



Please pray for our mission partners Bruce and Deb Robinson in Haiti. In their grant request this spring they asked for these prayers:

- Due to ongoing gang activity in Haiti, it is more difficult to get in and out of Haiti to work at this time. Please pray for travel to and from Haiti. Under present security and financial constraints Bruce is going to Haiti and Deb is working by distance doing her Haiti (administrative and school child sponsorship)
 - With the gang activity there is less help in Haiti at the moment but the needs of the people and churches are more than they ever were.
 - Due to increases in costs to work in Haiti as well as losing some supporters Bruce and Deb are currently in need of additional monthly support to continue

- We are praising God for 58 children who accepted Christ during a three day

- We are asking God for funding to do a soccer camp and outreach with children this summer in one of the more spiritually needy areas.

- We are praising God that Bruce has been able to get in and out of Haiti this year to continue helping the men keep working on the projects including a well that is the only water for two miles in any direction.
