our system quickly. Electronic giving by members has a very positive affect on our financial situation. The following is a summary of our current financial status. Thanks to all for your prayers and generosity.

Total 2020 Budget: \$609,600 Total 2019 Budget: \$607,100.00

General Checking Account Fund balance as of January 1, 2020: \$153,024.69

General Checking Account Fund balance as of June 30, 2020: \$275,874.32 (including PPP) Dedicated Checking Account Fund balance as of January 1, 2020: \$97,662.09

Dedicated Checking Account Fund balance as of June 30, 2020: \$198,604.29

#### **Other Assets:**

Bremer Certificate of Deposit: \$25,000; Opened 7-12-2019; Matured: 5-12-2020; \$25,417.81 deposited into Dedicated Account May 12, 2020.

Other Debt: CCE Bulb Project: \$10,331.90; Monthly Payment: \$194.95 Dedicated Account Special Assessments Balance: \$105,560.76; First Payment May 15, 2021 Payroll Protection Plan (PPP): \$57,400 deposited in General Account on May 12, 2020; Balance June 30, 2020: \$13,498.74.

#### Income:

Total 2020 Annual Income: \$292,106.50; Total 2019 Annual Income: \$299,484.73 a 2.5% decrease.

#### **Expenses:**

Total 2020 Annual Expenses: \$190,737.67; Total 2019 Annual Expenses: \$256,737.32 a 25.7% decrease.

#### Other:

We cashed a \$50,000 Bremer CD on March 20, 2020 and also received \$835.62 of accumulated interest. We paid \$32,974.20 of the total special assessment of \$139,534.96 on April 7, 2020 leaving a balance of \$106,560.76 to be paid over 20 years. First year payment is \$11,512.66 due half in May and half in October 2021.



New Salem Welcome Center


