

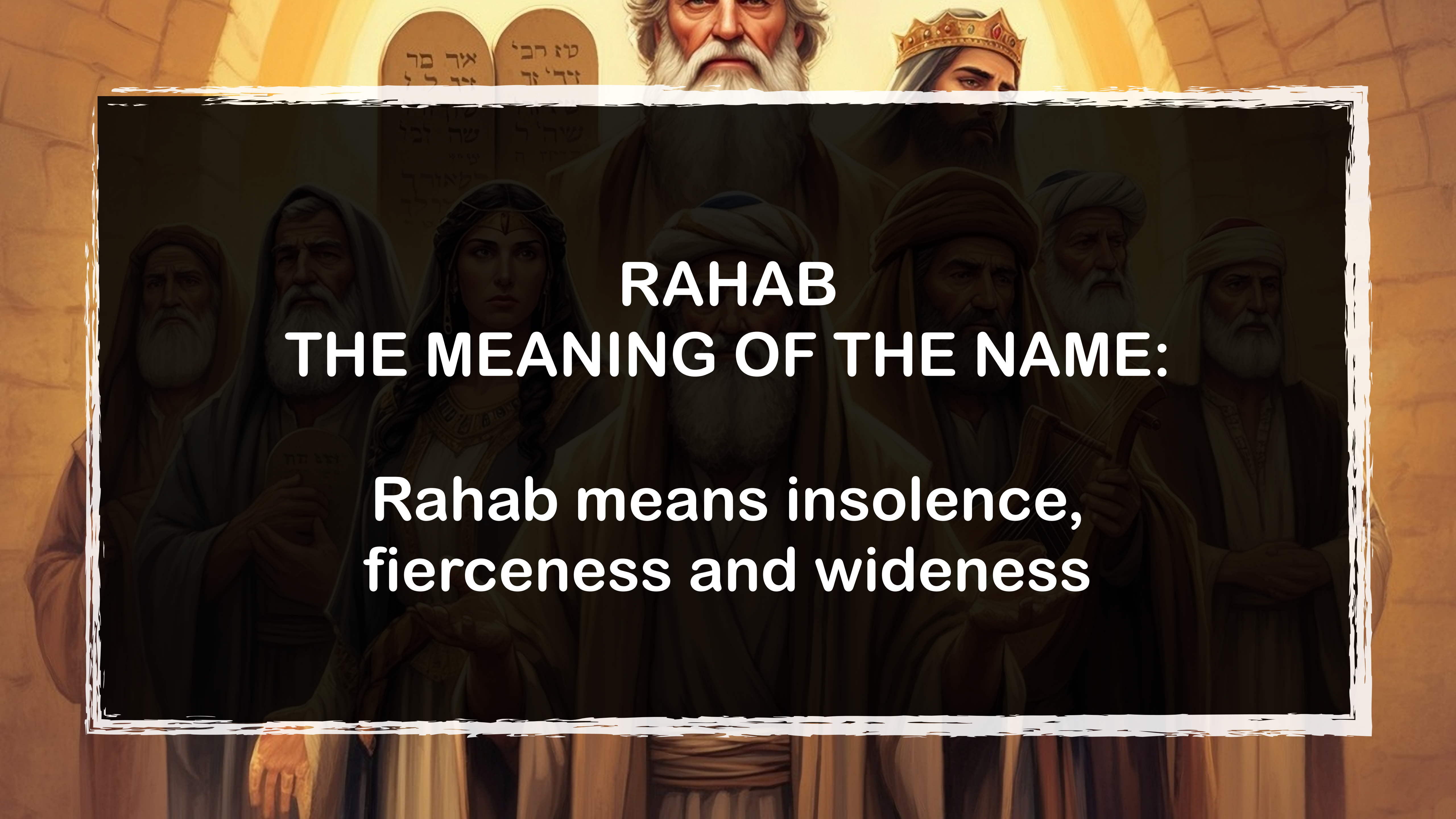

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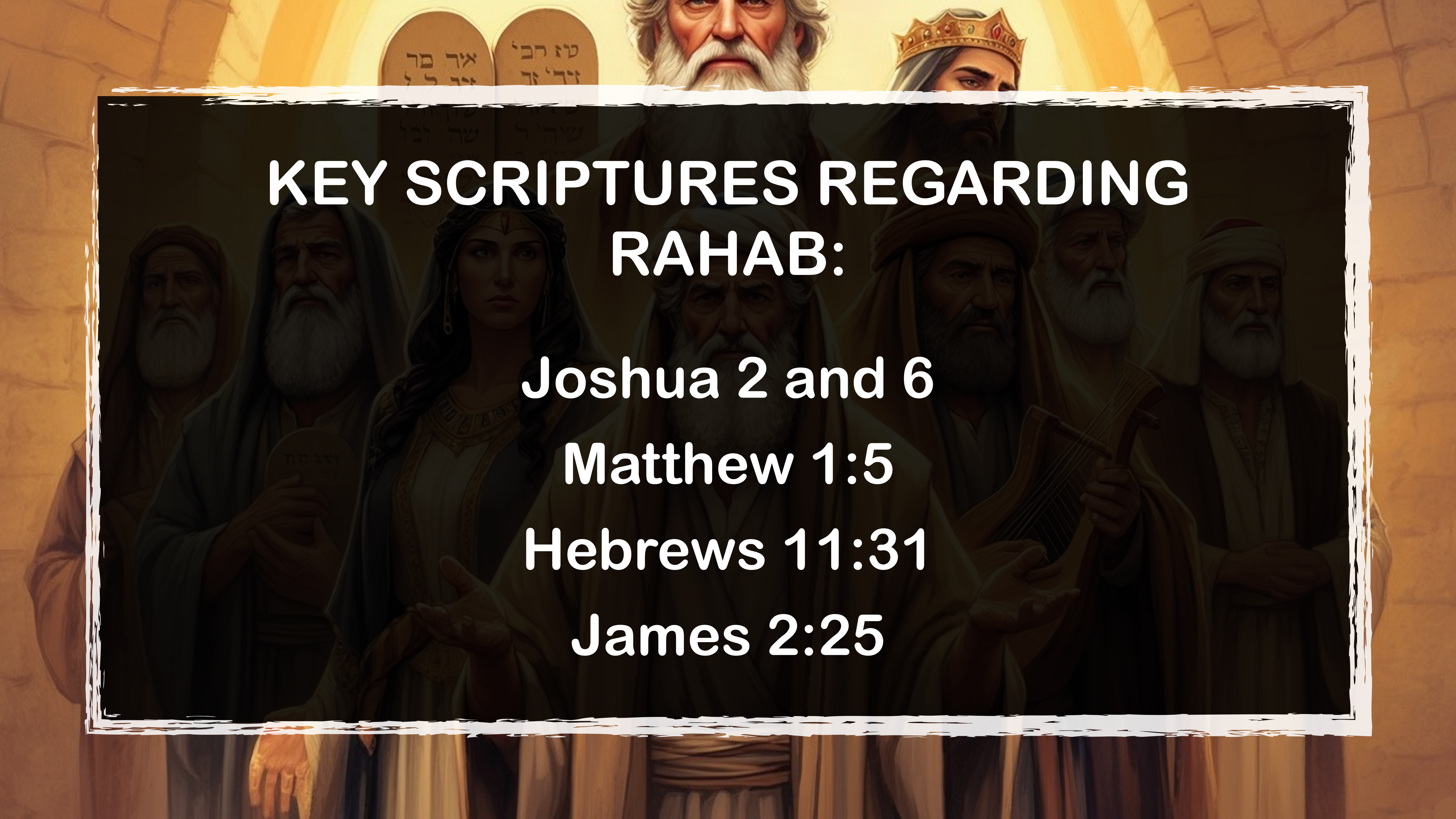

fierceness and wideness



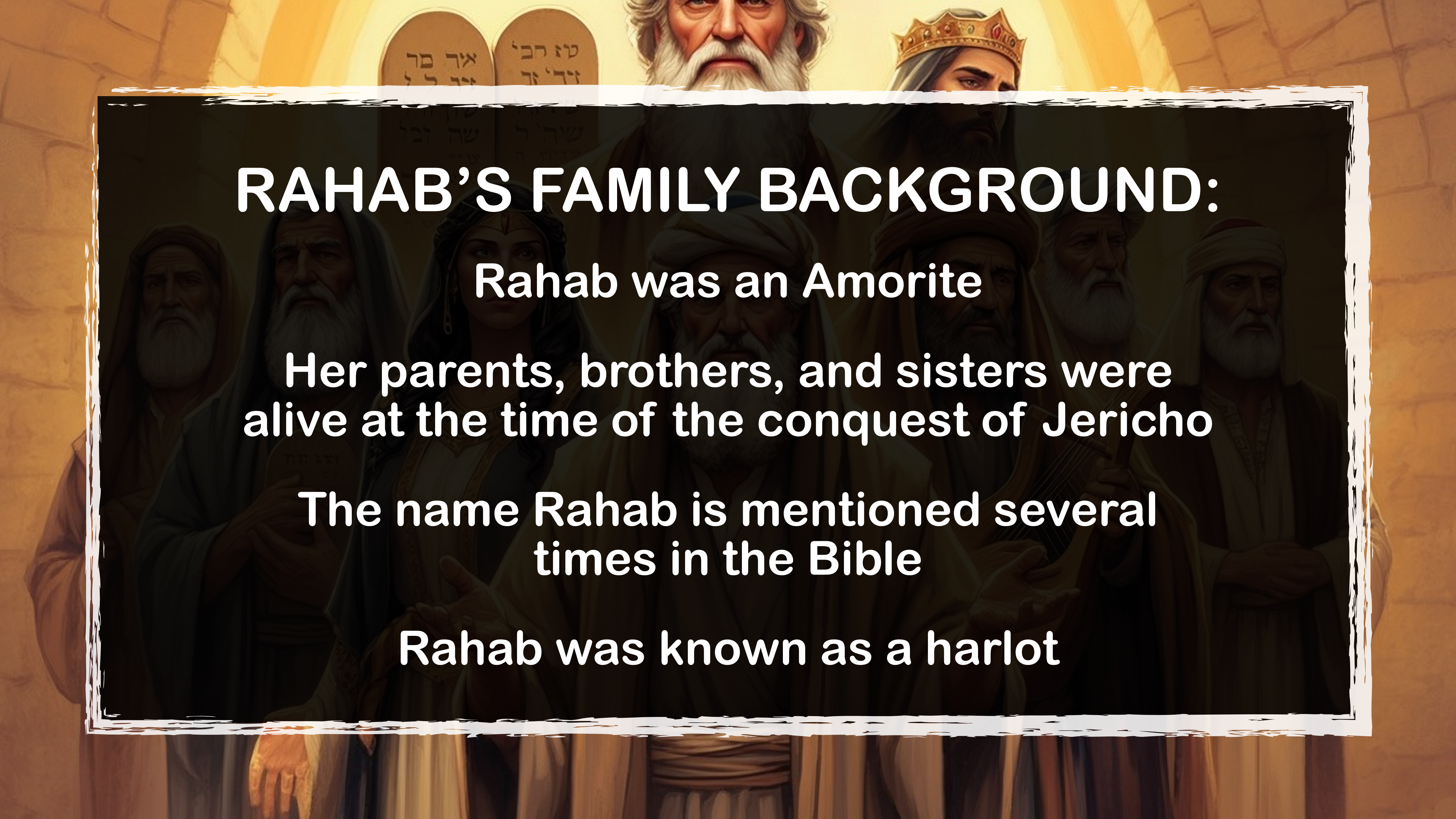
KEY SCRIPTURES REGARDING RAHAB:

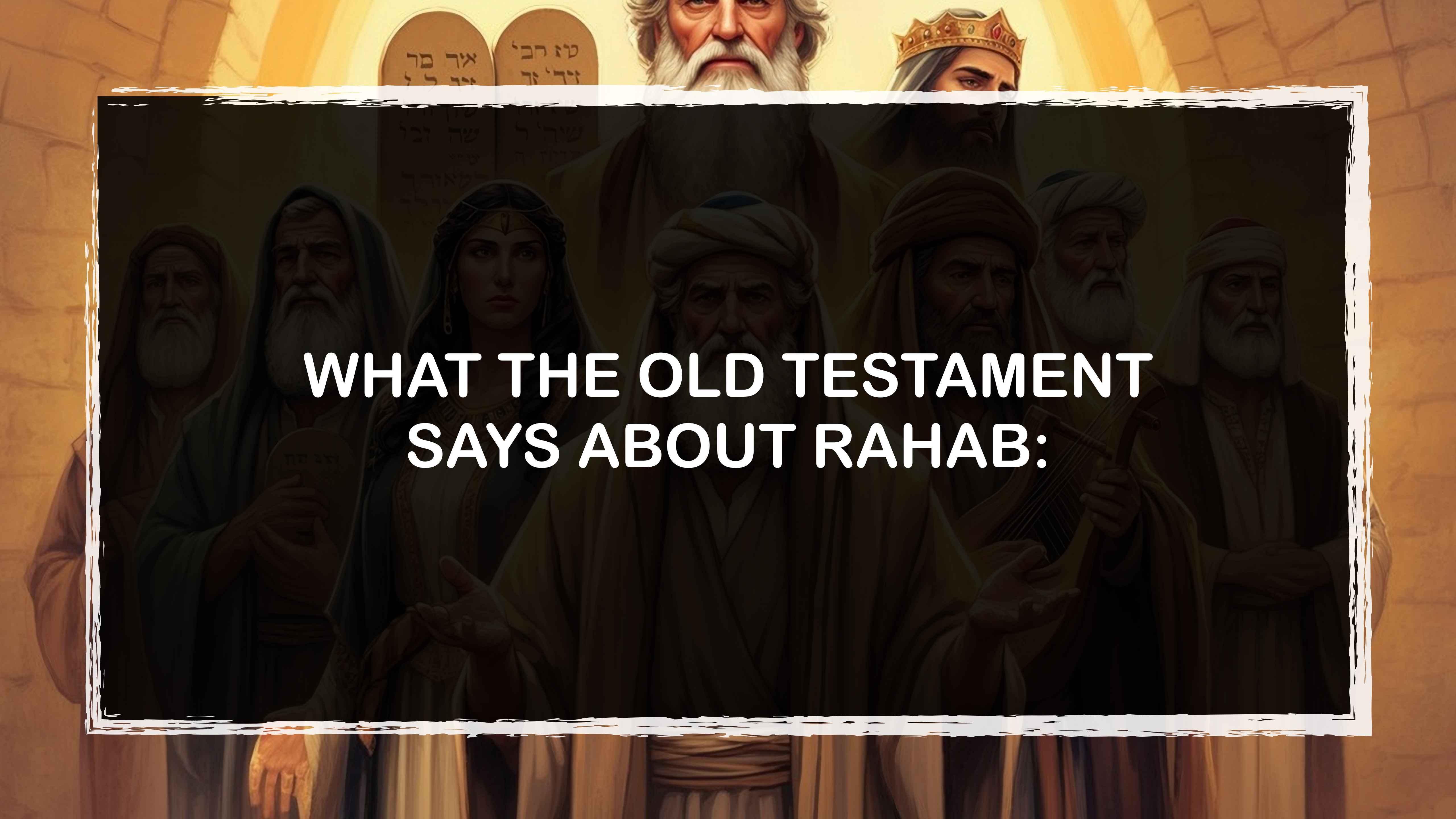
RAHAB'S FAMILY BACKGROUND:

Rahab was an Amorite

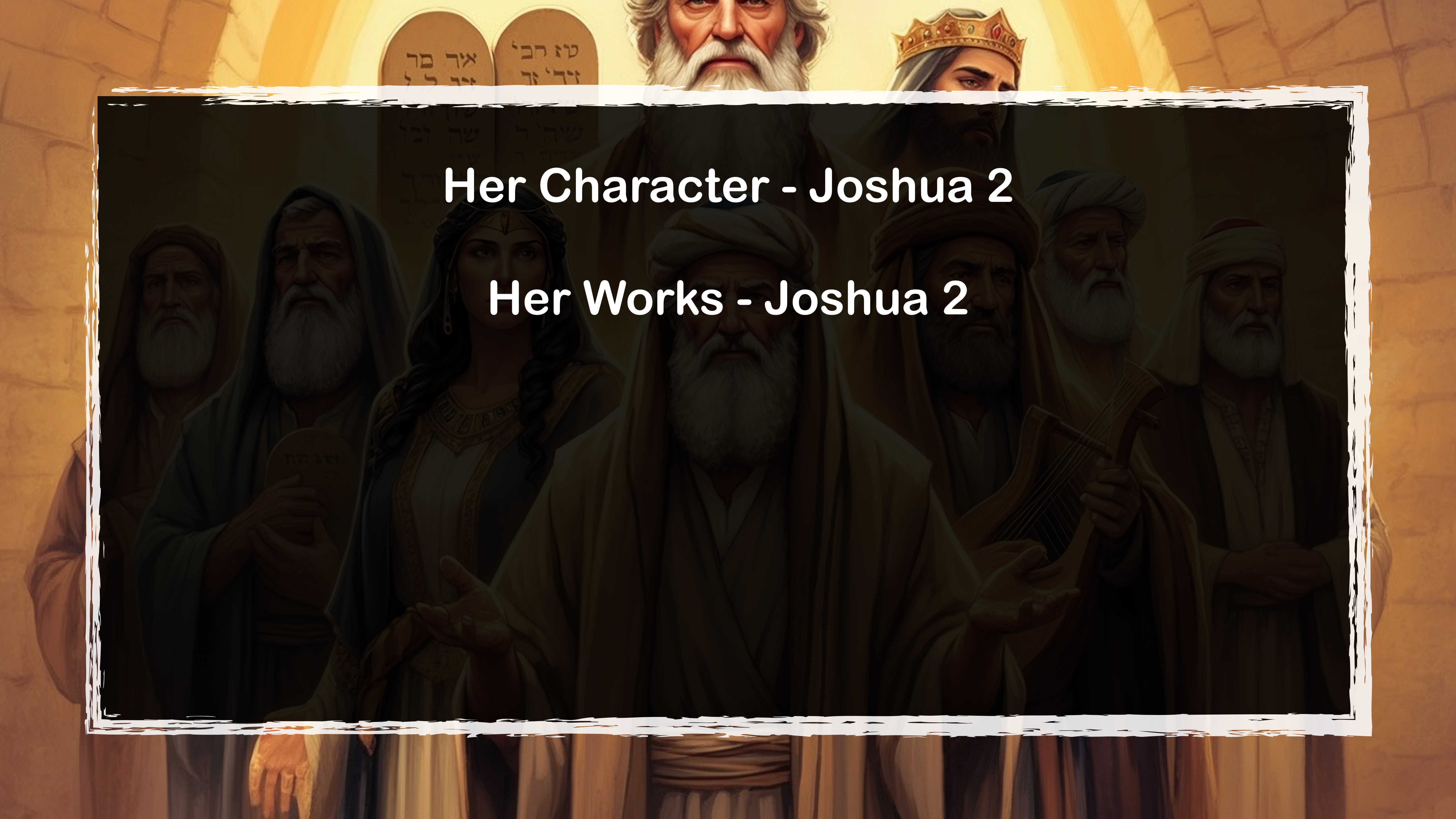
Her parents, brothers, and sisters were

Rahab was known as a harlot

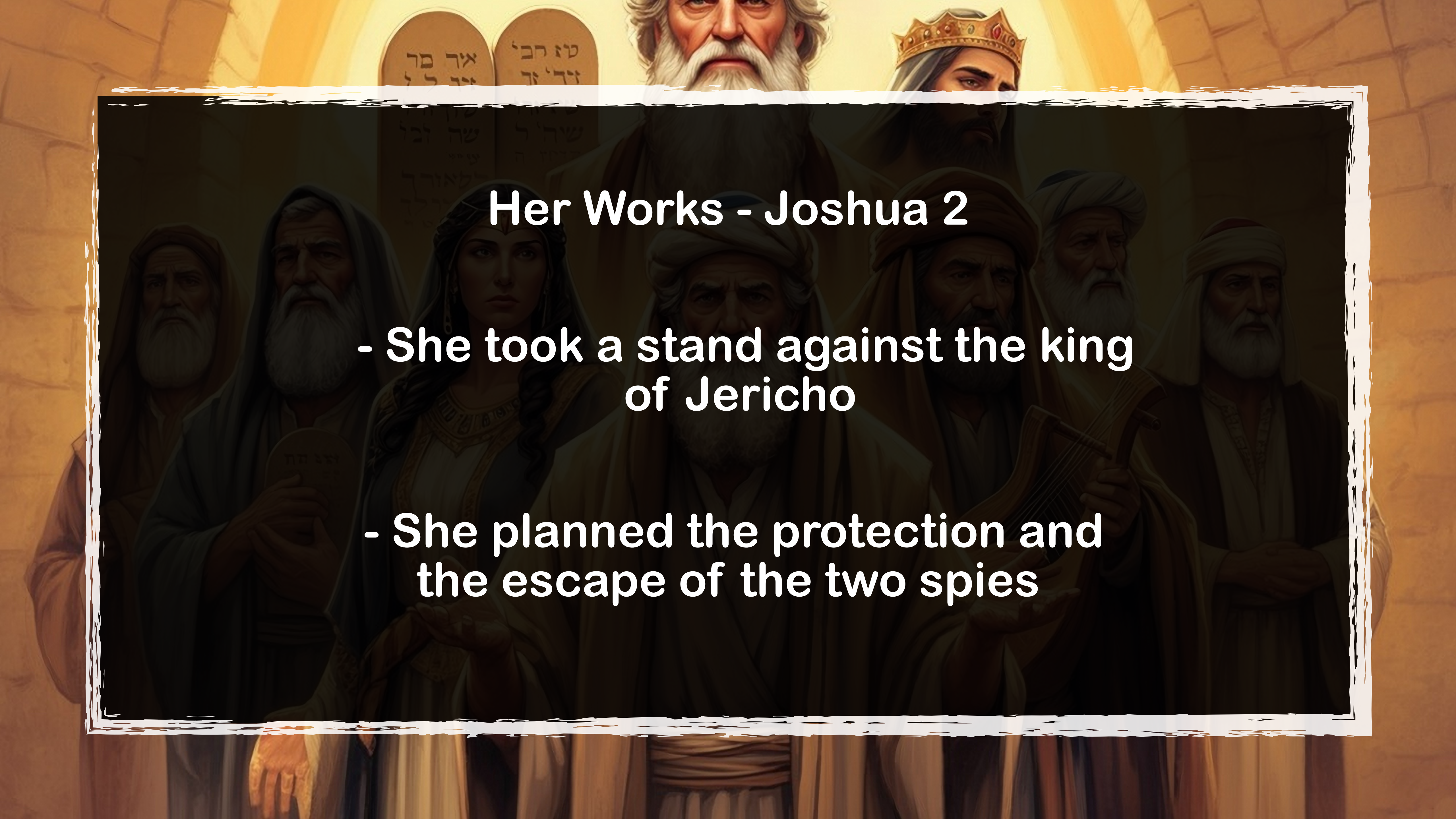

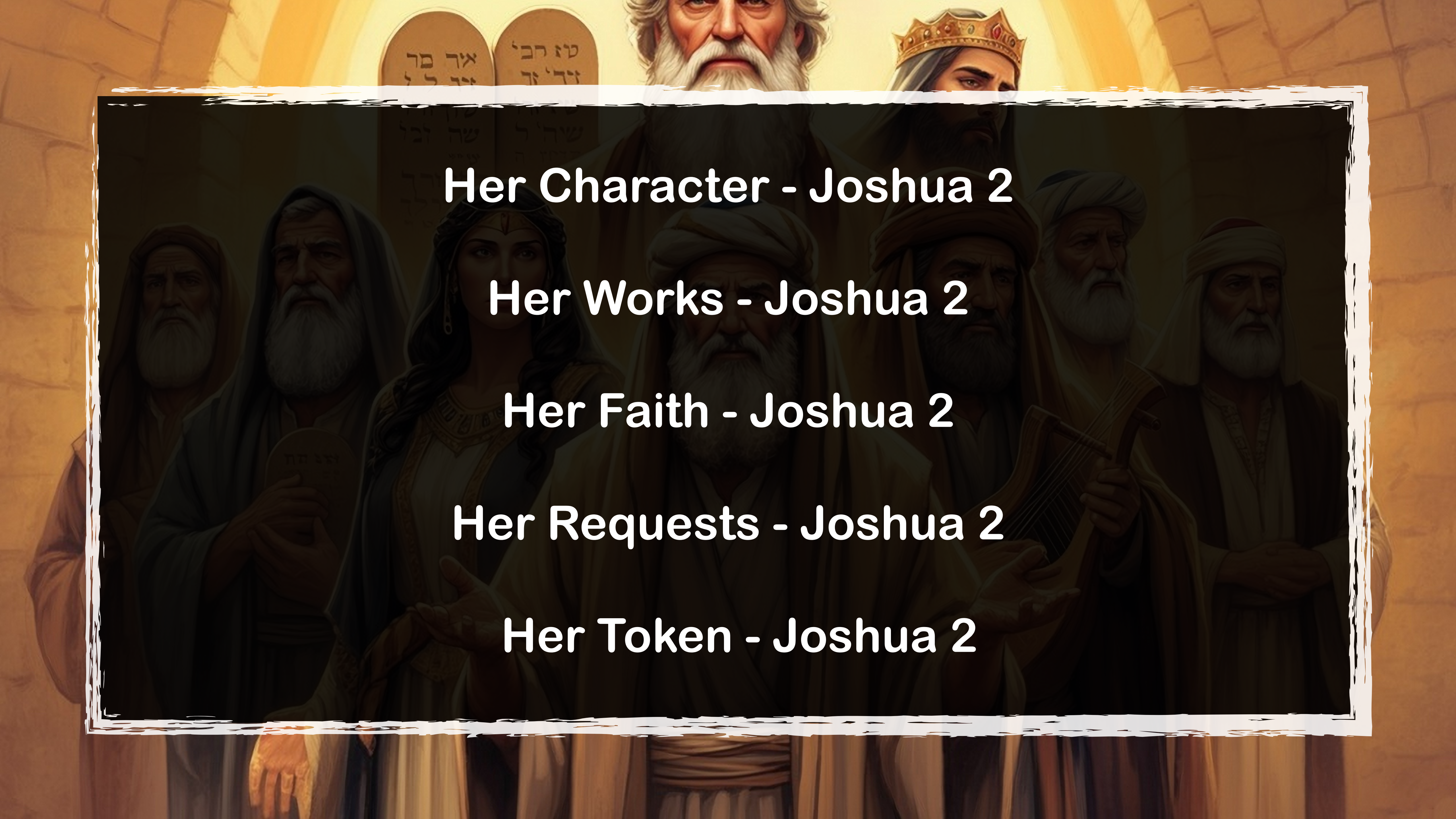

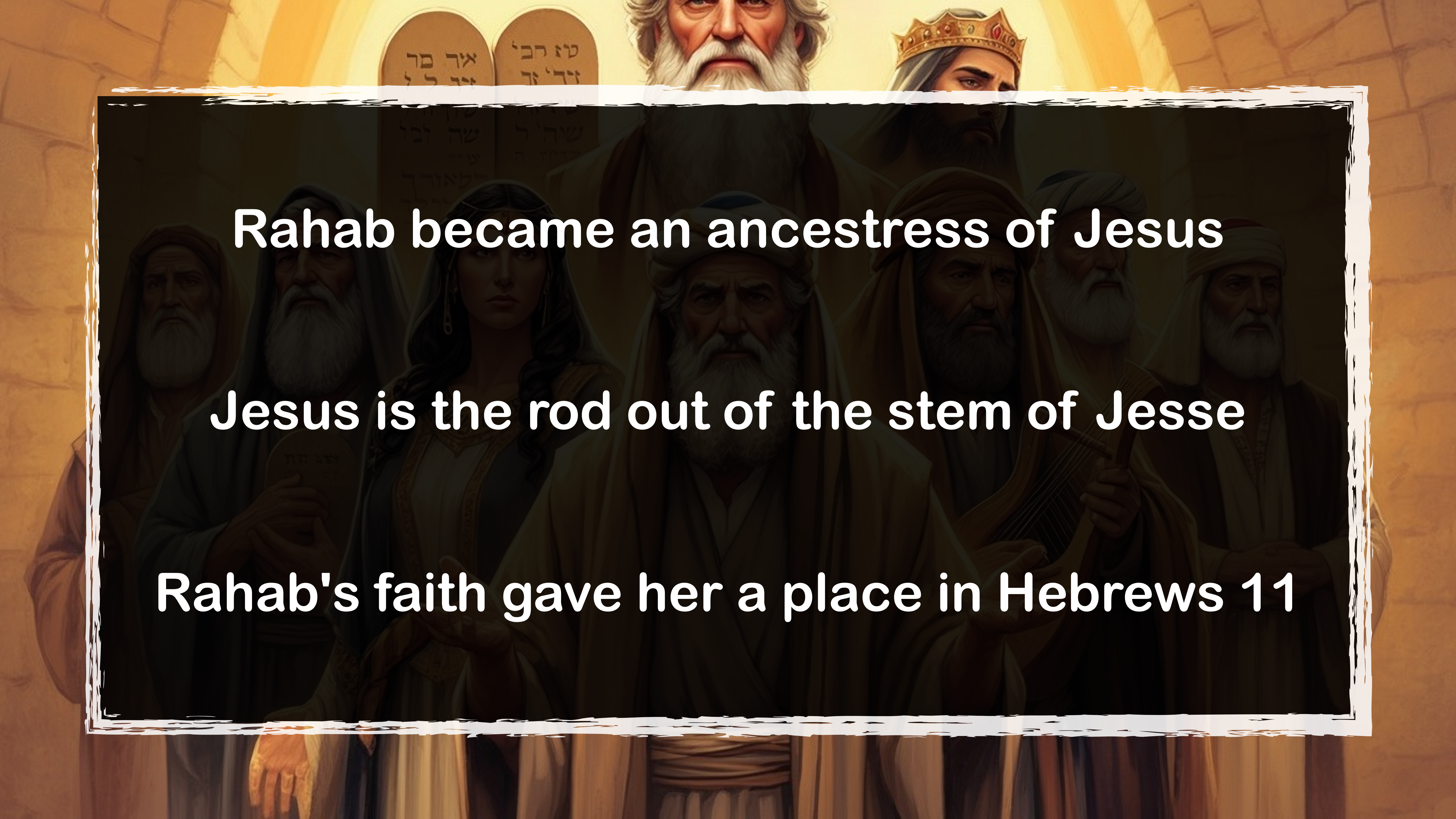

WHAT THE NEW TESTAMENT SAYS ABOUT RAHAB:

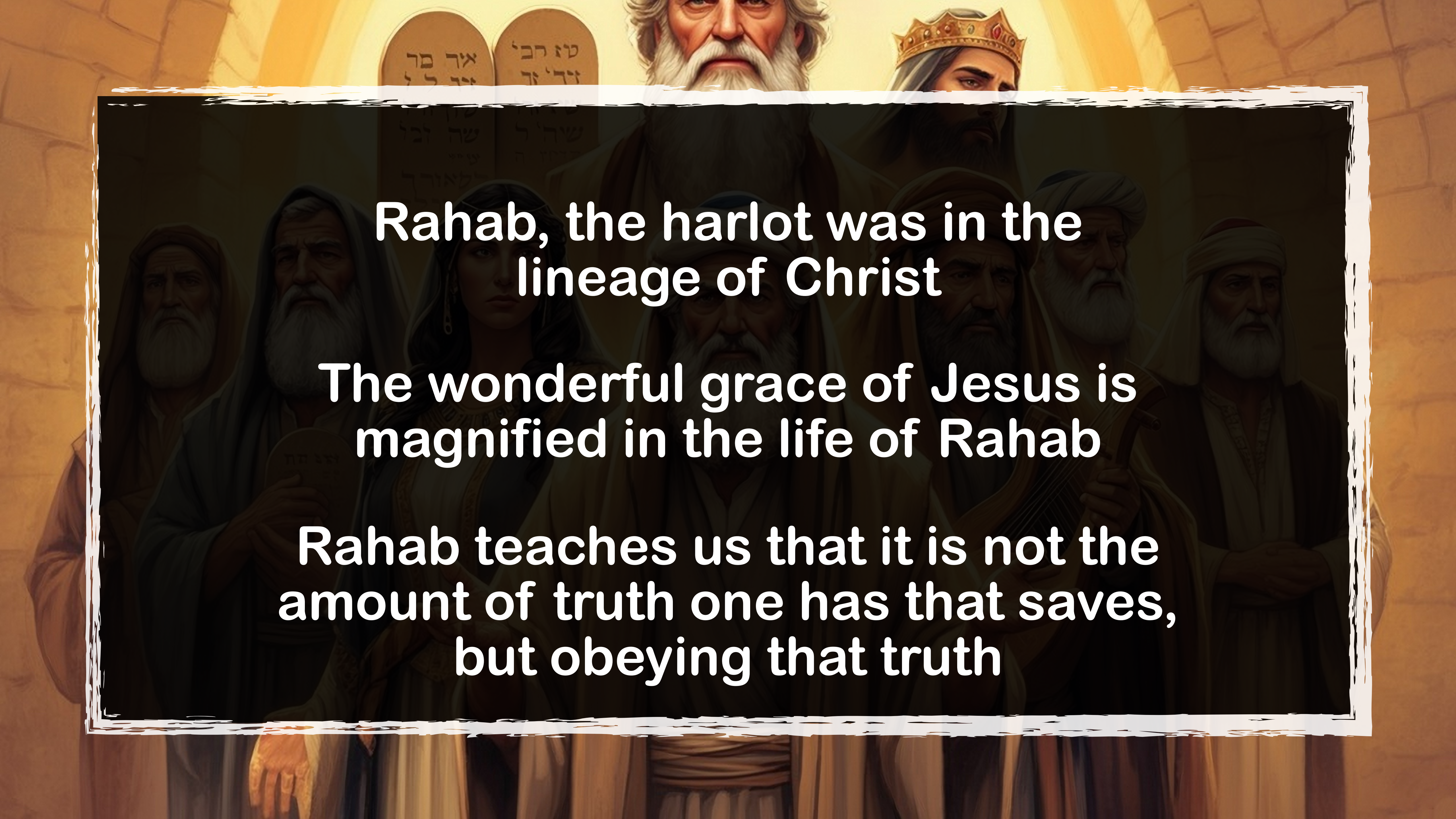


Rahab became an ancestress of Jesus

Rahab's faith gave her a place in Hebrews 11

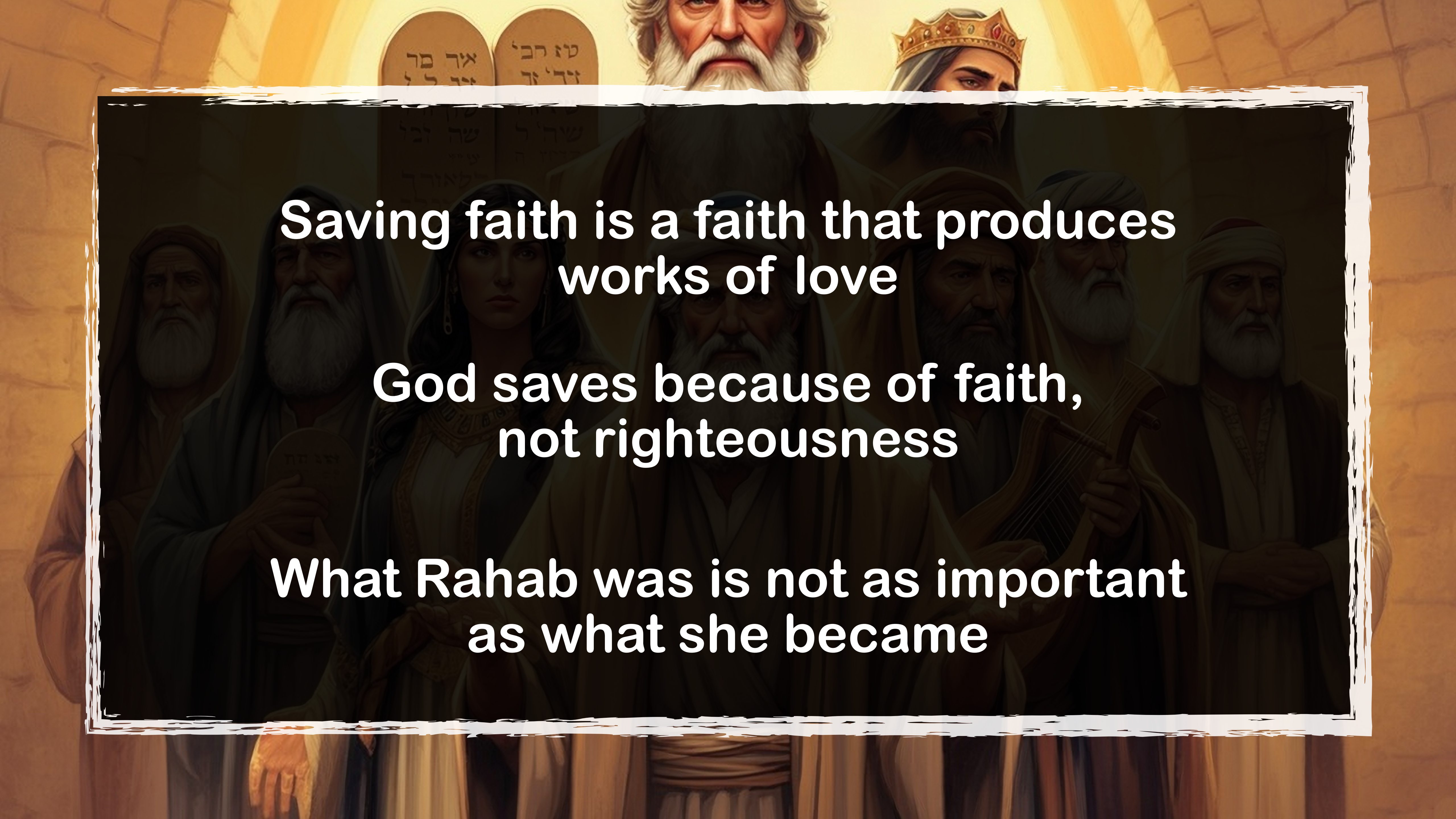
THE LESSONS YOU SHOULD LEARN FROM RAHAB:

magnified in the life of Rahab

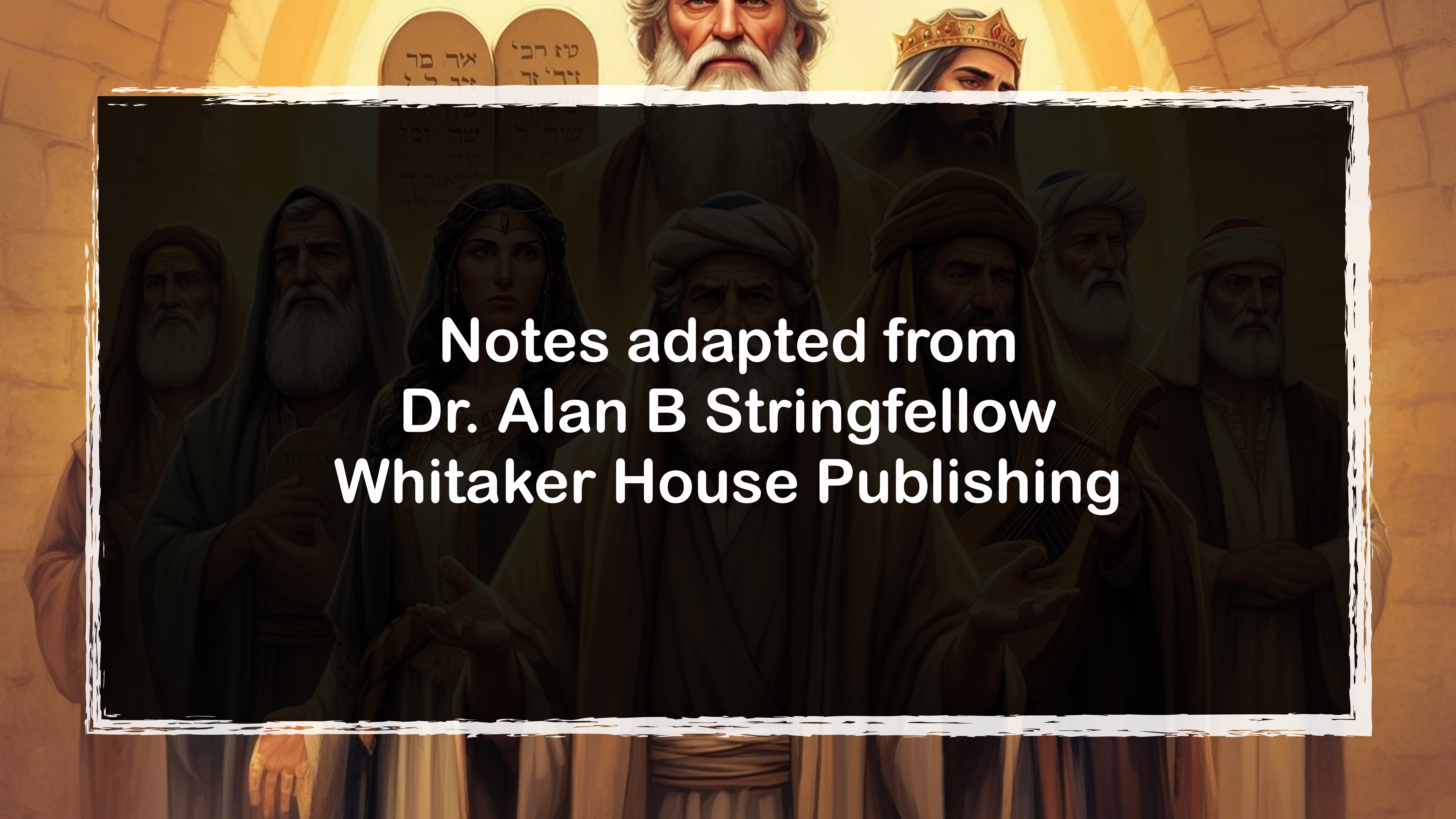
Rahab teaches us that it is not the
