Dear Christian Friends:

Greetings!

Holy Week is on the horizon, and this year we are hosting the Maundy Thursday Service (March 28) at 7:00 PM at Centennial with Pastor Kris Peterson preaching at the service. Then March 29th at 7:00 St Peter's in Chester Springs will be hosting Good Friday with me preaching at that service. On Easter Saturday, March 30th St John's in Phoenixville will be hosting the Easter Vigil at 7:30 PM. Each congregation of our newly formed Muhlenberg Parish will celebrate Resurrection Sunday. Our Easter Service will be held at the normal 9:30 hour.

I am so very pleased with our Sunday Lenten Movie Ministry. People are enjoying the movies and there is some very good discussion and folks are seeing God at work in the movie. I truly believe our modern day movie is very much like the parables Jesus told to help people see God's Kingdom at work. I am hoping as we get comfortable with noticing God moments in a Hollywood film that it will be pretty easy for us to open our eyes and see similar God moments in our day to day activities. I am hoping that you will be able to tell a friend that when I went to the Giant the other day – such and such happened – and that is when I noticed the comforting presence of God.

As we move into Holy Week at the end of the month, we are confronted by questions of law, grace, and mercy. We will be asked to consider what it is it like to have God's law written on our hearts? I am hoping that by the time of Holy week that you will all be excellent "God detectors" and that you will be able to identify God as close and as steady as your heartbeat? The prophet Jeremiah promises an experience of being in tune with God and that our hearts will beat in synch with God's.

Jeremiah and the Psalmist speak of a transformed and purified heart. A new heart is a gift of grace. God initiates this new covenant. But is God the only actor here? Is God's action entirely unilateral, or do we have a role in our alignment with God's vision? Surely, God can do a new thing in accordance with God's choice, and God can choose to be more active in some places than others. God can address us in lively and energetic ways. May our Lenten prayer be that God will open the eyes of our heart to see Him at work.

Psalm 51 is a prayer for God's mercy. Lost in sin, the Psalmist asks God to take the initiative in forgiveness and transformation. The Psalmist experiences God as "wholly other," as the moral law which judges humankind and the Psalmist in particular. The Psalmist has crossed a line. He needs God's mercy and the forgiveness of his sin. In this divine-human encounter, the Psalmist feels remorseful and he repents of his sin. In fact, he feels empty and alone. He goes so far as to say that he was created in sin and that his only hope is to throw himself on God's mercy.

In his brokenness, the Psalmist asks God to create in him a new heart and give him a new spirit. He prays for a restoration of wholeness. And God restores – because God is love!

May God bless all of us as we live into this Holy remembrance of God's Holy love and Forgiveness of our sins.

The Amen Effect: Ancient Wisdom to Mend Our Broken Hearts and World. By Rabbi Sharon Brous

A National bestseller

With original insights and practical tools, The Amen Effect translates foundational ideas into simple practices that connect us to our better angels, offering a blueprint for a more meaningful life and a more connected and caring world.

BIBLE STUDY

The Bible Study Group has enjoyed studying 1 and 2 Corinthians this past fall and winter.

On April 2nd at 1:30 we will begin a Bible Study of selected Psalms. Psalms is the Jewish prayer book and hymnal. In fact when Jesus sang a hymn in his worship, he would have sung one of the 150 choices from the psalter. There are 150 Psalms – many of the psalms are attributed to King David.

The book of Psalms was written over a period of one thousand years.

<u>Psalm 90</u>, a psalm of Moses, was probably the earliest psalm, written around 1500 BC. It is difficult to know when the last psalm was composed, but Psalm 126, which begins, "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream," probably refers to Israel's return from exile in 537 BC.

Approximately 40 percent of the psalms are laments.

Out of the 150 psalms, fifty-nine are laments, songs composed in a spiritual and theological minor key. There are psalms of unqualified joy and delight, such as Psalm 47. But why so many laments? The life of faith, personal and corporate, is lived in a fallen world and opposed by the flesh, the world, and the devil. Jesus told His disciples, "In the world you will have tribulation" (John 16:33). The Psalms give heart expression to the struggles, sorrows, weariness, perplexities, and failures that are the daily experience of every believer.

Pastor will take suggestions to study your favorite Psalm.



Closing shelter * Setting up breakfast * Overseeing needs of residents Light housekeeping * Answering phones


Compensation includes room, food, laundry facilities, and all utilities (including internet and cable) and a bi-weekly stipend of \$500.

The overnight house manager can sleep after closing/securing the shelter (11PM - 6AM). This shift is considered "on call" should there be an issue overnight. The House Manager is to be available by 6:30 to set up breakfast, oversee the needs of residents, perform light housekeeping, and answer phones until 9AM.

Holiday and additional hours might also be available.
