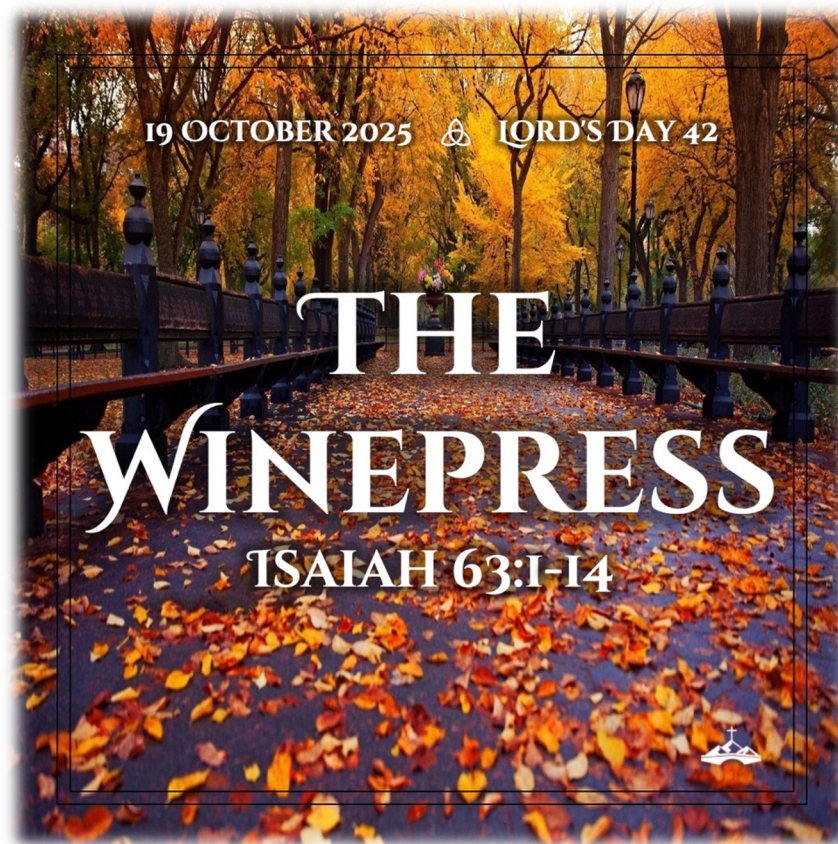

THE FIVE SOLAS OF THE REFORMATION - 1517

SOLUS CHRISTUS

“Whoever is not satisfied with Christ alone strives after something beyond absolute perfection.”
-John Calvin

The doctrine of solus Christus - **Christ alone** - holds that salvation is by the atoning work of Christ alone and that Christ is the only mediator between man and God. Without a faith based in Christ and Christ alone, there can be no salvation.

Christ is central to the Reformed faith; without Him we can do nothing and with Him we can do all things. He alone serves as our prophet, priest, and king, in whom we must place all of our hope.

Verse 9 makes this marvelous statement: “In all their affliction he was afflicted.” How tender is the union between Christ and His church! When the Lord’s people suffer, His compassion is deeply stirred too, “For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin” (Heb. 4:15). Not only is the Lord able to sympathize, but He is able to help us in the time of anxiety and needs. We can cast our care upon Him because He cares. We never suffer alone, for the Lord is always with us in our afflictions.

How can we find comfort and strength in this truth when we are suffering?

Today in Christian History

1562

Birth of George Abbot, archbishop of Canterbury. A recognized leader of the English Calvinists, Abbot also demonstrated Puritan sympathies, and took a leading part in translating the 1611 King James Version of the Bible.

1609

Death of Jacob Arminius, 49, the Dutch theologian who lent his name to the beliefs (known today at Arminianism) which oppose the major tenets of Protestant Reformed (Calvinist) theology.

1720

Birth of John Woolman, American Quaker reformer. His “Journal,” written from 1756-72, greatly influenced 19th century abolitionists.

1744

English revivalist George Whitefield, 29, arrived in Maine at the start of his second visit to America. Whitefield struggled to adapt the beliefs of Calvinism to the Arminian teachings of proto-Methodists John and Charles Wesley.

1856

Charles Spurgeon preaches to an overflow crowd. Someone falsely yells, “fire” and seven people are trampled to death in the ensuing melee. He nearly goes insane from the horror of it.

Isaiah 63:1-14 ^{ESV}

^{63:1} Who is this who comes from Edom, in crimsoned garments from Bozrah, he who is splendid in his apparel, marching in the greatness of his strength? “It is I, speaking in righteousness, mighty to save.”

² Why is your apparel red, and your garments like his who treads in the winepress?

³ “I have trodden the winepress alone, and from the peoples no one was with me; I trod them in my anger and trampled them in my wrath; their lifeblood spattered on my garments, and stained all my apparel.

⁴ For the day of vengeance was in my heart, and my year of redemption had come.

⁵ I looked, but there was no one to help; I was appalled, but there was no one to uphold; so my own arm brought me salvation, and my wrath upheld me.

⁶ I trampled down the peoples in my anger; I made them drunk in my wrath, and I poured out their lifeblood on the earth.”

⁷ I will recount the steadfast love of the Lord, the praises of the Lord, according to all that the Lord has granted us, and the great goodness to the house of Israel that he has granted them according to his compassion, according to the abundance of his steadfast love.

⁸ For he said, “Surely they are my people, children who will not deal falsely.” And he became their Savior.

⁹ In all their affliction he was afflicted, and the angel of his presence saved them; in his love and in his pity he redeemed them; he lifted them up and carried them all the days of old.

¹⁰ But they rebelled and grieved his Holy Spirit; therefore he turned to be their enemy, and himself fought against them.

¹¹ Then he remembered the days of old, of Moses and his people. Where is he who brought them up out of the sea with the shepherds of his flock? Where is he who put in the midst of them his Holy Spirit,

¹² who caused his glorious arm to go at the right hand of Moses, who divided the waters before them to make for himself an everlasting name,

¹³ who led them through the depths? Like a horse in the desert, they did not stumble.

¹⁴ Like livestock that go down into the valley, the Spirit of the Lord gave them rest. So you led your people, to make for yourself a glorious name.
