On Sunday, October 19, we had a small electrical fire in one of our HVAC units upstairs during Bible class. Thanks to our Safety Team and Edmond firefighters, the situation was quickly addressed and contained. We deeply appreciate everyone's quick response and cooperative spirit as we took the precaution of briefly evacuating the main church building.

As we reflect on that event—and potential similar events in the future—we see a need for greater communication. Having a central voice and channel of communication to inform the congregation in times of crisis or emergency would be helpful.

To that end, during future emergencies or crisis situations, we plan to send out a text blast to all members containing pertinent and timely information. Examples of messages might include evacuation instructions, information on re-entering the building after evacuation, weather alerts, emergency situations, etc.

To receive these text messages, you will need to log on to your CCB profile and sign up to receive text messages from group leaders in the "MEMBERS" group. Text messages to this group will be reserved for emergency situations; you will not receive news, promotions, general information, or other enlistment notifications.

Here are detailed instructions to opt in:

- 1 Log on to your CCB profile with your photo at the top left.
- 2 At the top, under your name, click on the "Actions" down arrow to open the menu.
- 3 Click on "Communication Preferences."
- 4 On the far-right column of the next screen you will see Text settings labeled "Send me text messages from group leaders."
- 5 Input your phone carrier and phone number (with area code).
- 6 Check the groups you want to receive text messages from, including the "MEMBERS" group where all emergency messages will be sent.
- 7 Scroll to the bottom and click "Save Settings."

Whiz Kids helps children read better and get to know Jesus



Edmond church seeks volunteer mentors and substitutes for the after-school Thursday tutoring program.

Whiz Kids, a faith-based after-school program, is coming soon to the Edmond Church of Christ.

The congregation has an opportunity to help children at neighboring Will Rogers Elementary School improve reading scores and — here's the best part — get to know Jesus.

"Yes, this is a tutoring program," children's minister Brenda Gordon said of Whiz Kids. "But really, it's an outreach. What's most important is building relationships with the children."

For a variety of reasons, children from low-income homes often struggle with schoolwork. Will Rogers is designated as a federal Title 1 school because at least 40 percent of students qualify for free or reduced-price lunches.

Whiz Kids of Oklahoma has helped improve reading scores at more than two dozen elementary schools in the Crutcho, Mid-Del, Millwood, Moore, Oklahoma City, Putnam City and Western Heights districts.

Now the program — featuring one-on-one tutoring with children reading below grade level — is expanding to Edmond. And our own congregation is leading the way.

Whiz Kids will launch in January and run from 4 to 6 p.m. each Thursday.

"At the start of every session, there's a meal time," youth minister Sam Day said. "Then there's a Bible time where there's an interactive Bible lesson for kids. And then there's dedicated literacy time."

During the literacy time, volunteers — from college students to retirees — will offer one-on-one tutoring and mentoring.

"You don't have to have a ton of educational background or anything



like that," Day said. "It's just a time to read with kids and help them read and work through sight words."

Day, Gordon and children's minister Laura Williamson hope to recruit at least 20 Edmond members willing to devote two hours to the program each week.

"They won't have to do any prep work," Williamson said of the volunteers. "We'll have everything for them. They'll realize just how fun it is to come and work with the kids one on one and get to know them."

Edmond member Kim Cady is helping recruit substitute tutors — with a goal of at least 10 — who can fill in when a regular mentor must miss.

Other volunteers will work with meal preparation, led by Edmond member Jane Replogle.

Another Edmond member, Emily Wood, is a Title 1 reading tutor at Will Rogers Elementary. She'll serve as the school's teacher liaison for Whiz Kids. She'll help recruit students and contact their parents to tell them about the free program available at the church. She'll also track students' reading scores and success with the program.

"It's been very Spirit-led," Wood said of the process leading to Whiz Kids' launch at Will Rogers. "I feel like it's God's work, and I'm just humbled and honored to be a part of it."

The children's and youth ministers leading Edmond's Whiz Kids all have

backgrounds in education. Day majored in education at Oklahoma Christian University. Gordon and Williamson both taught in public schools before going to work full time for the church.

In fact, Williamson finished a two-year program in the science of reading before joining the church staff this summer.

"I'm really excited about this program just because it will allow me to continue with the passion I have for helping kids to read," Williamson said. "One of the things I have to remember is that the goal of this is to show the kids God's love."

The reading part is important, but the organizers have a higher goal.

"This is just an opportunity for Edmond to reach out to the people directly around us," Day said, "to be a light to our community without expecting anything in return."

The church has already developed relationships with Will Rogers Elementary, including providing a meal for staff members before school starts each year and helping with various needs for low-income children — be it underwear and socks or Christmas gifts.

Whiz Kids aims to take that neighborhood connection to a new level.

The message Day wants to convey to the children's parents is simple: "We love your kids, and Jesus loves your kids."


