





Estalita was born on December 10, 1937 in Red Rock, OK, to James "Buck" and Bernice Batt. In 1957, she graduated from Ponca City High School and married her high school sweetheart, Harrel Dean Ashby. They were blessed with two daughters, Terrill and Julie.

Estalita was a loving wife, caring mother and exceptional grandmother. She loved taking care of her family and always made sure they knew how much they meant to her. Estalita and her family were long-time members at Edmond Church of Christ. As her health declined she was unable to attend but kept a close relationship with her Heavenly Father.

In the early 1970's, she founded "Star Modeling Agency" in Lawton, OK. She modeled in print and commercials for several stores and enjoyed meeting new people. She and Dean were active in the Edmond chapter of the Jaycees and YMCA. Her most important role was as homeroom mother and Bluebirds leader for her girls as they grew up.

Later in life, Estalita was blessed with three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. She was a wonderful grandmother and did something unique to make special memories with each of them. Estalita was known to be an excellent cook. She could whip up a gourmet meal for eight on a moment's notice for family and friends who were always welcome at her table.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband Harrel Dean Ashby; and brothers Terry Batt and Jimmy Batt. She is survived by her daughters Julie Easterly and Terrill Province; three grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; sisters Linda Ward and Sharon Dawes; and a host of nieces and nephews whom she treasured.

Estalita will always be remembered for her innate charisma, vivacious spirit, love for family, and zest for life. This legacy will live on in the memories of her loving family.

James Thomas Cail

1938-2025

“You never know when Jesus is comin’ back, so eat the dessert first!”

Dr. James Thomas Cail II was born in 1938 in Walters, OK, to Elmer Roy and Ila Marie Cail. He spent his last days surrounded by family who loved and admired him. He was the oldest of five (Bobby, Betty, Bo, and Don) and is preceded in death by his parents and brother Bobby Roy. He is survived by his wife of 60 years, Judith Ann (Zirkle), as well as their children Dr. James Thomas (Trey) Cail III, Dr. Mindy Cail, Dr. Elizabeth McElroy, their beloved grandchildren, extended family, and many wonderful friends.

He was a lifelong lover of education—a passion that was clearly contagious—notching his first major success as the fourth-grade spelling champion of Waurika grade school. At Purcell High School he went to Boys State, was a leader in band and speech, an award winner in debate, sang in an award-winning quartet (one of the first to be racially integrated), and had the special distinction of being the slowest player on the football team. Yet, despite missing about half his senior year due to extracurricular activities, he attained the rank of Valedictorian for the class of 1956.

James was the first in his family to attend college, spending his first two years at Central Christian College in Bartlesville and then finishing at Abilene Christian College. He paid his way through school by driving the bus and, to our great benefit, working as a fry cook at the Dixie Pig. His talent for cooking favorites like burgers, biscuits, pancakes, and pies served to nourish many a hungry guest’s body and soul, underpinning his exceptional gift for hospitality throughout his days.

After college, James served several years as a preacher at Itasca, TX. Although he decided full-time preaching was not for him, his time with that colorful cast of characters taught him much and expanded his trove of delightful, homespun stories. He found his professional home at Oklahoma Christian College, starting as the Director of Admissions. OCC was good to James; not least that this is where he met his sweetheart Judy. He ‘set his cap’ for her, ‘marrying up’ on June 4, 1965. In 1969, OCC sent the couple to Waco so James could wrestle a Doctorate away

from Baylor University. James returned to OCC in 1971 as a Professor of Psychology, a position he held until his retirement in 2003. At Oklahoma Christian University, the auditorium where he held court and nurtured countless young minds now lovingly bears his name.

James just couldn't stay away from service to the church. While a doctoral student in Waco, he 'backslied' into preaching and teaching, this time at the Bynum and Columbus Avenue Churches of Christ. While teaching full-time, James did double duty by ministering at the Village, then Quail Springs Church of Christ. There he held the various positions of Associate Minister, Counseling Minister, church bond salesman (great cooking aids salesmen well), and song leader.

He was a man of faith as well as science, with a particular passion for behaviorism. As a wise counselor to many, he harnessed psychological principles to empower others through scientifically proven methods. We hold countless quotes in our hearts dearly from people who report that he saved their hope, their marriages, their parent-child relationships, their very lives. He was an early advocate of approaching parenting through straightforward, effective techniques rather than seeing children as problems that need to be beaten into submission. His counseling was delivered with his characteristic folksy charm, relatable stories, and a healthy dose of humor—also making James a popular choice for after-dinner speeches and marriage and family seminars (all of which he called 'dog and pony shows').

Somehow, miraculously, he found time for these callings in between golf games. He loved all things British, participated (rather poorly) in Scottish country dancing, grew roses and tomatoes, and became a renowned baker of ugly-crust pies. He loved hunting for treasures such as pocketknives, arrowheads, antiques, and most notably, a staggeringly large collection of Blue Willow dishes.

Bonus fun facts: He earned several hole-in-one trophies and played in a pro-am golf tournament, even besting the pro he was paired with. His childhood nickname was Beefsteak. His pies once sold for \$1000 each at an OC fundraiser. He really loved the OU Sooners, and he really hated the prevent defense. He was a champion at mumblety-peg... and if you know what that is, you probably shouldn't tell your kids about it.

James, Dad, Pappy—We love you more than goldfish. Thanks for comin' to see us.
