#### SESSION HIGHLIGHTS—JULY 13, 2022

- Received the Pastor's report. The feeding effort for the AMOS visiting church group went very well. Reverend White will be meeting with the leaders of AMOS to learn more about their programs.
- Received the report of the PNC. The committee reviewed the survey results report. The MIF has been completed. The committee will proof the MIF this week and send it to session for approval next week. Once session approves the MIF, it goes to the COM at presbytery.
- Received the report from Mission Committee. CSC continues to be a major effort for the church. For the first half of the year 583 bags of groceries were distributed. The groceries have been supplemented with garden grown produce by the children's garden, Bonner Scholars' Garden at Carson Newman and from Renovatus. The summer months are more challenging because the help from high school students and CNU students is missing. More volunteers would be very welcome on these two Tuesdays each month. During the feeding of AMOS, 197 meals were provided. Grants were given to Boys and Girls Club, Dumplin Valley (\$2000), Cross/PDRINO (\$2,200) and Girls, Inc. (\$1,686). Isaiah House received \$240 from our portion of the Pentecost Offering and an additional \$114 as the remainder of the Mission Endowment Fund.
- Received the committee report from Stewardship and Finance. Because many programs and activities have been curtailed, expenses are well below budget. Consequently, we ended the second quarter with an adjusted surplus of \$9,426.97. Activities are expected to increase in the second half of the year as will associated expenses. The committee will meet in August to begin the budget process for 2023.
- The Elder Nominating Committee needs to be formed. This year there will be participants from the Adult Zoom Sunday School Class, the Music Program, the Youth and a member at large. Session members will begin asking for participants for the ENC. Matt Gowan and Ted Folsom will co-chair the committee.
- Session approved a congregational meeting for August 28 for the purpose of electing the ENC.

#### MISSION CORNER

Thanks to everyone who volunteered during AMOS Week to help feed the work campers from Georgia who were doing critical home repairs on a home in Morristown July 4 – 7. We prepared and served a total of 197 meals those four days, very capably led by Martha Sanders, who put in MANY, many hours of planning, shopping, and preparing the breakfasts and dinners we provided. Thanks especially to Martha!!

Please pray for Girls, Inc., which was one of our Mission grant recipients this year. In their mission grant application, they asked for our prayers 'for our staff, our board, our families, and our girls as we continue adjusting our approaches through the rapidly changing landscape of life due to current world circumstances. Prayers for guidance, good leadership, strength to manage and think outside the box to find solutions, compassion and kindness toward ourselves and others, and hope for us all.'

And please do keep contributing cleaning and personal care items for the Necessities Pantry, in the bin in the office hallway. Items are delivered to the Pantry about once a month and are VERY much appreciated.
