This year we focused on sharing the stories of individuals and families, your neighbors and friends, who have used the health department services. In 2022, listening sessions were held as part of our Community Health Assessment (CHA). The CHA is a compilation of data that describes the health of our Fulton County Community. During the listening sessions, we heard from residents who shared their health priorities, challenges and ideas for improvement. One participant stated, "Unless you know the resources exist, they might as well not exist." We hope this report informs each of you about your Fulton County Health Department (FCHD) and the resources available.

In November, voters approved your FCHD public health levy. It is with sincere appreciation that we thank you for your continued support and recommit our efforts to use these funds to fulfill our mission for "Healthy residents, safe environment and better quality of life."

The health department receives an estimated 205 phone calls per week. These calls are answered live, in person, by our clerical staff. Callers are connected to divisions within the health department or redirected to additional supporting resources as needed.





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COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES (CHS)

Connecting community members to services.

A woman and her husband came to the Health Department for their COVID-19 vaccination. During their appointment, Heather, the nurse, observed the client's glasses were broken and she had to use tape to hold them up. The woman told Heather that they did not have vision insurance and she could not afford an exam or new glasses. Heather took a minute to explain the Prevent Blindness Program and helped the couple submit the application. Within one week, they were both eligible to receive an eye exam and frames, as needed.

NURSING - CMH

Children with Medical Handicaps (CMH/BCMH) is an Ohio Department of Health program to benefit Fulton County children with a qualifying chronic medical condition or a suspected chronic medical condition. When faced with these challenges, it can be overwhelming for families. FCHD nurses assist families with the application process, provide health education, case management and referrals to local resources.

IMMUNIZATIONS

BREAST & CERVICAL CANCER PROJECT (BCCP)

BCCP provides breast and cervical cancer screening at no cost to those who meet income guidelines. Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women, and almost all Cervical Cancers are caused by human papillomavirus (HPV).



The HPV vaccine is recommended for both boys and girls at age 11 or 12.

ENVIROMENTAL HEALTH

Household Sewage Treatment System (HSTS)

The goal of the HSTS program is to prevent the spread of disease and contamination of groundwater through potential contact with untreated wastewater, and through this treatment, protect the public from health hazards.

The Water Pollution Control Loan Fund (WPCLF) is a grant used to assist incomequalified homeowners repair or replace failing HSTS or help them tap into a sanitary sewer system, if accessible.

In the last five years, the FCHD has helped to provide eligible homeowners with over \$470,000.00 in assistance through the WPCLF sewage grant*.

WOMEN, INFANTS, CHILDREN (WIC)

WIC improves the quality of participant's diets by providing healthy foods to help meet their needs during pregnancy, postpartum period, infancy, and childhood.



This program improves the growth of nutritionally at-risk infants and children, decreases the incidence of iron deficiency anemia in children, and significantly improves children's diets.

Pregnant women participating in WIC receive prenatal care earlier than their non-WIC peers.

Community Education & Engagement
