

Lewis's *The Lion, the* Witch, and the Wardrobe fits naturally into the Advent season. As the reader seeks a storied king and anticipates the glorious coming of Christmas, these twenty-eight devotions alternate between Scripture and passages from the novel to prompt meditation on Advent themes. Each devotion al-

so includes questions for reflection. The book also provides several resources for churches, including four sessions for small group discussion and ideas for creating a "Narnia Night" for families. Readers will ultimately come to know God better while journeying through Narnia.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS—OCTOBER 12

- Received report from the Pastor Nominating Committee. The PNC has selected their choice for the new pastor. The Terms of Call have been sent to the Committee on Ministry along with the candidate's PIF. The COM will conduct a background and credit check on the candidate and have an online interview with the candidate. Once the COM is satisfied, the Session will call for a congregational meeting to allow the congregation to vote on accepting this person as the new pastor.
- Reviewed the calendar for November and made minor additions.
- Presbytery accepted the Session's invitation to host the meeting of Presbytery on November 7, 2023.
- Received the report from the Finance & Stewardship Committee. At the end of the third quarter, the church had an adjusted surplus of \$11,138. Heather predicts we should end the year in the black for 2022. We need to remember this is with a very minimalist budget with trimmed spending by the committees. Stewardship letters have been sent to 45 potential giving units in the congregation. Stewardship Sunday will be October 30, 2022. All committees have been requested to hold their projected budget requests at last year's level where possible. Committees need to submit their budgets by November 6, 2022.
- Received the report from the Mission Committee. For the first nine months, 957 bags of groceries have been provided, about 100 per month. This effort requires 15-20 people to purchase/collect the food, pack bags and distribute those bags, twice a month. This program has benefited 110 different families thus far in 2022.AMOS was formerly known as Appalachian Outreach (AO). We participated in the AMOS backpack effort. During AMOS week, 197 meals were prepared for the visiting church and volunteers. Currently, we are working with AMOS Coats for the Cold. Congregational donations to KARM continue to provide the church with gift cards that are given to CSC families.
