



SCRIPTURE READING - PROVERBS 3:1-12

My son, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments, ² for length of days and years of life and peace they will add to you. ³ Let not steadfast love and faithfulness forsake you; bind them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart. ⁴ So you will find favor and good success in the sight of God and man. ⁵ Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. ⁷ Be not wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord, and turn away from evil. ⁸ It will be healing to your flesh and refreshment to your bones. ⁹ Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce; ¹⁰ then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine. ¹¹ My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline or be weary of his reproof, ¹² for the Lord reproves him whom he loves, as a father the son in whom he delights.

This Week in Church History

1 February 1933

German Lutheran clergyman Dietrich Bonhoeffer gives a radio speech warning about the consequences of putting blind trust in any man (i.e. Hitler). His address is abruptly cut off at the warning.

2 February 1738

Young George Whitefield departs for Georgia, intending to become a permanent missionary to the American colony.

3 February 1469

Death in Mainz, Germany, of Johannes Gutenberg, a developer of movable type, which will become a powerful factor in the spread of the Protestant Reformation.

4 February 1555

English reformer John Rogers is burned at the stake at Smithfield, the first of many martyrs in the reign of Mary Tudor.

5 February 1864

Fanny Crosby writes her first verses for composer William Bradbury, "A Home Beyond the Tide," the beginning of a long and fruitful hymn writing relationship.

6 February 1564

John Calvin preaches his last sermon. His mouth fills with blood and he has to leave the pulpit. He had been carried to church in a chair. Three months later he will die.

7 February 1649

The British Parliament ratifies the Westminster Confession which had been accepted by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland the previous August.

Question 12. *Since then, by the righteous judgment of God, we deserve temporal and eternal punishment, what is required that we may escape this punishment and be again received into favour?*

Answer: God wills that His justice be satisfied;^a therefore must we make full satisfaction to the same, either by ourselves or by another.^b

- a. Exodus 20:5.
- b. Deuteronomy 24:16; Romans 8:3; 2 Corinthians 5:14-15.

Question 13. *Can we ourselves make this satisfaction?*

Answer: By no means:^a on the contrary, we daily increase our guilt.^b

- a. Job 9:2-3; Job 15:14-16.
- b. Matthew 6:12; Isaiah 64:6.

Question 14. *Can any mere creature make satisfaction for us?*

Answer: None: for first, God will not punish, in any other creature, that of which man has made himself guilty;^a and further, no mere creature can sustain the burden of God's eternal wrath against sin, and redeem others therefrom.^b

Question 15. *What manner of mediator and redeemer then must we seek?*

Answer: One who is a true and sinless man,^a and yet more powerful than all creatures, that is, one who is at the same time true God.^b

- b. Romans 9:5; Isaiah 7:14.

Lead Me in Your Righteousness

To the choirmaster: for the flutes. A Psalm of David.

Give ear to my words, O Lord; consider my groaning.

² Give attention to the sound of my cry, my King and my God,
for to you do I pray.

³ O Lord, in the morning you hear my voice;
in the morning I prepare a sacrifice for you and watch.

⁴ For you are not a God who delights in wickedness;
evil may not dwell with you.

⁵ The boastful shall not stand before your eyes; you hate all evildoers.

⁶ You destroy those who speak lies;
the Lord abhors the bloodthirsty and deceitful man.

⁷ But I, through the abundance of your steadfast love, will enter your
house. I will bow down toward your holy temple in the fear of you.

⁸ Lead me, O Lord, in your righteousness because of my enemies;
make your way straight before me.

⁹ For there is no truth in their mouth; their inmost self is destruction;
their throat is an open grave; they flatter with their tongue.

¹⁰ Make them bear their guilt, O God; let them fall by their own counsels;
because of the abundance of their transgressions cast them out,
for they have rebelled against you.

¹¹ But let all who take refuge in you rejoice; let them ever sing for joy,
and spread your protection over them,
that those who love your name may exult in you.

¹² For you bless the righteous, O Lord; you cover him with favor as with a
shield.
