- **2.** Grandma's Attic had numerous people help bring many, many items upstairs to set up in all four classrooms upstairs!! (A HUGE thank you to four of Grandma's helpers, who moved EVERYTHING for Grandma's Attic into place in ONE day!)
- **3.** We've sold soup many times at the show. This year, we sold Chicken Corn Noodle, Vegetable Beef, Butternut Squash, Ham and Bean, Mild Chili, Split Pea, and this year, Barbeque! The big news is that we completely sold out of soup and barbeque!
- **4.** We also sold out of hoagies!
- **5.** Baked Goods: When the show started, we had two, eight-foot tables filled with baked goods AND you guessed it, we sold out of them!!
- **6.** Basket raffle: This year, we had **17** baskets, we've NEVER had 17 baskets! There were so many baskets, furniture in the library/lounge was moved OUT of the room to put more tables in for basket displays! They were beautiful!!!

Thrivent helped by giving us financial help to get hoagies! Endowment granted us money for new numbers for the signs, and for advertising. Area businesses, like Dairy Queen, Glocker and Company, AD Moyer Lumber, and the Gilbertsville Fire Company, helped by advertising our show on their electronic signs!!

Evangelism Committee gave us cards with the picture of St. Luke on one side, and a welcome message and invitation to Christmas services on the other to hand out. Numerous people took the cards, said how nice the church is, which in turn started discussions of relatives who attended St. Luke, where people live in relation to St. Luke. One lady came to St. Luke to pick up the basket she was thrilled to have one and said she might come to worship with us!!

Thank you to all who helped with the show, setting up, taking down, helping with Grandma's Attic, Basket Raffle, Kitchen Crew, Baked Goods, and Clean Up, and those who quickly signed out signs to put in their yards to help advertise the show!! 
