The federal government provides both required and recommended vaccines to "Vaccines for Children" (VFC) providers through state health departments. These VFC providers are able to vaccinate for a nominal fee per vaccine. For health departments, such as your Fulton County Health Department, these vaccines are offered to parents for little to no fee based on household gross income and available to those who are not privately insured. By keeping vaccines accessible to everyone, we can keep these terrible diseases away from the world's greatest treasure ... our children.
