

Our Missions Prayer Focus This Week...

Jon and Kristy Nykamp- minister in Mekelle, Ethiopia. Their November prayer letter states, "Just a quick note to ask you to pray for the escalating situation in Ethiopia. This week marks the one-year anniversary of the fighting. Things are now changing rapidly here, with a State of Emergency in effect since Tuesday, and so we are watching carefully and waiting to see what will happen next. The bulk of the fighting is now in the Amhara region (still a couple hundred miles north of Addis Ababa, the capital), but is expected to continue moving south. While Addis is still safe for us now, that could change and SIM is putting us all on alert and preparing us for a possible evacuation if certain things begin to happen.

We are especially hoping and praying for an end to hostilities soon so that all the people around the country who are currently without food, shelter, medicines, etc. can get what they need! The latest UN report states that 5.2 million people need emergency food assistance in Tigray, including over 1.4 million children, pregnant and lactating women.

We are also hoping and praying for some kind of peaceful resolution, although that is harder for us to imagine right now. But we do know that God is here and working, even though it is not always easy for us to see or understand.

We will try to get you a fuller update soon (assuming the internet doesn't get cut), but we wanted to get this out while the internet was still cooperating. We appreciate your prayers so much!"
