# A trip down Memory Lane to the Bells of St. Luke

It's not unusual for me to go to the St. Luke Pavilion occasionally, and sit and look at the cement pieces, leading out of the pavilion towards Wilson Ave. Those steps were traveled often when members of the J. Russell Sr., and Helen (Weikel) Geiger family would walk from the garage and/or chicken house out towards the house which sat along Wilson Avenue. However, there were numerous times when visiting Gram and Pappap we were awakened by Pap-pap on a Sunday morning, hearing him say, "C'mon... get up...time to go tell the neighbors it's time to get up, and get to church." So...we would walk across Wilson Ave., into the "old" St. Luke building, go up into the balcony, and into the belfry, where we would take turns ringing the big old bell that was in there.

The grandchildren have memories of that...as well as how important it is to invite people to go to church, no matter where they went. As for Gram and Pap-pap, many times they went to St. Luke, but often, they went to the church where they were members, Trinity UCC in Pottstown. Many of the grandchildren were baptized there! Gram made communion bread for both congregations, and many never knew which church they were members at. The bell left many of us with wonderful memories.

and property to St. Luke, they saved the profits, and after Pap-pap and Gram died, the family used those profits and purchased a Schulmerich Magne Bell 2 Carillon.

Meanwhile, handbells made their debut at St. Luke. A woman, though not a member of

St. Luke, purchased the first two octaves of Schulmerich Handbells for St. Luke, in honor of her boyfriend.

The handbells and carillon were used often and joyfully!! A third octave of handbells was purchased with funds given in memory of Harry Tim (father of Valerie Schlegel), after he passed in 2002. Something new, choir chimes, were purchased with funds given in memory of Marie Tim (Valerie's mother) when she passed in 2006.

The first director of the Handbell Choir was the late Mrs. Laura Boughter. When the Boughter family left St. Luke to go to St. Timothy's, Aston, Valerie Schlegel became the director, and continues to this day.

The Magne Bell 2 Carillon worked well....but, over time, since it's purchase in the late 70's, until the early 2000s, it started showing signs of it's age. The tapes, which supplied the music, could no longer be purchased. Service calls were rarely available, and the carillon itself was no longer being produced.

When Roy and Marie Geiger passed (2022 and 2024 respectively), monies were contributed in their memories to the Memorial Fund for the purchase of aetting a new carillon for St. Luke. Also, when long time St. Luke member, the late Betty Shenk passed (2023), monies were contributed in When the Geiger Family sold the house her memory to the Memorial Fund. It soon became time for the handbells to be refurbished. Monies given in Betty's memory were used for refurbishment of the handbells, with the remaining funds from her account, along with money contributed from friends, family, and relatives in memory of Roy and

Marie Geiger, to purchase a new Schulmerich, g5 Classic Carillon Series 1. The carillon arrived at St. Luke on July 16, 2025, and the handbells went to Sellersville to be refurbished in August of 2025.

Schulmerich Carillons is now a division of the Verdin Company, in Cincinnati, Ohio.

To think that both the carillon and handbells originally came from those who were not members is amazing. To this day, St. Luke is blessed with many who support wonderful ministries of St. Luke Lutheran Church. The next time you go into the pavilion at St. Luke....look torward, to Wilson Avenue....and the "old" St. Luke Building....the trip "down Memory Lane" will lead you to "The Bells of St. Luke."

With many memories, and many thanks to God, from whom all blessings flow.
