

To reveal the power and holiness of God

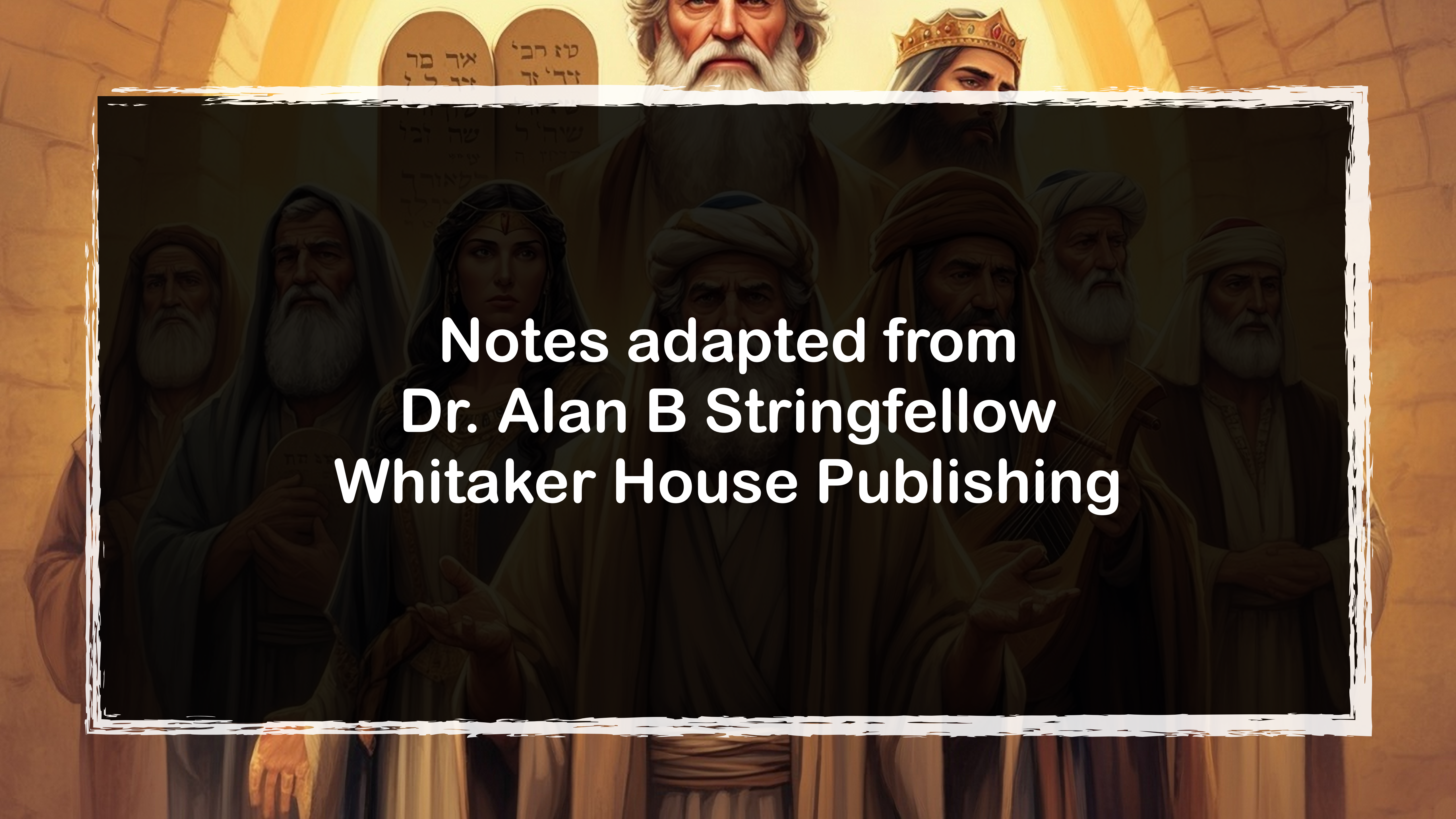
To reveal God to Egypt
