This November and December, our church leadership is introducing a new opportunity for worship: a Contemplative Service held on the first Sunday of the month at 5:30 p.m. (We'll begin by offering the service these two months, take time to reflect on the response, and use that feedback to plan for 2026.)

In a world that often feels hurried and noisy, this style of worship will create space for prayer, silence, song, and the gentle rhythms of God's presence. Drawing on ancient and modern practices, we will gather to listen for God in quiet wonder.

#### The service will include:


- Lectio Divina—a meditative reading of Scripture that invites us to hear God's Word with both heart and mind
- Taizé and other songs of prayer—simple, repetitive melodies that open us to God's Spirit
- Holy Communion—a shared Table where all are welcome and nourished by grace
- Moments of silence for prayer and meditation—to rest in God's presence and listen for that still, small voice


Participants will also be provided an opportunity to visit three prayer stations, each offering a different way to engage with God in prayer:

- Lighting a candle as a visible prayer
- Receiving anointing oil and the laying on of hands by the pastor and a church elder
- Exploring various guided prayer or meditation practices

This Contemplative Service is not meant to replace our Sunday morning worship but to deepen and expand the ways we worship together. Come as you are—bring your longings, your hopes, your questions—and rest in the holy presence of God.

### Blessing of the Hands September 7th




# SUNDAY SCHOOL KICKOFF

# **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

**AUGUST 17, 2025** 

Three new policies are now required by the Book of Order: Anti-Harassment Policy, Anti-Racism Statement, and Sexual Misconduct Policy. All three policies were approved.

Approved switching from the NRSV to the New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition (NRSVue) for use in future bulletins.

Approved the addition of a Contemplative Worship Service for the first Sundays of the month at 5:30 p.m. We will start with November and December and then assess.

Holy Communion approved for the Choir Mini-Retreat and Contemplative Worship services.

Mission & Creation Care noted that prices for canned goods and other groceries are rapidly increasing, which may have an impact on Church Street Café in the future.

# World Communion Sunday October 5th at 10:45 a.m.



In honor of World Communion Sunday, we are having a Lessons & Carols-style service led by FPC's Sanctuary Choir & Musicians. Together, we'll celebrate the Bread of Heaven through Scripture, song, and Holy Communion, uniting with Christians around the globe at Christ's Table. Afterward, we will enjoy "Breads & Spreads" in the Fellowship Hall.

Soon, you may notice a slight change in the way Scripture is printed in our worship bulletins. We will be shifting from the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) to the New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition (NRSVue). There are two main reasons for this change. First, the NRSVue represents the most up-to-date scholarship available. It builds on the trusted foundation of the NRSV while incorporating decades of new research in biblical studies, archaeology, and language. It also offers clearer and more inclusive wording in many passages, making it a reliable resource for both study and worship. Second, the original NRSV is no longer in print and is becoming increasingly difficult to access online for use in our bulletins. Rest assured, you may notice small changes in wording, but the message of God's love and grace remains the same. And by moving to the NRSVue, we will ensure that our printed and digital materials remain accurate, accessible, and consistent with the latest Presbyterian

resources.
