Scripture Passage: ... For whatever does not proceed from faith is sin.—Romans 14:23b

Lesson Theme: God is faithful.

Family Discussion Questions:

- 1) How did Zechariah respond to God's promise?
- 2) How can you tell if you are not believing God's promises?
- 3) If God is so faithful and loving, why do we fail to trust His promises sometimes?

Date: July 8, 2018 (37)

Scripture Passage: "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. 11Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. —Ephesians 6:10-11

Lesson Theme: We are all in a spiritual battle.

Family Discussion Questions:

- 1) We are all in a battle. What is that battle?
- 2) Is it a real battle?
- 3) What does it mean to "fight"?

Date: July 15, 2018 (38)

Scripture Passage: Every word of God proves true; he is a shield to those who take refuge in him. —Proverbs 30:5

Lesson Theme: God will protect His reputation as a Promise-Keeper.

Family Discussion Questions:

- 1) What were Joshua and Caleb believing?
- 2) What were the other 10 spies believing?
- 3) How did what they believed affect how they acted? What was the consequence of unbelief?

Date: July 22, 2018 (39)

Scripture Passage So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.—Romans 10:17

Lesson Theme: Faith is a gift from God.

Family Discussion Questions:

- 1) Read Luke 5:1-7. Do you think Simon, James, and John felt like fishing again? Why did they?
- 2) What was the result of their obedience?
- 3) How does our obedience to God make our faith grow?



Date: July 29, 2018 (40)

Scripture Passage: *In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. —John 14:2-3*

Lesson Theme: Christians are aliens and exiles in this world; heaven is their real home.

Family Discussion Questions:

- 1) The Bible calls Christians “strangers” and “exiles” on earth. What does this mean?
- 2) What does it mean for a Christian to just be passing by here on earth?
- 3) In what ways will Christians be different from others?
