#### In 2016 your Fulton County Health Department:

- Conducted **timely investigations** of communicable diseases and provided information and guidance concerning **ZIKA Virus testing**.
- Collaborated with several agencies to conduct a **Community Health Assessment** that describes the health of our residents. You can view the full report of the survey results on our website.
- **Expanded our Breast and Cervical Cancer Project** from 10 to 21 counties due to grant restructuring. This program aims to increase the number of women who complete breast and cervical cancer screening.
- Secured **\$63,427.80 of grant funds** for the repair or replacement of **failed sewage treatment systems** for eight financially eligible families.
- Provided **accurate and reliable health information** including good nutrition, avoiding injury, substance use prevention, traffic safety, immunizations, food safety and much more.
- **Answered questions and connected residents** to services, agencies and resources that enabled them to access needed healthcare.

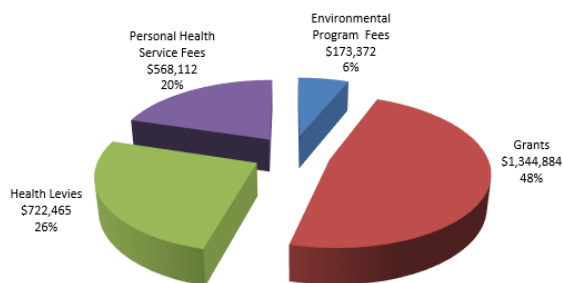

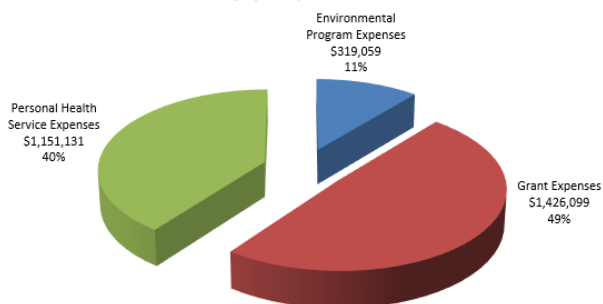
