
We're all getting closer to seeing Jesus face to face every day, not just during Lent! Wouldn't it make sense to spend these days getting to know him better?

One benefit of growing closer to Jesus is that when we do, we also grow in our love for others. We learn what unconditional love really is. We learn how he loved us, which is the standard of his "New Commandment," that we "love one another as I have loved you." How can we hope to love our family, neighbors, and friends with the love of God if we aren't awash in that love ourselves?

So—are you drawing closer to Jesus?

Later this month you'll have even more opportunities to do so, as we enter Holy Week on Palm Sunday, March 24. I've always envisioned the Holy Week experience as a chance to time travel. We are there as the crowd welcomes Jesus into Jerusalem. We notice the leaders of the people finally tipping over the edge in their hatred of Jesus, resolving to kill him. We slip in and out of Jerusalem with Jesus and his disciples, adored by the public in the daylight hours, but escaping the traps of the leaders as the sun goes down. We gather with Jesus around his Last Supper on Maundy Thursday evening, being loved by him to the end, witnessing his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, and filled with fear as Judas brings the mob to arrest him. We witness his mock trials, his sentencing, his beatings, and finally his crucifixion on Good Friday. We lay low on Holy Saturday, wondering what will happen, only to be surprised by joy on Easter morning.





The Call Committee has been busy and reached our first big milestone in the call process. We have completed the Florida-Georgia District Congregational Self-Study and sent it to Pastor Bruce Alberts, District Circuit Visitor for his signature and forwarding to Rev. James H. Rockey, District President. We expect to receive a list of Pastors in the coming weeks to vet for our congregation consideration. The Congregational Self-Study was completed using information gathered during our Cottage Meetings and the congregation ranking of Pastoral Characteristics.

In preparation for an initial group of Pastors for consideration a first-round list of questions has been developed for written responses. With a narrowed group of Pastors selected from their written responses, a conference call will be scheduled using a second group of questions to further narrow to the final list for call consideration. Once we are at this point in the call process a section of a worship service will be designated to seek the Holy Spirit's guidance for a call recommendation.

During the time until we receive the LCMS District's response with a list of candidates, the Call Committee will be assembling all the materials required to go into issuing a Pastor Call. We will also be planning for the Voter's Assembly to make our final selection.
